

Crescent Avenue is the ngest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching om Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on msted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's ans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its rrent form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by ve different owners over a span of five years, beginning in 87 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue gins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's le that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special rectness toward the town."
