

A similar street, ending south of Jewett Avenue, Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." Summit deeded to the city in 1889, except for the small tween Amherst and Crescent which was deeded in 1892. It follows Olmsted's rule that it "not lead with special toward the town."
