One's ability to endure and to flourish is dependent on being rooted in the Lord Jesus Christ. The family moved to Niagara Falls, NY, in 1951. She united with Trinity Baptist Church, Rev. J.H. Pratcher, Pastor, and worked with the Missionary and Building Committees. In 1952, the family moved to Buffalo, NY. She united with the Friendship Baptist on Church on June 11, 1952, under the leadership of the late Rev. E. D. McNeely. She was active in her church and her community in Alabama and Niagara Falls and Buffalo in the following: Vice President of General Missionary Society; Secretary of the Mothers Board for 17 years, President, School 17 PTA, 1960-1963, organized (in 1957) and participated in the Florida Street Block Club No. 1 for 24 years, CAO community aide, organized the MLK Senior Citizens Club in 1972, was a member of the Queen of Sheba OES, No. 4A, Sunday School teacher for 41 years, BYPU Secretary and Treasurer, Pastors Aid President for 9 years, Missionary teacher, Usher Board No.1. She attended Bennett High Adult Education, Buffalo Higher Education (CAO), and Nannie Helen Burroughs School for Christian Women in Washington, DC. She was a guest writer for the Buffalo Criterion and the Challenger.
