

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

Two story frame house. Hip roof. Gabled dormer with two six over single pane windows. Two eight over single pane windows and doorway that leads out to the second floor open porch on second floor front facade. Open porch across front of house has tapered squared posts with recessed panels. Stone foundation.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Good example of a frame house that was built in this neighborhood in the early 20th century. This house is located on Parkside Avenue, a street conceived by FLO around 1873 as part of a residential "suburb" adjacent to Delaware Park. This suburb was called "The Parkside" by Olmsted and appears on an 1875 map drawn by him as a proposed area of curved winding streets on the north and east sides of the park. Parkside Avenue was actually created by the City of Buffalo in 1888. The street very closely follows Olmsted's original plan maintaining the picturesque character that he envisioned for the streets surrounding the park.
