

for Amil Ali la: the may ver man pro ext	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A nice example of vernacular rm of the Craftsman style. Greenfield Street extends from herst Street to Main Street, paralleling the Belt Line Railroad. though Greenfield Street was deeded to the city in 1889, it was id out in 1886 by the Parkside Land Company, which had purchased a land between Amherst Street and West Oakwood Place from two jor landowners, Elam R. Jewett and Washington Russell. A street ry similar in configuration appears in Olmsted's early 1870's ps of "The Parkside." Greenfield follows Olmsted's plan for oviding easy access to major streets while being too narrow for tensive commercial development, although some commercial ildings can be found near Main Street.
