

Two story American Four Square. Hip roof. Hipped dormer on west side of house. Eight light over single pane windows in dormer. Projecting bay on south side of house. Two bay windows on second floor front facade with the center windows being eight light over single pane. Open porch across front of house has squared columns and a cross stick design railing.

	20.	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:		
	-	Good example of the American Four Square style that was built in this neighborhood. This house is located on Parkside Avenue, a street conceived by FLO around 1873 as part of a residential "Suburb" adjacent to Delaware Park. This suburb was called "The Parkside" by Olmsted and appears on an 1876 map drawn by him as a		

proposed area of curved winding streets on the north and east sides of the park. Parkside Avenue was actually created by the City of

Buffalo in 1888. The street very closely follows Olmsted's original plan maintaining the picturesque character that he envisioned for

the streets surrounding the park.
