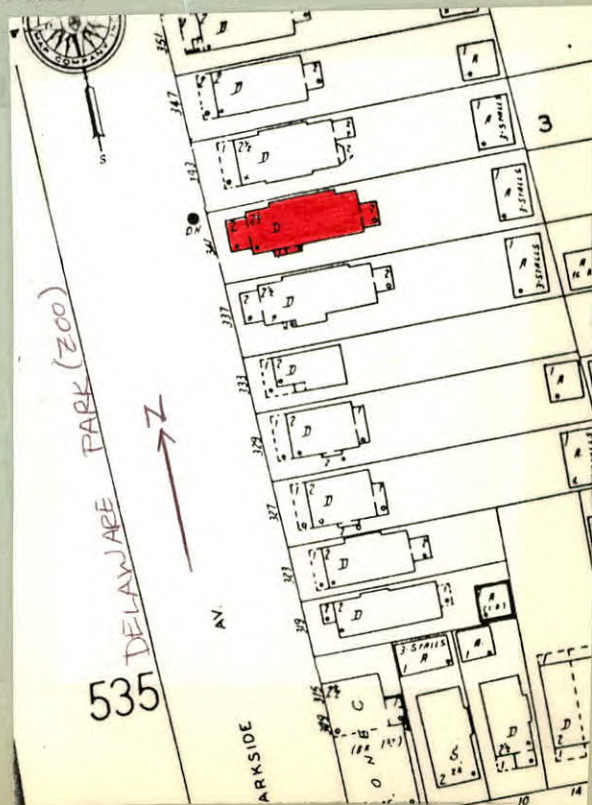

Two story brick house. Hip roof. Hipped dormer with two double-hung windows on west side of house. Entranceway on south side of house with a hipped roof and multi-paned door. Projecting pavilion on front of house has eight over eight light windows.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Typical example of a two flat house that was built in this neighborhood in the 1920's. The house is located on Parkside Avenue, a street conceived by FLO around 1873 as part of a residential "suburb" adjacent to Delaware Park. This suburb was called "The Parkside" by Olmsted and appears on an 1876 map drawn by him as a proposed area of curved winding streets on the north and east sides of the park. Parkside Avenue was actually created by the City of Buffalo in 1888. The street very closely follows Olmsted's original plan maintaining the picturesque character that he envisioned for the streets surrounding the park.
