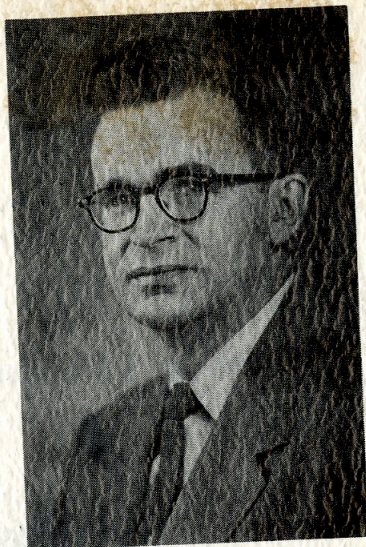

To Give Dedication Prayer

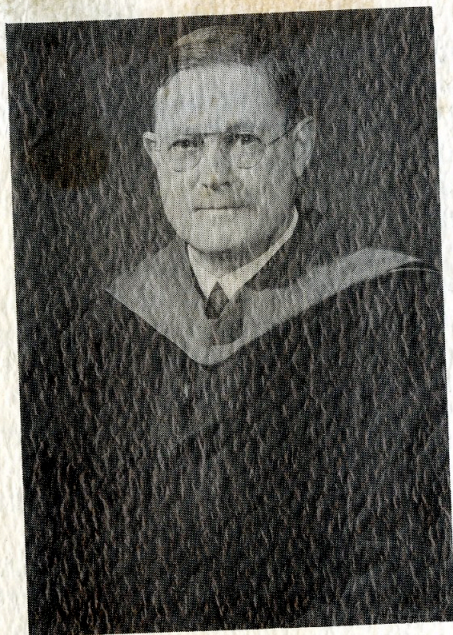
### Former Pastor To Return Here For Anniversary

The Rev. Robert B. Day, Boston, Mass., former minister of the First Unitarian Church here, will return to take part in the service of rededication of the church and the 35th anniversary celebration of the congregation.

The Rev. Mr. Day served as Unitarian minister here from 1926 until 1945. He was well known as the organizer and moderator of the Unitarian Forums which brought many prominent national speakers to this city during those years. These forums were the forerunner of the Mental Health Forums continued in more recent years at the church with the cooperation of Temple Beth El.

In 1939 the Rev. Mr. Day was the Democratic candidate for mayor and was defeated by Ernest W. Mirrington Jr., who subsequently appointed the minister to the Board of Social Welfare.

He will give the prayer of dedication at the church service Sunday morning when the renovated building, new education rooms, and Bruce Swift Pulpit are dedicated, and will be honored at the 35th anniversary dinner on Monday evening, at which he will speak.
