Every regularly enrolled, full time Buffalo State undergraduate is a member of the College Student Association. Hence, it is truly the representative student organization on campus.

The College Student Association functions to represent student ideas and interests to the faculty, administration, and community.

The Executive Council ratifies all legislative acts and enforces decisions of the legislative branch.

The governing body of C.S.A., the House of Representatives, is the agency responsible for the expression and implementation of student opinion. The House consists of the C.S.A. President, the cabinet of officers and an elected membership representing campus boards and commissions, the classes, resident halls, and C.S.A. approved organizations on campus.

The House of Finance controls and distributes student monies to various student boards and agencies. Since the C.S.A. is funded by student taxes, the control of this money enables the Buffalo State student to receive services and to attend college social functions.

The Judicial Board determines the legality of issues arising from decisions of the House of Representatives within the framework of the constitution of the College Student Association.

The College Student Association enables the individual student to become a vital part of the college community.

The Board also sponsors several art exhibits and a student purchase art show annually.

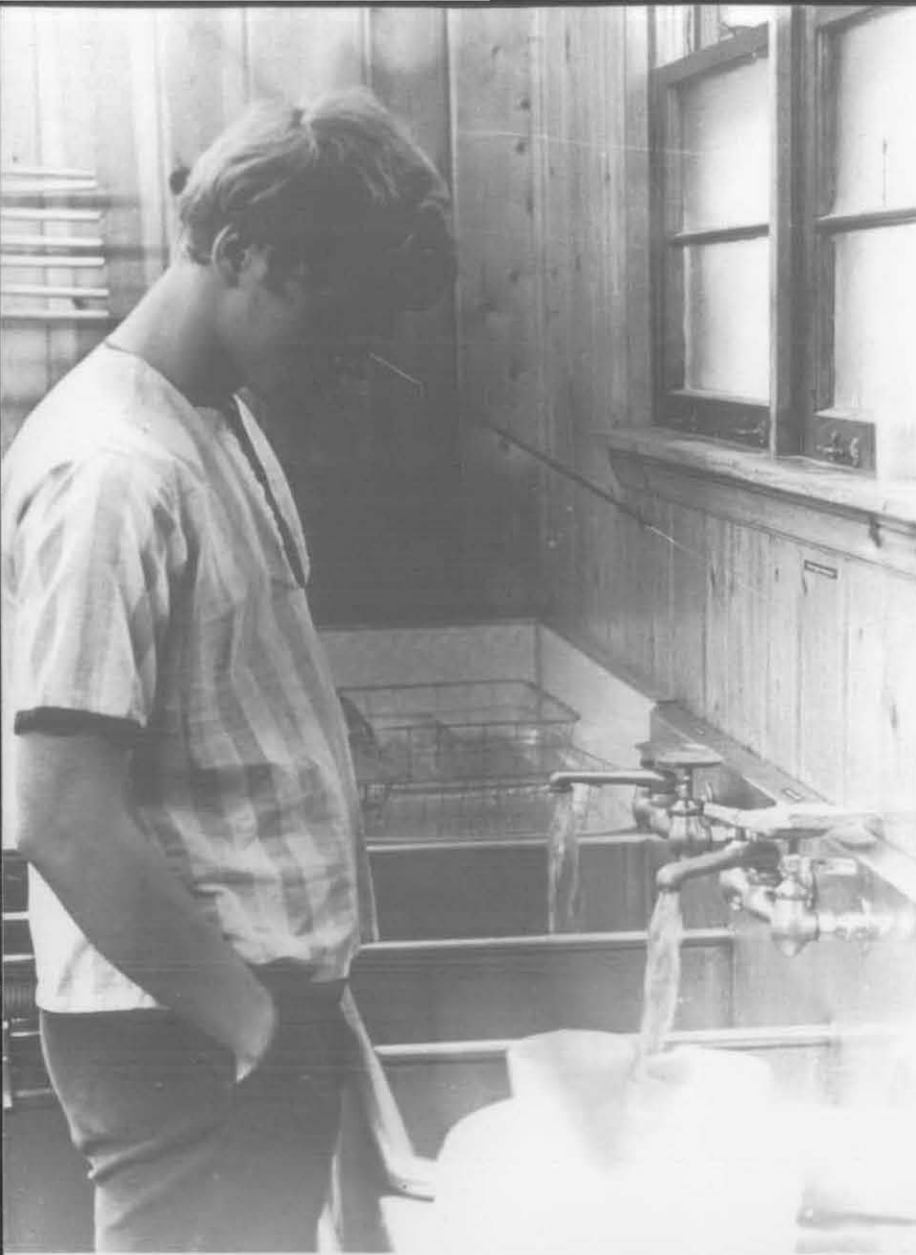




Traffic Department

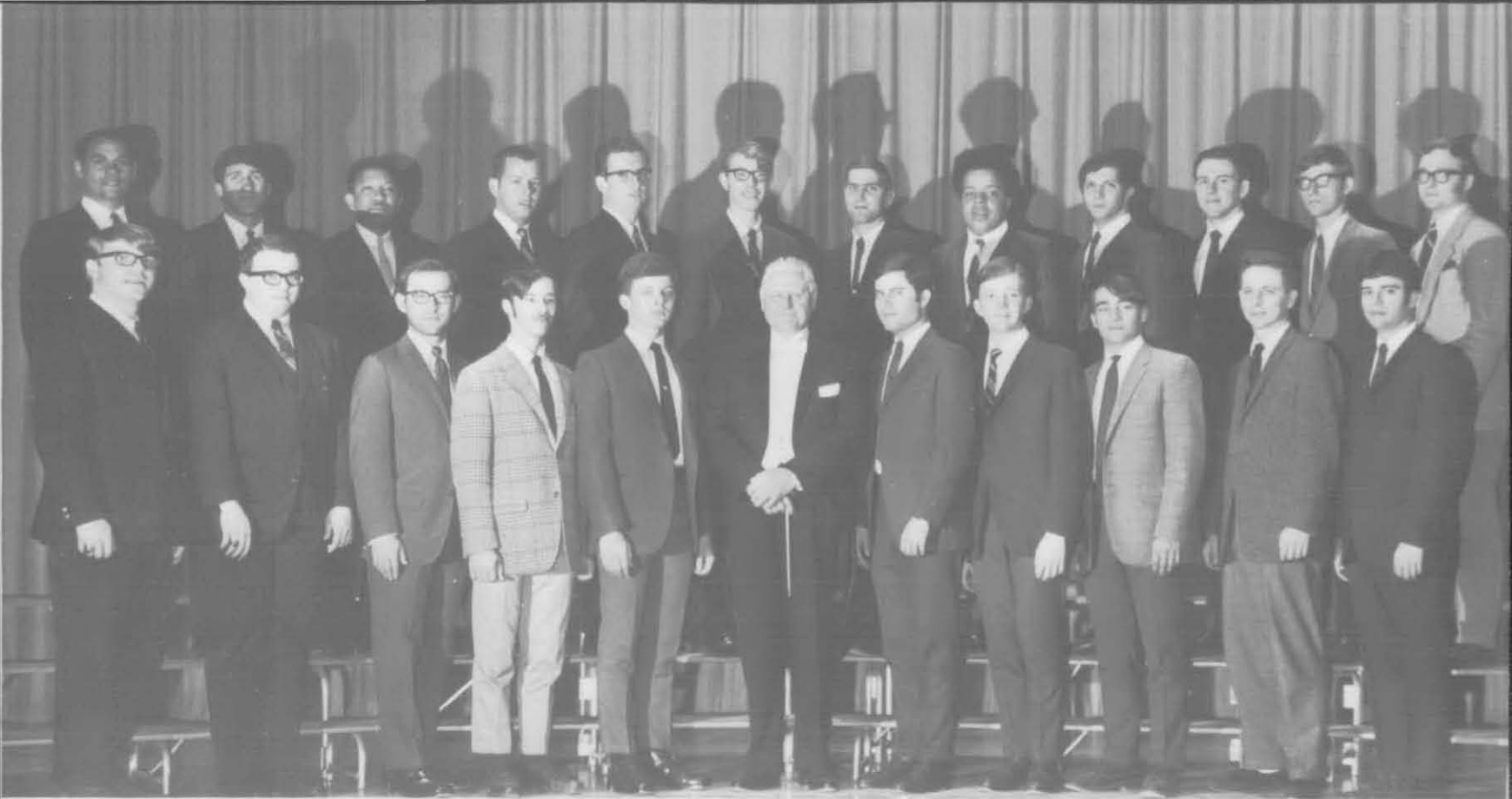

This international professional honorary fraternity was established to promote these principles in the fields of Industrial Arts and Vocational Education.

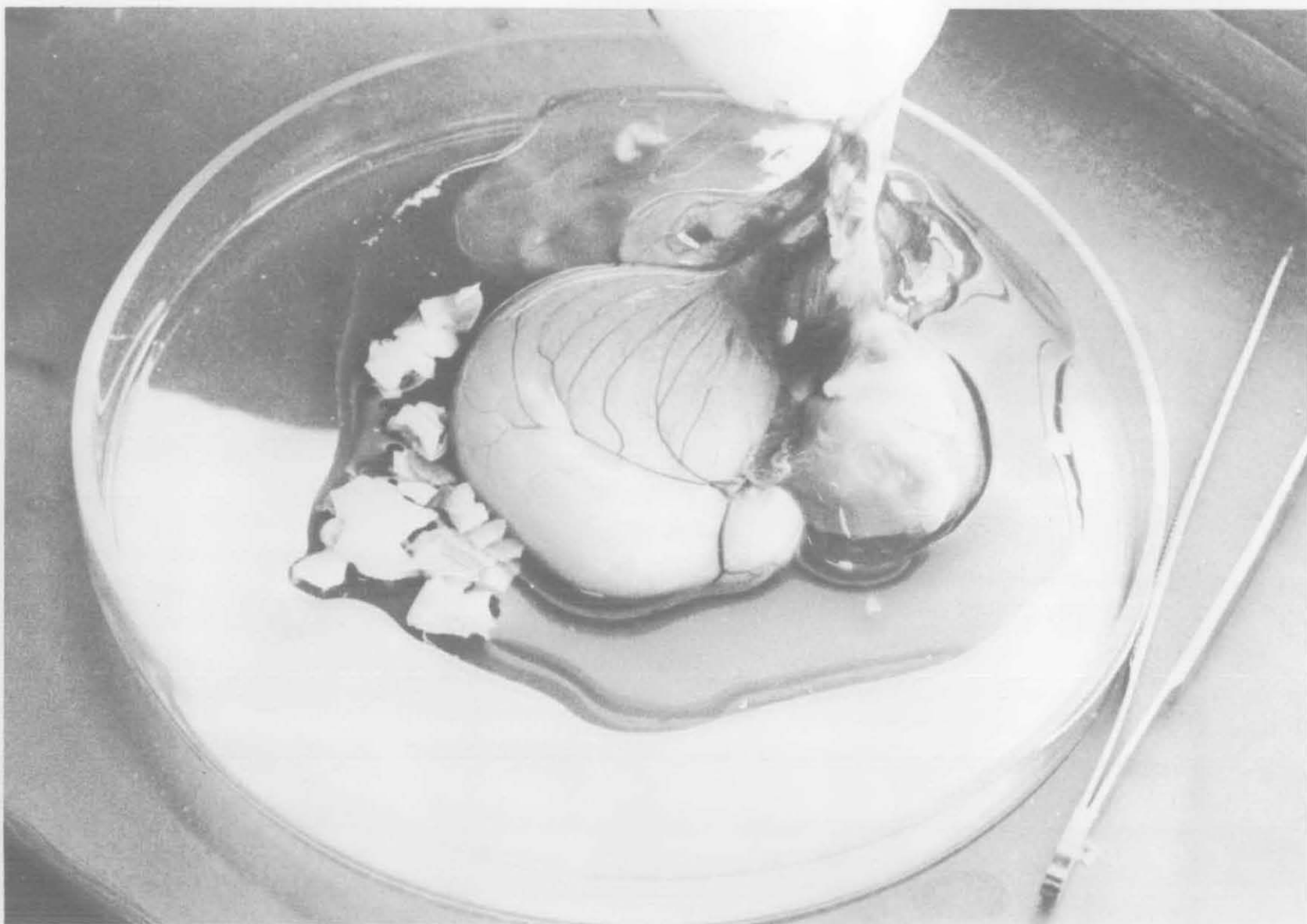


A deeper understanding of education and the influence of related industry on our ever changing society are two of the major goals of the Industrial Arts Club.

South Wing Hall also houses the Student Health Center where students can avail themselves of expert medical attention in a modern facility.

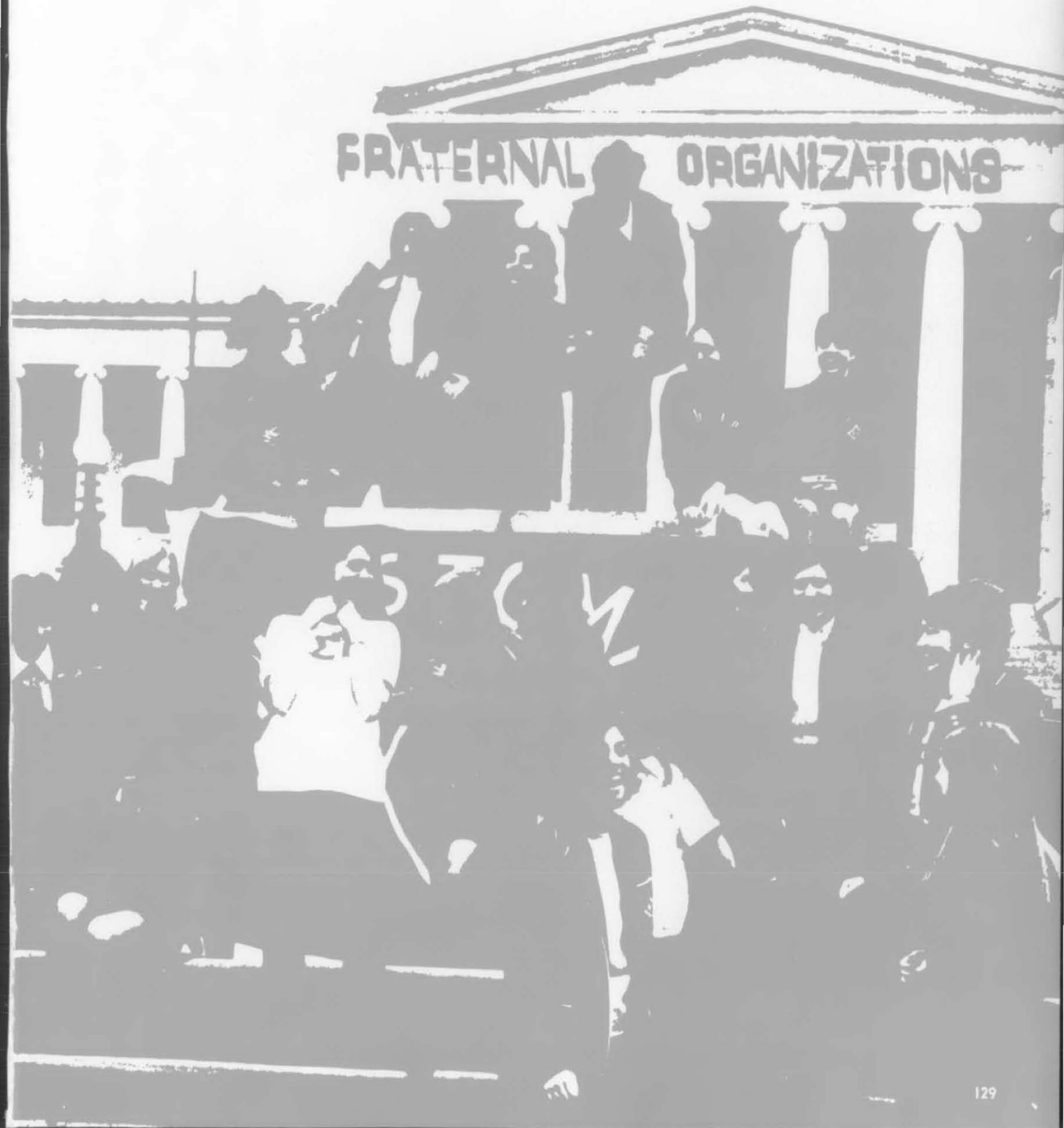

The 1969 varsity team will be bolstered by the addition of many of the fine players from this year's freshman team.

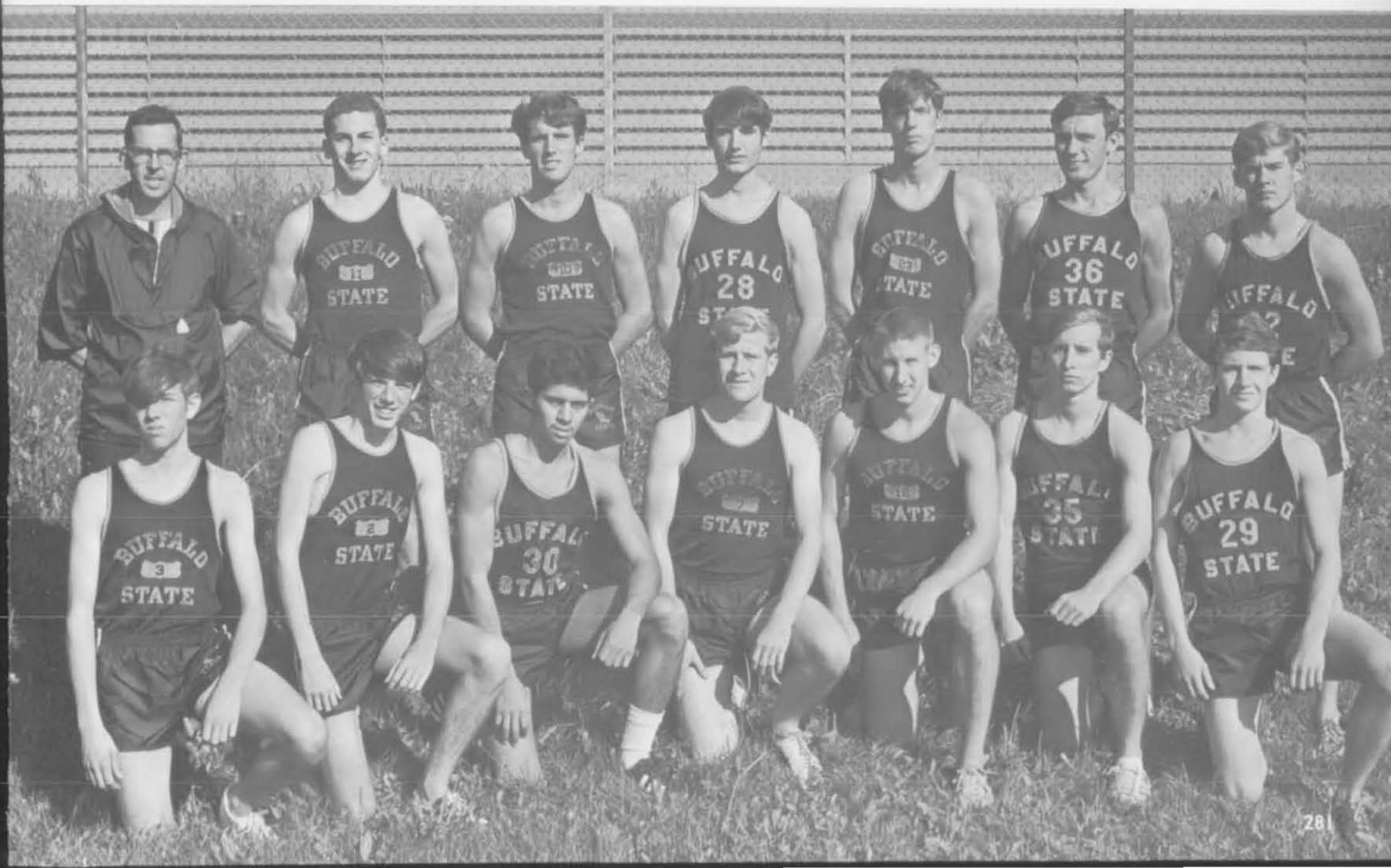


The cross country season was marked by the most successful freshman team in years. The team won the New York State Collegiate Track and Field Association Championship by a low score of 21.

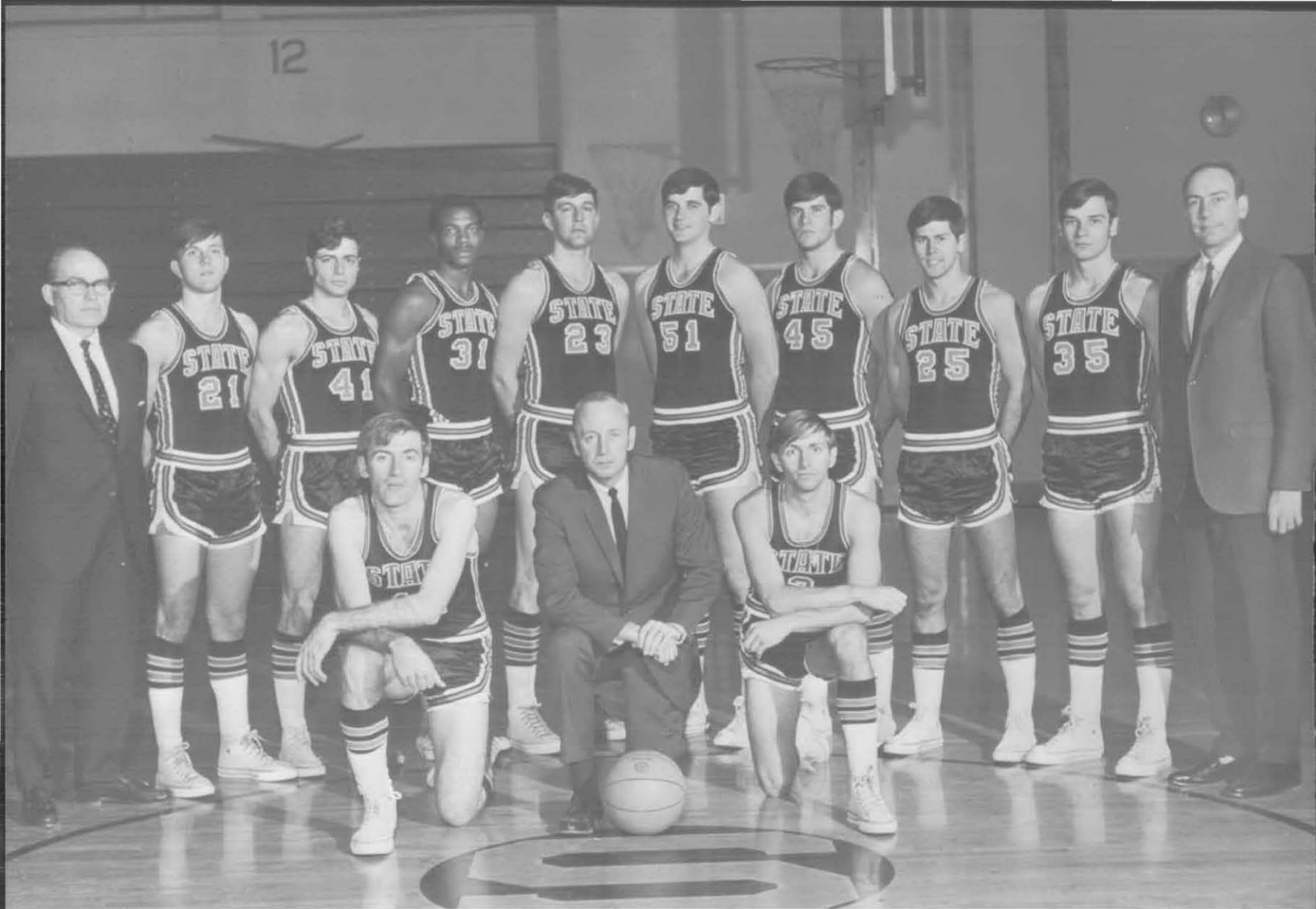

Varsity Basketball

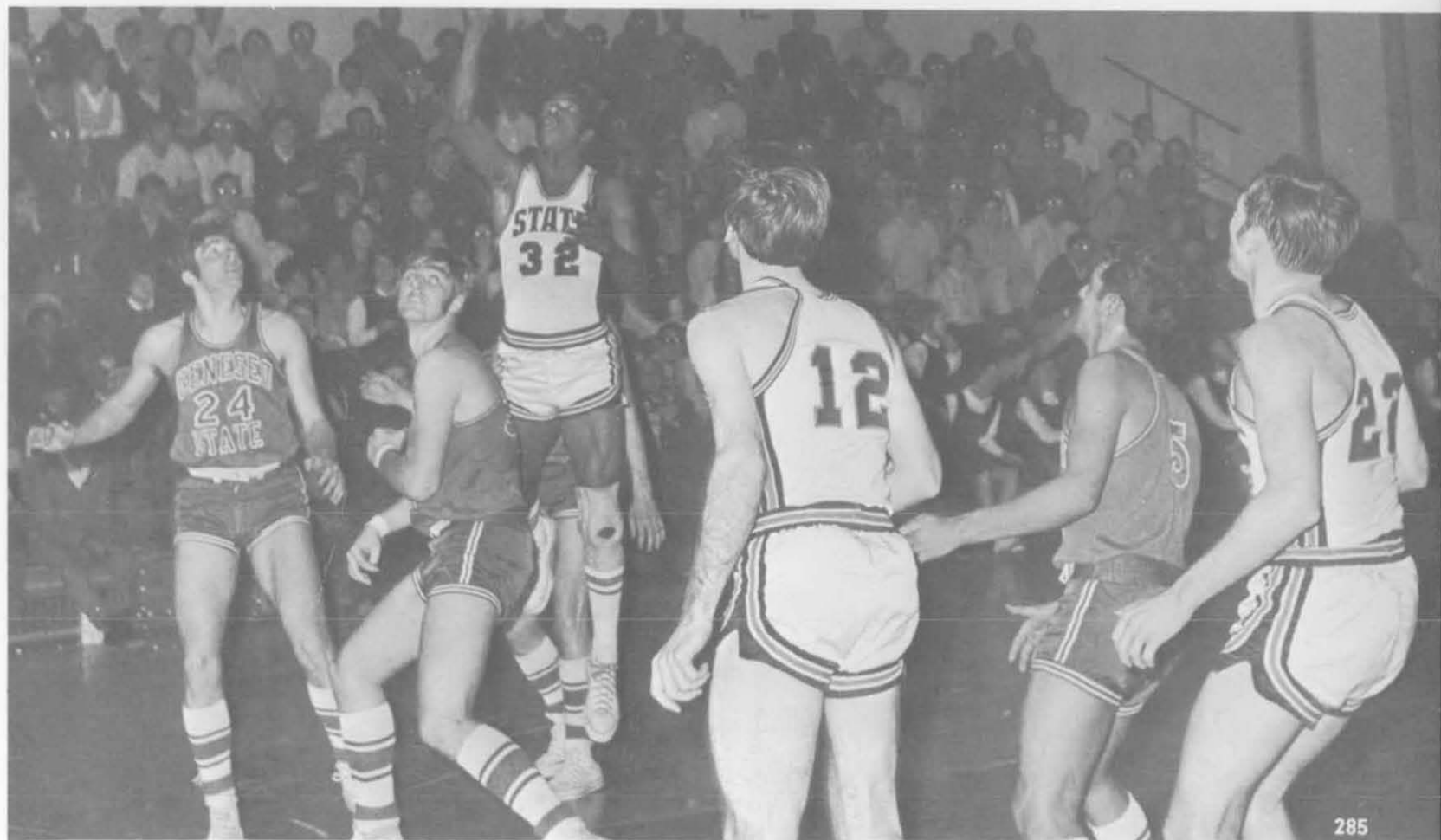
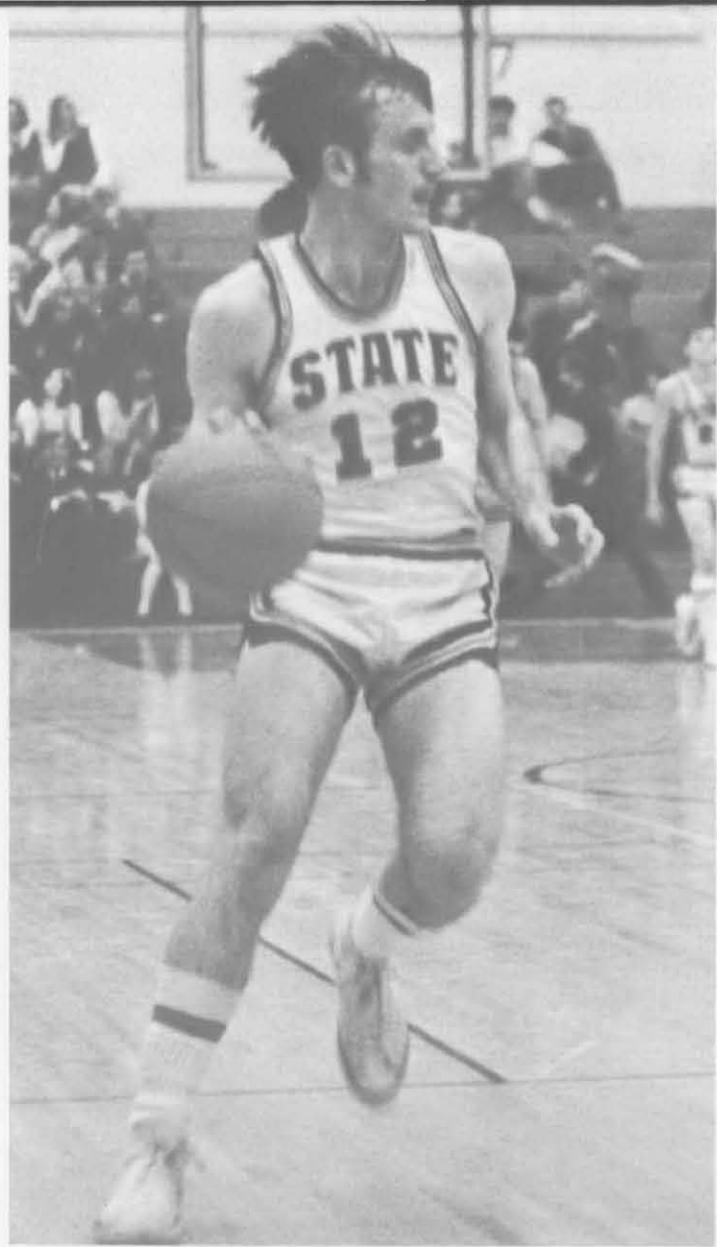
Buffalo State's Orangemen concluded their 1968-69 basketball season with an overall record of 18 wins and 6 losses. In doing so, the Orangemen won their third straight State University of New York Athletic Conference Championship and have won 27 of the 28 conference games played during that same period.

This year's team was selected to play in the NAIA District 19 Regional Tournament. This is the fourth straight year that a Buffalo State basketball team has been selected to participate in a national post season tournament. Two of these bids were NCAA and two were NAIA.

The highlight of the season undoubtedly was State's fourth straight victory over the State University of New York at Buffalo by a score of 83 to 78. Team play and desire won this one, for the Orangemen were down 12 points at half time and only an inspired effort brought them through to victory.

Honored players included Randy Smith and Howie DePriest. Randy, in addition to being named to the Cleveland State All Tournament team, received two E.C.A.C. nominations to the All East team. Howie was named to the E.C.A.C. All East team based on his excellent performance against Eastern Michigan University, the sixth ranked small college in the country. Howie scored 28 points in that game, the high for his career here at Buffalo State.

Overall this year's team registered an excellent record. They found themselves short on reserves and often out-sized and outmanned. Despite these handicaps, the very facts that the Conference title was brought home for the third year, that U.B. was defeated for a fourth time and that we received a post season national bid are indicative of the team's desire and capsule the season very well.





Freshman Basketball

The 1968-69 freshman basketball team posted a seven win-eleven loss record. The team was handicapped by a loss of manpower when the original sixteen man squad dwindled to an eight man squad.

The highlights of the season included an early season win over Niagara University, a midseason win over the strong Ithaca College team, and three very exciting and closely contested games against the State University of New York at Buffalo team.

Leading all scorers for the eighteen game season was Ken Zak with a better than twenty-two point game average. John Swier was the leading rebounder with eight rebounds per game.

Indoor Track

The indoor track team, boasting the largest squad in the college's history, started slowly but by mid-season were faring well. A fifth place finish at the Cortland Invitational behind powerful Colgate and Cornell revealed strength in the mile and two mile with Jerry Pollock's tremendous double (4:26, 9:40), Dan Feather's 3rd place in the 1,000 Yard Run behind two Cornell runners, and the 3rd place finish of the Two Mile Relay team, Chuck Burrows, Pat Janiga, Bob Gabriel, and Dan Feather.

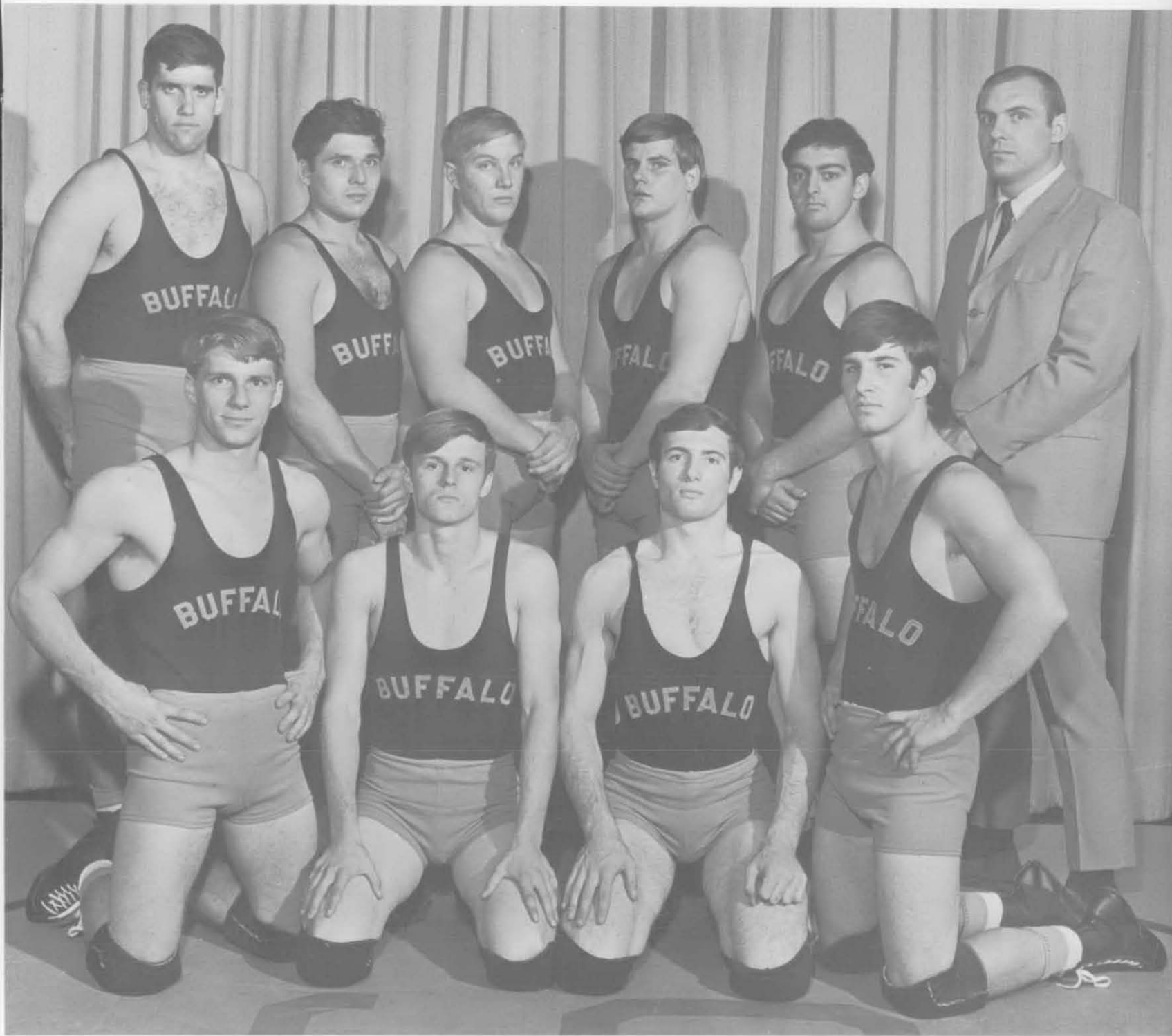

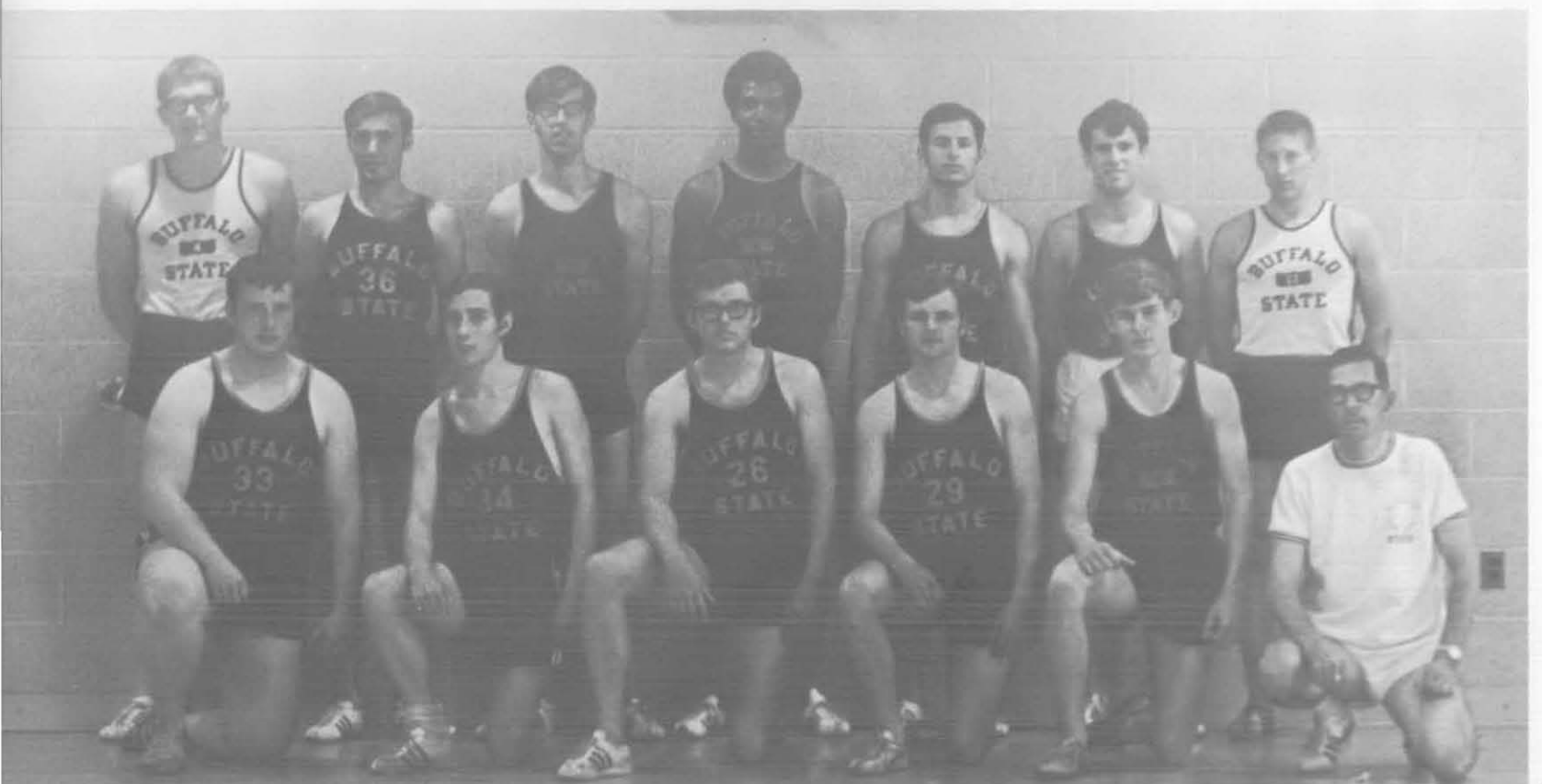




Outdoor Track

This organization is the governing body of the entire inter-collegiate athletic program and composed of the officers from the Men's Athletic Association, Women's Recreation Association and representatives from each class.



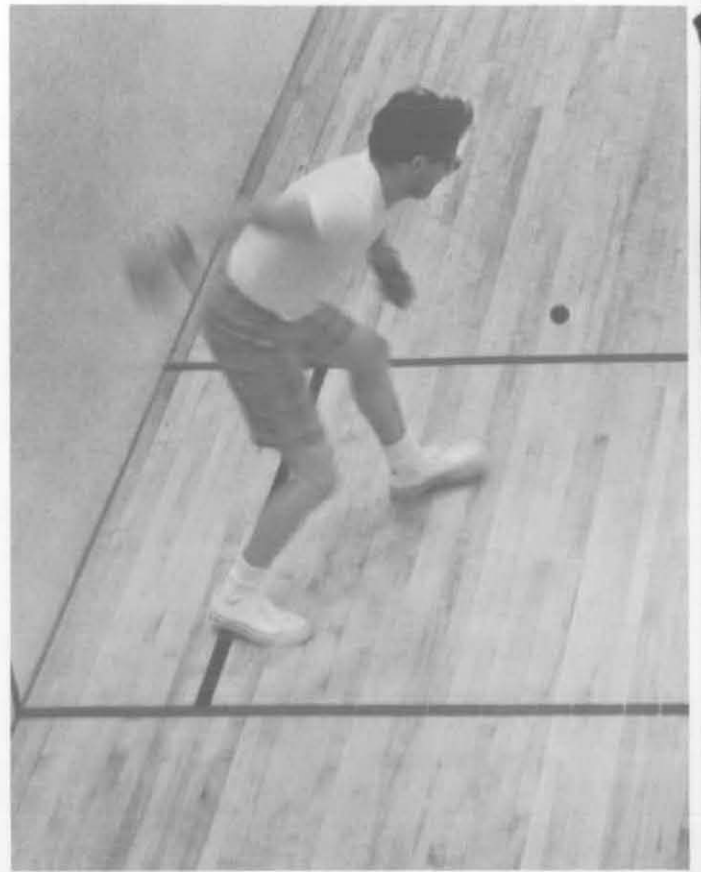
