


- REFLECTIONS -

WHERE IS GOD IN ALL OF THIS? This was one of the many critical questions posed to Rev. Millet by his wife, Edna, during the period of his illness. He responded with the following words:

God is present in people who care whom we see; in faith, where we do not see, God is also present as the parent who cares.
