So we see that during all their history Israel has been and still is tired and weary. And our text tells us that they did not enter into the REST that was promised them in ancient days because of their unbelief. And no better reason can be given for their tired weary restless state today.

The history related in the words of text is of interest and value to us not alone because it tells us about what has happened and is happening to Israel because of unbelief, but because it is applicable to us today who are journeying under great burdens through a wase howling wilderness.

Like Israel, as we journey out of the bondage of sin into the glorious liberty of the children of God, we have to go around for the enemy will not let us go always as we would like to go.

As we journey we meet many conditions that take away our liberty and enslave us. We have many burdens that are not easy to bear put upon us.

May we profit by the mistakes of ancient and modern Israel. Let us never as the people of God get the idea that we can find any real lasting REST other than that God has provided for us. All other REST ultimately becomes a burden and makes us tired.

A SERVED AND A SERVING CHURCH

Legally the church is a private institution, practically it is a public, community institution.

In very many ways the state does serve the church. The state provides high ways and streets, water and light, police and fire protection.

The state has the right to, and should expect the church to render service to the state in the way of making good citizens, keeping up a morale that will make it easier for the citizens to meet difficulties, to pass through trying experiences.

Every church member must play a double role. For he is not only a citizen in the kingdom of God, but he is a citizen of the state in which he lives. He serves the state that the state may serve the church and he serves the church that the church may serve the state.

Let us remember, the church represents God, and that we can not serve the church without serving God. A part of our text tells us that it is a dangerous thing not to serve God. We are told again to serve the Lord with gladness.

The Master has told us to let him that is greatest among us to be our servant. Most people are more anxious to be regarded great than they are to be servants.

Remember, the Master has said to us, Freely ye have received, freely give. These words are applicable alike to those who have received little as much as they are to those who have received much.

The church furnishes the very best means for man to render his best service to his God and to his fellowman.

The church is expected by man and by God to serve the world in every capacity whereever man

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May we endeavor each day to carry out the injunction of the Master, Render to Caesar the things that be Caesar's and to God the things that be God's.

Let us remember that he also says, Give ye them to eat.

According to this definition we may sell any phase of our goodness. It is our duty to keep our virtues on the market so that those who are poor and in need may get the benefit of them.

Let us remember that we must not only be good, but that we must be good for some thing.

It is well known that we are all effected by what we eat, then our children and all with whom we are associated are effected by what we eat. And the more intimate our association the greater is the effect of our eating. Hence what parents eat before their children are born has much to do in shaping their physical and moral life, and it may be has much to do with the spiritual life of the children.

Then our adult associates are mentally effected by what we eat and drink.

The term eat symbolizes many acts in which we may indulge to gratify certain desires, to appease certain appetites. And what is true of individuals is true of organizations. Every organization that is active is influncing people to live a good life or a bad life.

We help to make the kind of allies we have and with whom we labor by the example we set before them. If we allow ourselves to irregular and indiferent in the performance of our duties do not be surprised if our associates are the same.

The christian life is to be an unselfish sacrificing life. Like our Lord we are not primarily to seek to please ourselves. But we are to try to bring about conditions out of which all who are concerned will get pleasure.

May each of us be careful about the kind of life we live not alone for our own sakes but for the sake of others also.

As the President of this country is the General in Chief of the army and navy, so is Christ Jesus our Lord the GENERAL IN CHIEF of all God's army. And every one who becomes a citizen in the Kingdom of God automatically becomes a soldier in God's army and is subject to orders from the General in Chief.

It is not ours to reason and philosophize about the command. But it is ours to go and fight and suffer and like our GENERAL IN CHIEF, if need be, die. Our war cry should be, must be Am I a soldier of the cross? and Chward christian soldiers.

With all our boasted progress and advancement in civilization; in SCIENCE, in COMMERCE, in
EDUCATION, CULTURE and REFINEMENT; in so many respects the world today is about the same kind of
place as the world into which Jesus sent his
first disciples. Men HATE, LIE, STEAL and ROB,
and MURDER just as they did during the first century of the christian church. Men dispise and reject Jesus just as they did then.

Now if we are sent as Jesus was sent, and conditions are about as they were when he came into this old world, we naturally wish to know to whom we are sent and what we are to do; and the desired information comes to us from the absolute source of authority in the words of our text. We are sent to every creature in all the world. And we are sent to preach according to the pattern shown us in the 61st chapter of Isaiah and the first four verses.

Cur text tells us that we are sent as Jesus was sent. Now let us see how he was sent; he was sent to those who dispised and rejected him; he was sent to his own who would not receive him. He was sent to those who had stoned the prophets and those who had been sent to them. He was sent with no place to lay his head. He was sent to suffer and pray alone in the garden until great drops of sweat like blood should run down.

But he was sent also with the assurance that if he were lifted up he would draw all men unto him. He was assured that he should see the travail of his soul and be satisfied. He was assured that every knee should bow to him and every tongue should confess to him. He was assured that the 61st chapter of Isaiah would be fulfilled.

He was assured that when he had finished the work that his Father had given him to do that he

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He was assured that when he had finished the work that his Father had given him to do that he would escape the misery, pain and limitations of the body and come back to his Father triumphant, victorious.

As we go forth let us rejoice in the privilege of having fellowship with the Lord Jesus in all the experiences that were his while here in the flesh.

Jan. 29 '39 THE KINGDOM OF GOD AND THE F.B.Ch. CHURCH OF CHRIST

Technically speaking, KINGDOM and CHURCH are both governmental terms. They are borrowed from the civic life of the people who are under consideration.

Indeed all spiritual truth comes to us through the use of borrowed terms. Hence the FARMER, the FISHERMAN, the SOLDIER, the RUNNER, the DAIRYMAN, BUILDER and SHEPHERD are all used to express certain phases of our spiritual life.

When discussing man in his relation to God Jesus always couched his message in language and words that were understood by those to whom he was speaking. He used the words that always conveyed the idea that he wished the people to get.

So when he wished the people to know the nature of the relation to God that those who recognized him as the supreme ruler of all sustained as citizens he talked about the KINGDOM of God.

And when he wished these same people to know what their functions are, what they are expected to act pected to do, and how they are expected to act he talks about the ECCLESIA, the church. The terms Jesus used were always governed by the age and the people to whom he spoke. When he used the term KINGDOM he was living in an age when the peoples all about him were citizens in KINGDOM, and were being ruled by kings.

But not all these citizens were qualified to be a part of the three distinct branches of the government, the LEGISLATIVE, JUDICIAL and the EXECUTIVE branches. But those of the KINGDOM who were qualified were called the ECCLESIA, the church.

So it seems that with this bit of explanation it will not be difficult for us to see what use God makes of these two terms, the KING-DOM of God and the CHURCH of Christ.

What the mass of the people of this country are to the United States by birth or by naturalization the mass of the people who have been born again are to the KINGDON of God.

The church is composed of a more select body and has more specific obligations resting upon her. The church is to establish religious institutions, educational centers, social centers, foster missionary enterprizes, and erect buildings and maintain them. through which the KINGDOM of God cah function.

The KINGDOM is where under the inspiration and guidance of the Holy Spirit we qualify for membership in the church and the christian army where we put on the uniform of the saints, and get our equipment and enter into the conflict against sin and wickedness.

Let us start today and warm up our hearts and get in a new and larger supply of gladness that we may serve the Lord and our fellowman more acceptably.

There are great multitudes in our city who have spiritual palsy. Their friends, or rather, their allies, who take them to all kinds of places; to dances, to shows, drinking and gambling places. And they forget their palsy for a while, just to have it come back to them in a more agravated form than ever. Their friends their real friends bring them to the house of prayer.

Jesus always rewards the faith of those who bring the physically, mentally, morally or spiritually weak to him.

May we always so live that we shall have the strength and power to say to men over whom hangs the cloud of gloom, disappointment and sadness, Be of good cheer; thy sins be forgiven thee.

So that the live stock dealer and the farmer may be on friendly terms, so that the farmer shall not envy the live stock dealer and rise up and muder him.

There can be no permanently successful business that is not built and run upon the principles of brotherly love. The GOLDEN RULE should be practiced alike in the chamber of commerce and the church.

The church must be imbued with and teach the fact, that God has made of one blood all nations, and all we are brethren.

We have reasons to believe that God deals with us not as BLACK men, but as men made in his image.

To practice these principles that I have been advocating does not mean that any one racial group is justified in being indifferent to the obligations to engage in business, and to use every legitimate means to bring about success. But it means just the opposite.

Let us observe the word of God and not be slowthful in BUSINESS.

What Washington, the District of Columbia is to the American people, Zion, Jerusalem was to ancient Israel.

For men, wise men, men of vision have been sent there from every section of this country to keep their fingers on the pulse of the nation. Congress, with its two branches is there, the different departments of the government are there, the Supreme Cout is there, and the President, with all his Cabinet is there. But when his path leads through dark gloomy valleys, and over the way that is barren and desert, beside waters that are rough and tempestuous we hesitate to start and often turn back before we reach our destination. The disciples were delighted to go with Jesus to banquet halls to partake of feasts. But it was not so pleasant to make long journeys with Jesus hungry and weary, making a meal on the corn that they plucked on their way. The disciples were inspired when they went with Jesus into the synagague to worship.

The disciples were delighted to hear Jesus talk about the kingdom in which they hoped to be officers. But they did not like to have talk about the destruction that was coming upon Jerusalem. They did not like to have him talk about the death that he was to suffer. They could not follow him into the judgement hall They could not see him go to Golgetha and hold to their faith. Their creed meant nothing to them under such trying circumstances. So their hearts were troubled. And the message of our text came to comfort and inspire them. And it comes to comfort and inspire all who have lost hope, and are in dispair. And the message tells us that not only has Jesus has risen and is alive for evermore, but that all who have, in faith in faith gone into the sepulcher shall come forth and live for evermore.

LET LOVE BE WITHOUT DISSIM-ULATION. ABHOR THAT WHICH IS EVIL; CLEVE TO THAT WHICH IS GOOD.

It seems almost strange that this exhortation should have been directed to the people to whom it was directed: for they were members of the early church at Rome. Just a little over an half century had passed since Jesus had walked upon earth with his disciples. The church had not gotten beyond the shadow of his personality. They should have been might good people. But evidently they were not.

Favorable conditions, and circumstances do not argue that the persons who are surrounded by them are always perfect or beyond reproach. So we must not rely too implicitly upon membership in an organization, even though that organization be the church, for our goodness, for the assurance and certainty that we shall always do right, that our good qualities will not be punctured by defects and flaws.

Our text implies that we may be in the best organization and still have love effected by dissimulation, and still at times abhor that which is good and cleve to that which is evil. Nevertheless, it is our duty, and we should recognize the value of all good organizations, and especially the church and make use of them.

In order to carry out the injunction of our text we must receive TRAINING from those who are qualified to teach us the meaning of true love. We must be taught the NATURE of Love. We must know how it acts, and what it will do.

Then we must judge by a perfect standard as to what is good and what is evil, so we may know what to abhor and that to which we shall cleve. Let us do this under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

It is well for us to run over the list of things and people frequently that use their influence and power to make us afraid.

ADVERSE CRITICISM, FAILURE, COMPETITION,

THOSE WHO ARE MORE POPULAR THAN OURSELVES.

THOSE WHO HAVE MORE THAN WE HAVE.

THOSE WHO KNOW MORE THAN WE DO.

Le us remember that we have nothing to make us afraid if we journey with Jesus.

We rode and rode, and walked and walked and finally reached the campus and saw those great buildings, saw some members of the faculty.
But Mr. Hutichins, the President whom we wished
to see above all others we did not see, for he
was just leaving to fill a lecture engagement.

These men of our text who went up to Jerusalem with the great crowds were not so much concerned about the formal worship that was going on in the temple. Nor were they so interested in the many other attractions that were in Jerusalem. They wished to see Jesus. The record does not tell us what their special reasons were for wishing to see Jesus. But we have reasons to believe that they had the same longings that others have had who wished to see Jesus.

There are those like Nicodemus who wish to see Jesus because they have THEOLOGICAL problems that thye can not solve.

The Syrophoenician woman typefies a great host of women who have child troubles that puzzle them and they wish to see Jesus that he may help them.

The Centurion wished to see Jesus because as a capitalist he had the right attitude towards labor, and he believed that Jesus could help him do his duty.

Jairus gives us a stricking sample of fathers, and mothers too, who have parental sorrow, grief and heart aches, and they wish to see Jesus that he may relieve them.

Mary and Martha, who wished to see Jesus typefy a great host of sisters whose brothers, for all practical purposes, are dead, and only

Jesus can raise them from the dead.

ZACHAEUS who wished to see Jesus typefies many business men who are conscious of their dishonesty and injustice and wish to see Jesus

that they may confess to him.

The Disciples who did not have money to pay their taxes typefy so many who are in financial straits and wish to see Jesus that he may tell them where to get the needed money.

May we all realize, that whatever our problems may be that we can not do better than to see Jesus and let him tell us what to do.

Women are under obligation to be courageous and to go with men to battle against the wrongs in the world.

Have thine own way, Lord. Have thine own way, Thou art the Potter I am the clay... Mould me and make me after thy will... While I am waiting, yielded and still.

And we need to realize, that it takes time to be holy.

When we wait on the Lord we are not idle and indifferent, but we are very much on the alert, waiting, watching, listening.

Waiting on the Lord carries with itthe idea of OBSERVATION. When we are truly waiting on the Lord we do not go through the world thoughtlessly, carelessly.

MICHIGAN AVE. BAPTIST CHURCH CENTENARY CELEBRATION SERMON BY PASTOR J. Edward NASH SUNDAY JUNE 25TH 100 TEXT Ps. 78:1-4

The most marvelous period in the history of America, and of the world is included in the one hundred years that mark the life of our church. More outstanding things have happened, more outstanding changes have taken place in any similar period in the history of the world. These changes have been marked in both church and state. No less than the state, the church, during this century, has been urged to make a new program; to adopt a new conception of God. In a word the church has been asked to revamp her doctrines; to make her expression of religion more in keeping with the thought of the age.

During the century many voices have been sounding out from everywhere telling the church what to do and what course to pursue; from legislative halls; from labor councils; from financial and commercial circles; social agencies have spoken their message to the church. And like the chief executive of a great nation, the church has listened to all these voices and has given to them sincere and prayerful consideration.

But above all during all this time she has been listening to a greater voice; she has been considering a greater law than that of man.

During the century this church has felt a special need to listen to the voice of God and has cried out with the Psalmist, I will hear what God the Lord will speak. When this church came into existence one hundred years ago, this nation was saying that the people composing it were an inferior people. And very soon after was saying, through the supreme court, that this people had no rights in America that a white man needed to respect. At that time the great mass of the people upon whom she had to depend for increased membership were in bondage.

It is not strange that this church very soon after she was organized sought to help our people out of bondage. She busied herself in getting the white people, above the Mason and Dixon's line, in the church and out of the church, to pass resolutions condemning the slave system, and to work and pray for the deliverance of our people.

This church possessed the spirit of Wendell Philips, Harriet Beecher Stowe, Sojourner Truth, William Lloyd Garrison, Harriet Tubman and Fredrick Douglas, and established here in our present place of worship an Underground Rail Road Station, where our brethren escaping from slavery, by running away, might receive all aid possible, and helped over into Canada.

While this church has been ever mindful of the material needs of our people, she has never lost sight of the great function of the church, and accordingly she has sought earnestly to supply the spiritual needs of the people. She has tried through the years to keep on the field a pastor. In the first half of the century these were numerous, so numerous that we can mention only a few. Rev. William Monroe was the first pastor, and was noted in that he did the work pastor teacher and janitor; Rev. Mr. Sharpe solicted

funds for the erection of our present place of worship; Rev. Mr. Miller was instrumental bringing the membership up to niety-thrme, which was a good number for that day; Rev. J. Sella Martin, an unusually bright young man was ordained by the church. He did a good work and baptized a great number of people. He finally left the church and the denomination and became a noted Presbyterian minister. Rev. W. Warring was pastor for a little while and then went to Washington, D. C. and became pastor of one of the leading churches of that city, Berman Baptist church. During the second half of the century the church has had just three pastors, Rev. Holland Powell, he served four years; Rev. R. C. Quarles whose pastorate was just two years; and Rev. J. Edward Nash the present pastor, who has served forty Seven years.

This part of the 78th Psalm which we are using as our text has a special application to us. For we have been and are being efected by this busy, rapidly moving age in which we find ourselves. For too many of us the voice of our faithful fathers, who built for us a hundred years ago can hardly be heard amid the clatter, tumult and confusion. The new eccleastical inventions are attractive; they make charming, fascinating music that so fill our ears that we do not as we should hear the voice of our fathers.

At the close of the first century and at the beginning of the second in the history of our career is a good time for us to stop, get our bearings, renew our loyalties, and intensify our determination, "To lay aside every weight and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and to run with patience the race set before us.

Through many dangers, toils, and snares, I have already come; Tis grace hath brought ne safe thus far, and grace will lead me home.

There are tasks so hard so difficult that we should not think about attempting if we felt that our efficiency depended upon ourselves. But when we know that God is watching over and caring for us constantly we willing accept tasks, and assume responsibilities, that ordinarily are too hard for man.

As there are a day and night shift in a high pressure factory even so God makes provision for us so that we can work with the same ease and satisfaction when it is dark and gloomy as when it is bright and sunshiny.

Let us without doubt or fear go about the task that has been divinely assigned us with the assurance that God is watching over and caring for us.

Women are under obligation to be honest in letting the men, with whom they go into battle, know that God has reserved much glory and honor for them.

Women are under obligation to insist upon men with whom they are going into battle going to Kedesh first of all and getting their bearings there.

We shall do well to give serious thought upon the battles that together we are to fight.

SECULAR MORAL STANDARDS.

GODLESS EDUCATIONAL SYSTEMS.

FREEDOM OF THE BODY THAT ENSLAVES THE SOUL.

AGENCIES THAT MINIMIZE THE VALUE OF THE HOME.

AGENCIES THAT TRY TO SUPPLANT THE CHURCH.

May the women of today hear our men, as timid as was Barak, saying we will go to battle against the evils in the world, if you will go with us, and if you will not go with us we will not go.

A GOOD TREE CAN NOT BRING FO#RTH EVIL FRUIT, NEITHER CAN A CORRUPT TREE BRING FORTH GOOD FRUIT.

Truly men and women are like trees, and in so many particulars must be treated as trees are treated. They must be PLANTED AT THE PROPER TIME, in the PROPER PLACE, and by the PROPER PERSON.

Trees must have hedges about them; for they must be cared for and protected.

Every tree has fruit; for that is the only way by which it can perpetuate its kind.

Trees have an absolute goodness and a relative goodness, that is a tree may be good at one time and place, but not much good at another time and place. The fruit of a tree may be good for some people, but of little or no good for some other people.

The bloom and the fruit in its first stage, in appearance may be the same on many trees. But the true character of the tree always shows itself in the mature fruit. We must not depend too much upon secondary things attaching to the tree, as BARK, BRANCHES, LEAVES, and BLOOMS by which to determine its true character. For these, like the fruit in its infancy, may appear alike or nearly alike in the good tree and in the corrupt tree.

Some times a tree must die in order to give the world the full benefit of its value. So we have trees that have been made into furniture, houses, ships and whatnot. Thus we get the true and greatest value of the cedar, the oak, the bass, and the mahogany.

As a tree let each of us endeavor to be the kind of tree that God has made us, and produce the fruit that God has intended for us to produce.

Those who lived a century ago desired to see things that we see in matters RACIAL, DO-MESTIC, EDUCATIONAL, INDUSTRIAL-ECONOMIC, CIV-IC, ECCLEASTICAL.

THOse who lived a century ago desired to hear the messages that we haer in MUSIC, LEC-TURES. ADDRESSES, SERMONS.

May we recognize and appreciate the marvelous inheritance into which we are entering as we begin the lobors of another century.

Let us take time to see the wonderful, helpful things that have been provided for us. May we hear the helpful messages that are constantly being spoken into our ears.

May we remember that finally our productiveness depends upon what is within us.

Jesus is just leaving the great city of Jericho, where evidently, he had become very popular; for with his disciples, a great multitude followed him. But this man, physically blind, had better spiritual sight than all the sophisticated multitude. Jesus saw in this person more than a blind man begging. Jesus saw in hin a real men with two good eyes devotedly following him, advertizing in a very forceful way what he could do and was very anxious to do for all who in faith would come to him.

The people who are blind, physically blind, mentally blind, and spiritually blind are legion. Jesus does not like blindness, any kind of blindness. He is anxious to have his followers tell them that he is calling them, and that he wishes a chance to heal them.

God has filled this world with beauty all kinds of beauty. And he wishes us to see it and enjoy it.

We must remember that the world is full of callers, and we must be able make a distinction.

Most callers do not comfort, indeed they bring discomfort. We do well to remain inactive and silent until we get the right call.

Though, because of circumstances, we be blind and inactive, let us be hopeful for the Master will come....Amen....

THE JUST UPRIGHT MAN IS LAUGHED TO SCORN.

This is not a very encouraging comment: not much of an inducement to live an upright just, honest life.

The far reaching significance of these is not to be found simply in what they say, but rather in what they imply. For they imply that things weighty and serious are at a discount, and that levity and friolity are at a premium; that there is a greater demand for the comedian than for the counsellor; for the magician than for the merchant; for the base ball than for the bank.

To be just and upright is divine. But the true value of these virtues is not recognized and appreciated by unredeemed humanity. Humanity lauds and praises that which is like unto itself. And we know unredeemed humanity is not just, not upright.

So in the very beginning of our spiritual career we ought to know the real situation. We ought to know that this world is no friend to grace to help us on to God. We ought to know # that they who would live godly in Christ Jesus must in this world have tribulations. We ought to know that like our Master we will be dispised and rejected of men.

You may enter your crusade against injustice, dishonesty and all kinds of evil, but you will not have a brass band to lead you in your fight. But to the contrary much of your best work must be done in secret, unobserved, out of sight.

Of all his contemporaries, when here in the flesh, Jesus the upright, the just was the least popular. So unpopular was he that he was finally driven bound to Golgotha and executed, while a thief and robber, the unjust

man was released from prison and given his liberty.

If you are endeavoring to live a just upright life do not be surprised if byou are kept out of the position where you could be helpful to your fellowman and the unjust dishonest man is put in instead; if the libertine is chosen and you are rejected; if the racketeer fares sumptiously and you can barely live.

But read history and the Word of God, take courage and rejoice in God's promises.

And any one who would break up their funeral party, in their estimation, is crazy, and they laugh him to scorn.

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May we realize that Jesus Is ready and anxious to enter every home and every indidividual life and make the sleeping to awake and the daed to live. Let us get every thing out of his way and give him a chance to do that for every one of us that which he longs to do.

One generation erects great and beautiful structures, cathedrals, museums, music halls and art galleries, another generation comes along and in a moment blows them to destruction.

But there come times when men are so totally depraved, so void of the divine spirit that nothing but wickedness and unrighteousness will appeal to them.

There are situations that make love and kindness and mearcy nonsense; and prayer becomes mockery. Such situations must be met with a sword. And woe be unto you if you do not have one.

Nevertheless these other words of Jesus always hold good: he that taketh the sword shall perish by the sword. It is a kind of a duel situation, and in a duel situation one always perishes, and some times both perish. But when you are cornered with another in a duel the only way that you can have a ghost of a chance is to have the weapon that is used in a duel. Buy a sword.

The sword about which Jesus is speaking always means defense, never offence.

There are always certain things that we must conserve if we would serve God or man. Some times these things are material, as family, home treasures and country. But most of the time these things that we are to conserve are moral, spiritual, as character, influence prestiege, as faith hope piety.

When influences or individuals arise that would destroy these things, then we are justified and are under obligation to use the sword.

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May we always remember that the sword that we should always have is the sword of the spirit. Let us use that successfully and we shall have less need for the other sword.

And if you wish to know just how hard that class of people are to please ask some one who has the responsibility of preparing the meals.

But there is another class for whom the one who has charge of the meals likes to prepare. They are persons who are up early in the morning and are out and get the good fresh air. They go to work and do something that is constructive and worthwhile. You do not have to ask them why they eat or what results they expect to get from their eating and drinking. They have used up much of their strength and they have a keen appetite and they wish to appease it and thereby get more strength.

And so the laborers in the vineyard of the Lord are always ready and are anxious to come with their colaborers to the table of the Lord. Too Often those who stay away from the table of the Lord, or ###are not very much concerned and do not partake of the Supper with enthusiasm and joy, are those who do a very little if anything for the upbuilding of the kingdom of God.

Let us never be among those who partake of the supper and feel that we are at liberty to go out and play instead of going out to be more arduous colaborers with our Lord.

May we realize that partake of the Lord's supper puts us under special obligation to do great things for our fellowmen and for our God.

IS CHRIST DIVIDED?

The answer to many questions that are puzzling the world today is to be found in the answer to the question that constitutes our text.

We all do not see things in just exactly the same way. But I feel safe in saying that none of us see things that are very heartening and encouraging. In whatever direction we look things are out of order, upside down. Everywhere chaos prevails.

A long long time ago one of the old Testament major prophets told us that one was coming, who would cause the crooked ways to be made straight, the rough ways made smooth, that he would cause the mountains to be made low, and every valley to be exalted. And when this person to whom the prophet refered came into this old world it was recorded of him, that he came unto his own and his own received him not. He was dispised and rejected of men. They called him beelzebub the prince of devils.

From the time that Jesus came into the world to the present moment men have been divided in their opinions concerning him. In the days of the first apostles this condition was so prominent that the chiefmamong them asked the question of our text.

In our further study let us consider:

THE INEFFECTIVENESS OF A DISECTED CHRIST

However we view this subject it does not present a picture that is very pleasant upon which to look. In this picture all the selfishness, narrowness, prejudice and bigotry that have prevailed against Jesus during the centuries come before us.

We have seen what havor they have wrought in the world. The poor have been oppressed, the helpless-dependent have been treated unjustly, the wicked have been exalted and the righteous have been cast down. Through these the machinery of church and state has been turned upside down, the irregularities have been endorsed while the value of morality has been minimized, and a premium has been put upon vice.

This situation is the more serious because many of the disectors of Christ are not conscious of the fact that they are disectors. They are found among all classes. Among them are found the ordinary layman, and the scholar; college and seminary presidents are among them. Theologians fundamental and modernistic are among the disectors. Christ is disected in the home of his enemies.

There are those out of and those in the church who are unwilling to accept Christ in his entirety and apply him to all their daily problems. They are willing to take him if they are allowed to accept what the like and to reject what they do not like

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What is true in other phases of life is equally true in our religious life; in union there is strength. And the logical corollary to that fact is that there is weakness in division. We know the church is impotent and unable successfully to deal with the problems all about us.

No organization in all the world is called upon to deal with so many problems and in so many ways as the church. The church must deal with problems () INDUSTRIAL-ECONOMIC, POLITICAL, () INTELLECTUAL, () SOCIAL, () RACIAL, () MORAL and () RELIGIOUS.

When Jesus was here in the flesh he met many opposing forces. None was more persistent than that something that Jesus called tradition. The people lost then in the quagmires of ignorance and superstition were blindly following their leaders into futher ruin and destruction.

The common people were conscious of their plight, but they did not know how to get out of it. A great number of sects grew up among them. All of them bad for followers, each sect claiming they had the remedy for the ills of the world. They were enemies to one another. But when Jesus came with the real remedy the common people heard him gladly. But these sects all combined against Jesus and continued to fool the people. So the people were in doubt as to who was right. They did not know whom to follow. At the time the words of our text were written some of them clung to Paul, some to Apollos, some to Cephas and others to Christ. Hence the words of our text.

May remember always that we need and must have a whole Christ if we are to deal successfully with these problems:

CRIME. OVERINDULGENCE. RECREATION-AMUSE-MENT. RACE RELATIONS. DENOMINATIONALISM.. POLITICS.

Let us realize that Christ is all that he claims to be and will do all that he has promised to do if will cooperate with him.

The man who becomes a minister must no longer glory in cuningness and craftiness. Deceit and pretension in handling the word of God must be discarded.

For his success and glory the minister must depend upon the manifestation, the revelation of the truth, and in this way, by this technique, this method commend himself to every man's conscience. And all of this must be done in the consciousness of the fact that it is being done not alone that men may see it, but that it is being done under the scrutinizing eye of God.

Thus we see the seriousness of the ministry.

The temptations of the ministry.

The demands of the ministry.

The real work of the ministry.

The help that comes to the ministry.

Seeing the nature of the ministry let each of us do all in our power to help the ministry be what God wishes it to be.

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BUT I KEEP UNDER MY BODY, AND BRING IT INTO SUBJECTION; LEST THAT BY ANY MEANS, WHEN I HAVE PREACHED TO OTHERS, I MYSELF SHOULD BE A CASTAWAY.

Most persons think a very great deal of their bodies, and are constantly doing things to build up and maintain its efficiency. They do not always do just the right things. In fact not many know just what to do to make their bodies render them the greatest and best service. Hence we often take into our systems the wrong kind of food. Many make great provision for liquid foods, but very small provision for solid foods. Then bodily exercise is so often neglected by all of us.

There are many who pose and are regarded as experts. They have written books telling us how and what and when to eat; and the kind of exercise to take in order to keep the body fit and efficient. But the greatest experts to be found on this subject are found in the Word of God. Whatever else we may learn, if we do not learn what is found there and practice it we can not be our best.

There are two kinds of life that characterize too many of those who are active in the affairs of the church, and in the affairs of the state.

About one of these two kinds of life we all hear much and say much, and therefore are quite familiar with it. We are talking about a selfish life and about what I term a selfless life.

The activities of the selfish life are all about us, and we know their results. But we do not the selfless life. And now some of you may be wondering what is this selfless life about which we are talking. Well, it is that kind of life that gives too little attention to oneself.

The value of our bodies depends upon the kind of mind we have. If we have a good clean mind the body opens up the way for us and makes pregress possible. If on the other hand we have an impure unclean mind then our bodies block our way and make progress impossible.

If we would keep our minds in the condition in which God wishes them to be we can not do better than to observe his word which says, keep thy heart with all diligence, for out of it are the issues of life. And again, Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus.

May we let God tell us how to use our bodies in the profitable way and in the way that will be pleasing to him.

The term church has a special meaning for each class that constitutes its membership. For one class the church is a TRAINING STATION. For another class it is a kind of SANITARIUM. For still another it furnishes an APPORTUNITY FOR SERVICE.

The church is not and never was intended to be an ASYLUM for the worn out infirm. It is for live strong persons who wish to grow.

The work of salvation is very large and comprehensive. It is not an instantaneous act or rather the result of an instantaneous act. Salvation is always the result of a continuous process.

Each one who enters into the dhurch life should realize the things and conditions from which he needs to be saved. He needs to be saved from:

DOUBT, Doubt may be subjective and objective. We indulge in subjective doubt when we question and doubt ourselves. And this disqualifies us for working with others or by ourselves. We indulge in objective doubt when we doubt our fellowmen, and will not give them a chance to cooperate with us. So we see that whether our doubt is subjective or objective we need to be saved from it. And the church helps to do that.

We need to be saved fron:

SUSCICION which makes us attribute to our fellowman vices and weaknesses that he may not possess. Suspicion makes it difficult for us to be wholehearted when dealing with our fellowman.

Then we need to besaved from:

SELFRIGHTEOUSNESS, which keeps us from using the means by which we grow and become Christlike.

Rom. 12:21 BE NOT OVERCOME OF EVIL, BUT OVERCOME EVIL WITH GOOD.

Riches, all kinds of riches abound in the world. God made it so, Nevertheless there is much poverty, all kinds of poverty in the world. The Devil has made it so.

Now the question that comes to us, every one of us is, What are we going to do about it? This scripture, here in the 12th chapter of Romans 21st verse, that we have selected as a basis for our brief study tells us in a very definite way what we are to do about this irregular, abnormal condition in the world, and has been in the world since the cursed fall. But we can carry out this injunction only as we recognize and observe another scripture, which says, I can do all things through Christ Mich strengetheneth me.

There are those in the world, and have been ever since the world got out of order who are and have been trying to lift the world out of the dark caotic state into which she has fallen, and to liberate man from the bondage of want and suffering.

Men have been concerned first of all about their material needs. They have prayed for and sought increase in their flocks and herds and more plenteous harvests. Nothing is more repulsive, makes us more uncomfortable than the thought of being in bandage. The slaves in America used to sing some thing like this: Before I would be a slave I would fight and die and go down into my grave. And one of America's great statemen said, I know not what course others may take, but as for me, give me liberty or give me death.

Men do all kinds of things, pay all kinds of prices in order to be free. Ancient Israel going out of Egypt; the Pilgrim Fathers coming to America; the American slaves journeying through swamps and forests to reach Canada are all vivid illustrations of what men are willing to pay for liberty.

And yet most every body we see in in some kind of bondage. And must continue in bondage so long as they are void of truth. Error makes men slaves, truth makes them free. Hence we give men access to schools, churches and other institutions. We make it possible for them, without money and without price to use our public libraries, art galleries and museums.

There are two great spirits in the world, the spirit of God and the spirit of the devil, the spirit of TRUTH and LIBERTY; and the spirit of ERROR and BONDAGE.

It is not what say, but what we do that determins under which spirit we are.

In matters material, not every one can give us real full liberty. However arduously they may labor they always leave us in some kind of bondage.

And in matters spiritual, surely there is only one who can give us complete liberty, perfect liberty. And we are exhorted in our text, to stand fast in the liberty wherewith he hath made us free.

His liberty is the TRUE LIBERTY that gives Inalienable rights in the world and enfranchises us in the kingdom of God.

Let us remember, that if the Son makes us free that we are free inded. Let us act like free men who are able always to serve God and our fellowmen according to the dictates of our consciencies.

I BESEECH YOU THEREFORE, BRE-THREN, BY THE MERCIES OF GOD, THAT YE PRESENT YOUR BODIES A LIVING SACRIFICE, HOLY, AC-CEPTABLE UNTO GOD, WHICH IS YOUR REASONABLE SERVICE.

But the hardest thing in all the world for men to do is to carry out the injunction of our text, to give their bodies a living sacrifice holy acceptable unto God. They think of all these other things as being reasonable, but they cant just see how that offering their good active bodies is reasonable, when there are so many other things to which they can and would like to devote them.

Let us remember, that after all it is not so much what we do, but the state of mind in which we are and the spirit with which we do it that determines as to whether we are offering our bodies a living sactifice holy acceptable unto God.

Let us remember, that whether we eat or drink, or whatever we do that we may do it all to the glory of God.

The WILL CALL customers are never on the merchant(s prefered list. He would much sooner do business with customers who know what they want, pay for it and take it or have it sent to their homes immediately.

In every phase of material life there is a WILL CALL department. And there may be many just reasons for it. But in things spiritual there is no place for this department.

In the Word of God the value of the things of the Kingdom is defined as a pearl of great price. The record shows that those who have become really interested in the Kingdom have been so attracted and charmed that they have at once disposed of every thing that they have had, and have immediately arranged to purshase their part of the Kingdom and to make full paymeny.

But things material, things carnal have always clamored for first place. They have always asked the spiritual to adjust itself to them, to make their plans convenient to them. They have said to the saints of the Lord, Be GOOD, be HONEST, and TRUTHFUL when it is convenient so to be, when every thing is conducive to being so, and when there is no temptation to be otherwise.

You are prompted by the flesh and advised to attend church and support it by your labor, prayers and means when it is convenient to

However good and pious we may be or think we are, the Lord Jesus can not do business with us if we fail to make his affairs first and parament.

He talks about a certain man when he means God. He talks about a vine dresser when he means himself. He talks about fruit when he means good deeds. He talks about digging when he means teaching, instructing, and firtilizing means the same thing.

Cutting down means taking away your chance, your opportunity.

May we recognize the significance and value of our podition and make the most of it so that the Master shall always find something to our credit.
