mation and background on the buildings and the prominent citizens associated with our illustrious college.

ALBRIGHT HALL - This building, which is located diagonally across the street from the main campus, was named after John Joseph Albright (1848-1931). Mr. Albright moved to Buffalo in 1883 where he became a giant as a leader and promoter of water power generation of electricity, and pushed for its distribution throughout New York State. Mr. Albright donated the Albright Art Gallery (now the Albright-Knox Art Gallery) in Delaware Park to the city, which was completed in 1902, at the cost of more than a million dollars. Mr. Albright was known as a financial genius, a patron of the arts, and a generous donor of public gifts.

Albright Hall has a long, if not confusing, history. In 1920 it housed the Buffalo Museum of Science. It became an art school in 1928. Its name was changed from the Old Elmwood Museum to Clifton Hall in 1929. When it merged with the University of Buffalo in August 1955, its name was altered to Albright Hall. The College of Education art department bought the building in 1958, but they left it for Upton Hall in 1963. At present, Albright Hall is occupied by the music department.

BACON HALL — One of the Four original buildings erected on the new campus in 1928, this building was dedicated to the memory of Gertrude M. Bacon, (1866-1937) who served the college for more than fifty years as critic teacher, principal of the School of Practice, head of the critic and methods teachers, superintendent of practice teaching and as professor of elementary education.

Bacon Hall, originally the Practice School of the State College for Teachers and later called the Campus School, was well known for the fine work done in observation and practice teaching. The building was dedicated to Gertrude M. Bacon during the Special Dedication Week in 1963. In 1967, a five-year renovation project began in the hall. The building was designed for the use of the Professional Studies Division.

BISHOP HALL — This building opened in September, 1959, as the first all-male dormitory established

on campus. It was dedicated in 1963 to the memory of Irving Prescott Bishop (1849-1913), a popular science teacher.

CASSETY HALL — The cornerstone for this building was laid in 1949. It was originally North Hall and was the first permanent dormitory on campus, replacing Pioneer Hall, a 2-year temporary dorm. In stant generosity, the pupils dubbed 1963, it was dedicated to the memory of Louise M. Cassety (1873-1931).

Miss Cassety was the daughter of Dr. James M. Cassety; scholar, teacher and principal of the Buffalo Normal School 1886-1909.

She directed the Kindergarten-Primary Training Department from 1922-1927. She also helped advance the education program from a 2-year to a 3-year program.

nutrition and food science, environmental and consumer studies, and human development, family, and community relations; and II. Vocational Technical Education. These divisions had been housed in Ketchum Hall previously.

The structure is dedicated to Myrtle Viola Caudell (1878-1963), who served for nineteen years as director of the home economics department of the Normal School and the College of Education, from 1919-1938.

CHASE HALL - Once known as South Hall, it was erected at the same time as Cassety Hall, and used as a dormitory. The building was dedicated to Susan Frances Chase, who was born in Shanghai, China, of missionary parents.

Miss Chase was a member of the staff of the Buffalo Normal School from 1899 until she retired in 1926. She was noted as a woman of culture, wisdom, and integrity, teaching the General Elementary curriculum.

GROVER CLEVELAND HALL This administration and student service building is named after Grover Cleveland (1837-1908) who was not only a member of the first Board of Directors (1870), a lawyer, assistant district attorney (1863), and Sheriff of Erie County (1870), he was also the 22nd and 24th President of

KETCHUM HALL — This was one of the four original buildings erected on the Elmwood campus. Now a general classroom building, it was dedicated to the memory of Jesse Ketchum (1782-1867) who was never on the staff of the college, nor a member of the Board of Directors or an administrator. He was merely a citizen who enthusiastically supported education in the Buffalo area. It was because of his donation of a "hay field" that the very first Normal School was able to be erected.


MOOT HALL — The dining hall was dedicated in 1963 to Adelbert Moot (1854-1929). Adelbert Moot was a leader of the state bar, Vice-Chancellor of the State Board of Regents and an active leader in Buffalo civic affairs.

It was through Mr. Moot's influence that the home economics department was placed on a four-year basis and the school became a college instead of a normal school.

ROCKWELL HALL — Rockwell Hall was one of the first four original

new campus structures in 1928, and it was referred to as the administration building. The building was dedicated to the memory of the man who was the president of the college at that time, Dr. Harry Westcott Rockwell (1882-1961). Because of his foresight and deep personal interest, the college enjoyed great growth and development.

Through Dr. Rockwell, Buffalo State was the first of the state institutions to have a dormitory, to erect a separate library building, to be the first New York State operated teachers college to offer a bachelor of science degree in elementary education, and to have a masters program in 1945.

UPTON HALL — The Industrial and Fine Arts complex was dedicated to Daniel Sherman Upton (1864-1918), who was the third principal of the State Normal School and was a promoter of industrial arts education.

The building was occupied in 1962. One unique facet of the building is the technical areas common to both the art and industrial arts, to be found across the hall from each other, thus complementing the value of each discipline.

WEIGEL HEALTH CENTER — In the early days of the college, the medical facilities were one nurse in a room. Because of the tremendous growth of this learning institution over the years, and the increased trauma that lone nurse suffered at the hands of the expanding enrollment, a new health center was built. It is dedicated to the memory of Dr. Paul J. Weigel (1912-1969), who was Director of Student Health Services at the college from 1966 to 1969.

The center is a two-story structure with 41 rooms. It also includes five examining rooms, an emergency room, pharmacy, laboratory, allergy room, isolation rooms, a large waiting room and offices.



With its enrollment constantly increasing, the Normal School began a series of expansions that continues throughout the history of the College. In 1888, a 90 foot square, threestory science building was completed 40 feet north of the main building. The only way you could get into the building was by crossing a bridge that connected the second floors of



> On June 24, 1926, the Board of Regents authorized the Normal School to grant the degree of Bachelor of Science in Education and approved the tentative courses for the fourth year. With this action the Normal School was placed on a collegiate ba-

sis. This event is probably the most important in the history of the school and represented the results of untiring efforts on the part of Edward H. Butler, the Board of Managers, and Adelbert Moot, vice-chancellor of the Board of Regents. In 1926, still further advancement in the work of the school was brought about. Six head professors were added at one time, thus enabling the offering of a larger field of electives with majors and minors.

On May 27, 1927, the State Board of Regents changed the name of the Buffalo State Normal School to that of the State Teachers College at Buffalo. On March 9, 1928, the Legislature passed a bill giving the right to the legal title of New York State College for Teachers at Buffalo. This action gave the College the same Faculty classification and salary schedule as that of the Albany State Teachers College.

On October 9, 1929, Edward H. Butler, Jr., using the same trowel which his father had employed in 1913, laid the cornerstone of the main College building on Elmwood Avenue.

On January 12, 1931, the students of the State Teachers College at Buffalo started off the second half of their school year with a boisterous parade from the old building to the new Campus on Elmwood.

The College received many letters of congratulations and greetings from numerous friends in high places, including Franklin D. Roosevelt, Governor of New York:

The future of the State Teachers College at Buffalo, equipped now to meet the expanding educational requirements of the Buffalo area, is indeed bright. The possibilities before the institution cannot be gauged with the measuring rod of the past. Prophetic vision would be requisite even to venture approximate conjecture of its attainments in the years to come. Glorious as its past has been, its future promises to outshine the splendor of years gone by.

There are a number of things that can be said about what happened in 1931-32 and in 1981-82. However, there's not a lot of room in which to be comprehensive about it. So, what follows is a collection of bits and pieces of information, chosen rather arbitrarily, that will hopefully satisfy the nostalgic urge.

• "It was a good omen, when in September, over one hundred people registered in the Senior class, making it the largest in the history of the school. With Arthur York's being elected president, everyone had hopes, for the class had recognized ability, in spite of the fact that it was well disguised."



He won the fight on budget cuts, hacking \$50.5 billion from the \$739.3 billion budget that the Carter Administration proposed to spend in fiscal 1982. Military spending was increased, while education funds, various welfare programs, energy projects and transportation supports were decreased (which worried those involved with Buffalo's Rapid Transit construction). Prince Charles of Wales and Lady Diana Spencer got married, amidst rioting in other parts of England by hundreds of unemployed youths. Later on in the year, Lady Di announced her pregnancy. The couple appears to be getting along winningly.

Where did you say you went? In its 110 year history, our college has undergone a lot of transformation, not only with its curriculum and campus, but also in its name. What changes through the years, taken a college campus to the outside from the commencement programs:





follows is a sampling of those little building visually, setting the mood of world. It has become an architectural logo for the school. Unfortunately, since the mid 60's, it hasn't been really complete. In 1931, chimes were installed in the tower and they began ringing on Friday, March 27 of that year to mark the opening of an Intercollegiate Student Conference. There were four bells in the tower; each struck a note from the major scale, C, D, E, and G. The bells rang every quarter hour. First four notes were struck; then eight on the half hour: 12 on the third quarter; and 16

notes that played an air by Handel on the hour.

The large bell that strikes the G use to hang in the old school building (now Grover Cleveland High School). It was the gift of Mrs. Robert Livingston Fryer, in honor of her husband, who for many years was president of the Board of Managers.

The graduating class of 1930 supplied the bell striking the E note. It bears the inscription: "Presented by the class of 1930."



Good morning. Yeah, right ... without my TV dinner?



You have a dream and you want to transform it into reality. This is the way to do it and no obstacles are going to get in your way.



Well, he finally did receive a vision. We were waiting for him in a dark




Well. That was it, huh? We talked it over and all we could decide was that perhaps it was a vision of what gene splicing could bring us one day: **Designer** People?




Weightlifting & Fitness Club

- 1. The State University College at Buffalo Archives is established to serve as a depository for the archival and historical materials of this college center. The archives are to be located in the College Library to provide easy access to library facilities and photocopying services for the convenience of researchers.
- 2. The archivist is appointed to collect, organize, maintain, and service the SUCB Archives. He is a member of the College Library staff and is responsible to the Head of Readers' Services and for making periodic reports to him.
- 3. Provision is made in the College Library budget for personnel assistance, supplies, and equipment for the SUCB Archives.
- 4. The SUCB Archives is a non-current collection of the following types of materials, as released to the Archives:
 - a. SUCB minutes and records of the College Board of Trustees.
 - b. SUCB minutes and records of the several faculties and committees of the College, as published and distributed,
 - c. SUCB official reports, periodic and special,
 - d. SUCB administrative records including management and planning, instructional, student, fiscal, personnel, plant and research records of this college center, as released to

- An advisory Archives Committee 8 will be appointed by the President. This Committee in consultation with the Archivist will consider what is to be accepted and retained in the Archives collection.





Hube Coyer ran the show there from 1932 to 1952 as he overlooked the growth of Buffalo State athletics. Then the "New Gym" was built in 1962 and Hube moved with the rest of the Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Athletics faculty to the rear of the campus. The Old Gym housed various and sundry other college departments until it recently became the Research and Development Complex still a building without athletes continued to operate from an

a real name. Hube remained on as Associate Professor in Health Education after having vacated his Athletic Directorship, basketball and soccer coaching duties in 1952. He reached the mandatory retirement age of 70 in 1963 and moved to Florida. The New Gym was still called just the "New Gym" and, despite some 20 years of aging, continues to retain that laughable monicker in 1981. Hube would have made light of the whole thing in his inimitable way.

For the next 16 years, Buffalo State

In field events: Linda Smith in the javelin, Chris Humphrey in the shotput, and Chris Wildman in the discus.



The Lady Bengals also finished 1st in the Brockport Tournament, 2nd in the Big 4 Tourney, and 5th in the Mansfield Tournament.



"The expansion of the College from a registration of two hundred seventy-five in 1919 to one thousand, one hundred and fifty in 1930, and a relative increase in the number of faculty, marks the amazing growth in the services of the College. A director of training and two associates, increasing the practice of teaching facilities, a department for the training of elementary principals, two new salary schedules, recognition of the degree of the College by several of the larger universities, and the appointment of a Dean Committee are but a few other splendid developments that took place on the Jersey Street campus during this period." -1931 Elms Yearbook

When Buffalo State College moved to its present Elmwood Avenue location, it reflected an understanding of the needs of an increasing student body and administration. In keeping with the reputation it established for growth and expansion at its previous residence, the College continued to mature and gradually stretch out its collegiate limbs since its 1931 relocation.

In 1973, the college was presented with a new administration building. It houses not only the President of the College, the Registrar, and the Bursar, but also the Office of Special Programs, which promotes study in foreign countries, Placement Services, which counsels students about employment after graduation, and the College News Service, which keeps people informed about current events and happenings concerning the Buffalo State campus.

In all, the administration has expanded and grown along with the students, and hopefully will continue to change with the students' needs, for they are the future, and will keep Buffalo State College going for another 50 years.
