Once upon a time John Van Druten told Celeste Holm that one day she should do the musical version of his now famous play—so she has long looked forward to this realization. Miss Holm burst into recognition with her now legendary portrayal of the lusty and light-hearted Ado Annie in OKLAHOMA! 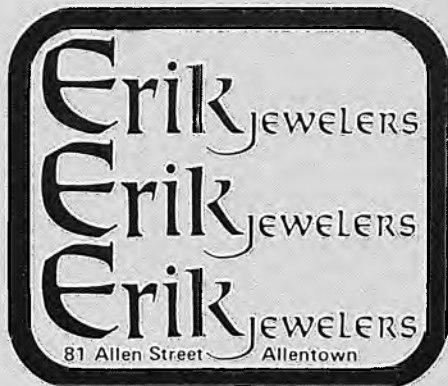

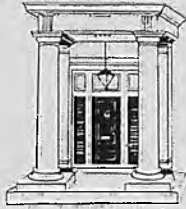
