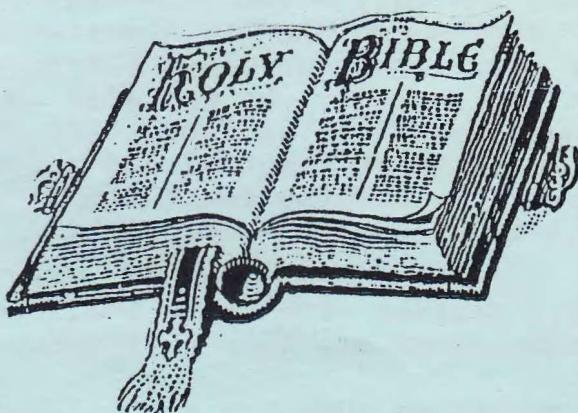

## O B I T U A R Y

Mr. Charles Presbery Ruff was born in Belle Air, Maryland on September 18, 1894 and he died on April 29, 1992 in Buffalo.

After graduating from Hampton Institute, he enlisted in the U.S. Army. During World War I he served as a musician in England, France and in Germany.

In 1920 he married the late Inez Ruff, nee Johnson, and they moved to Buffalo, New York. He was employed as a master carpenter at the Pullman Company from which he retired in 1959. He was also an original member of the famed "100 Voice Choir" of Lincoln Memorial and a founding member of the Hampton Institute Alumni Association of Western New York.

Mr. Ruff resided with Emily Idell Ruff, the youngest of his four children.

Other surviving children are Mr. and Mrs. Charles V. Ruff of Buffalo; Mr. and Mrs. Ralph C. Ruff of Seattle, Washington; and Mrs. Helen Doloris Perry of Tacoma, Washington. He is also survived by a sister-Mrs. Minnie Washington of Belle Air, Maryland. Included among his immediate family are 7 grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren and 1 great, great grandson.
