


17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

(Indicate if building or structure is in an historic district)

Building is situated on a standard sized corner lot within Olmsted's Parkside subdivision. It is located three blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

Two story brick commercial/residential building. Flat roof with stepped parapet. Recessed central entrance has two glass paneled doors. Two large single light commercial glass windows flank entrance. Varigated scalloped band spans commercial front. Second floor center bay. Pair glass paneled doors. Wrought iron <u>SIGNIFICANCE</u> balcony. End bays have tri-part window. Double-hung, 19. DATE OF INITIAL CONSTRUCTION: 1922 1/1 lights. Hip roof of

red tile spans building.

ARCHITECT: <u>Paired triangular knee brackets support roof.</u> Small semi-circular arched dormers with louvred windows BUILDER: <u>decorate ends of roof.</u> Stepped parapet with rusticated stone capping.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A commercial/residential structure that utilizes Spanish Revival styling details on facade. Originally the Buffalo and Williamsville Macadam Road, Main Street was a pre-existing street at the time Olmsted designated it as the eastern border for "The Parkside." While the streets within the subdivision were designed specifically to avoid commercial development, this portion of Main Street became a combination of commercial and residential structures. It was also a major thoroughfare into the city, allowing easy access to downtown from this suburban neighborhood.
