

Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and east of the Zoo.

styling. Summit Avenue is a truncated north-south street, locate	ed
between Woodward and Crescent Avenues and extending from West	
Oakwood Place to the northern section of Crescent Avenue. A similar street, ending south of Jewett Avenue, appears in Olmstee	l's
early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." Summit Avenue was deeded to)
the city in 1889, except for the small section between Amherst ar	nd
Crescent which was deeded in 1892. This street follows Olmsted's	3
rule that it "not lead with special directness toward the town."
