

House is located two blocks  from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and southeast of the Zoo.	
18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Queen Anne-Tudor type. Twin dormers have Tudor arched pediments within gable barge boards. This layered motif is repeated on porch pediment. A simple shape is enlivened with asymmetrical elements. South elevation has large Tudor arched leaded glass windows. Vestibule projection has curved leaded glass.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: An excellent example of a transitional style prominently sited on a corner lot at Crescent and Florence. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Creacent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward the town."
