

OBITUARY

R. JAMES CAMERON was born in Pine Mountain, Georgia on February 20, 1919 to the late Guy Lenon and Emma Eugene Cameron.

At the age of five his family moved to Buffalo. and he attended School #75 and Hutchinson Central High School

R. JAMES was a businessman for over thirty years, being a partner with William Stinson in the Stinson/Cameron Liquor Store. He was also an inspector at the Hamburg Racetrack, an Aide for the Division of Youth and a City Marshall working directly under Judge Mattina. It was while working at this position that he became ill. He was Boys' Work Secretary at the Michigan Avenue "Y", past president of The Negro Business and Professional Men's Luncheon Club, member of the NAACP, and an inactive member of Masonic Lodge Ionic 88.

R. JAMES was a lifelong member of Lincoln Memorial United Methodist Church where he was an active member of the Senior Choir, the Men's Club and the Progessive Club.

R. JAMES also served in the Navy during World War II.

He leaves to mourn his devoted wife, Eleanor Elizabeth; one daughter: Elizabeth Ann Amos of Moreno Valley, California; two sons: David Wayne of Rome, Italy and Lenon James of Buffalo; one grandson, Pvt. 2nd Class Andre Amos, U.S. Army; two sisters, Juanita DeBerry and Joyce Mathis; one sister-in-law, Helen Cameron; one brother-in-law, Roy Mathis; one aunt, Alice Cameron and a host of other family and friends.


