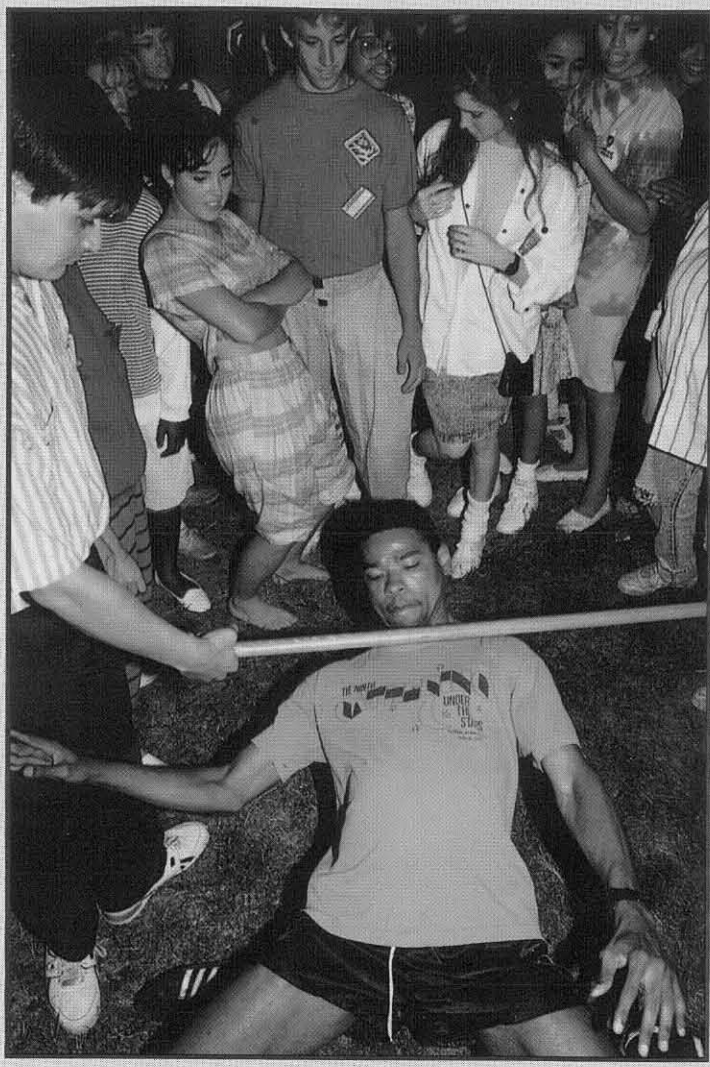


# GO AHEAD

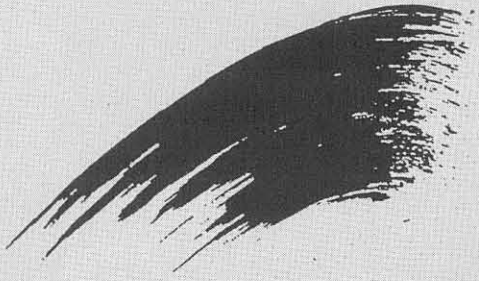

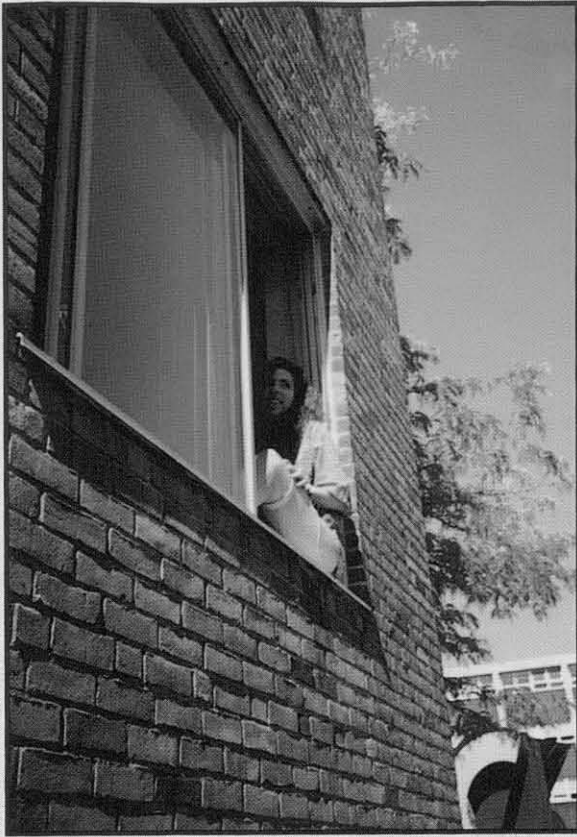
Student Accounts offices, not to mention trying to find a parking spot somewhere near campus. But, these things are just a small part of life at Buffalo State.

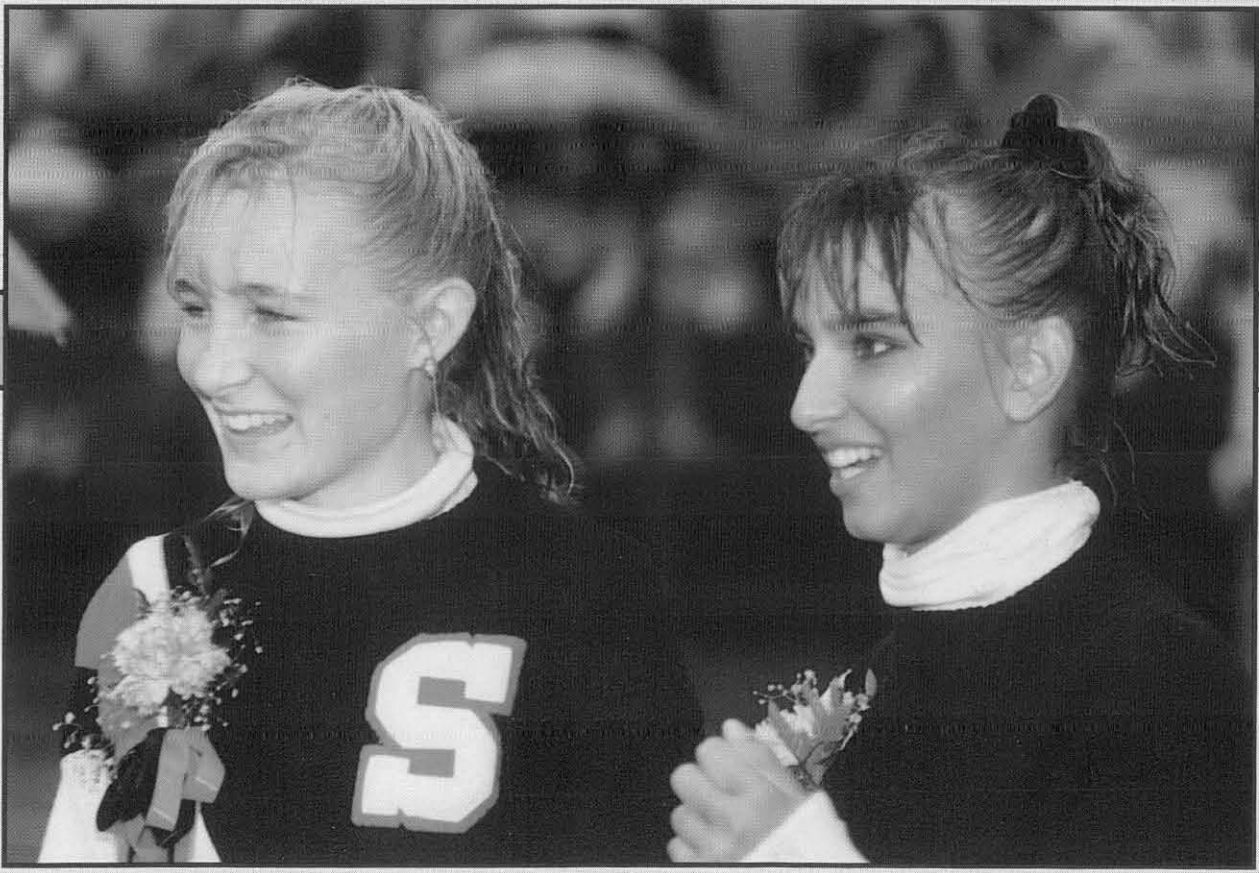


# HOMECOMING FOOTBALL

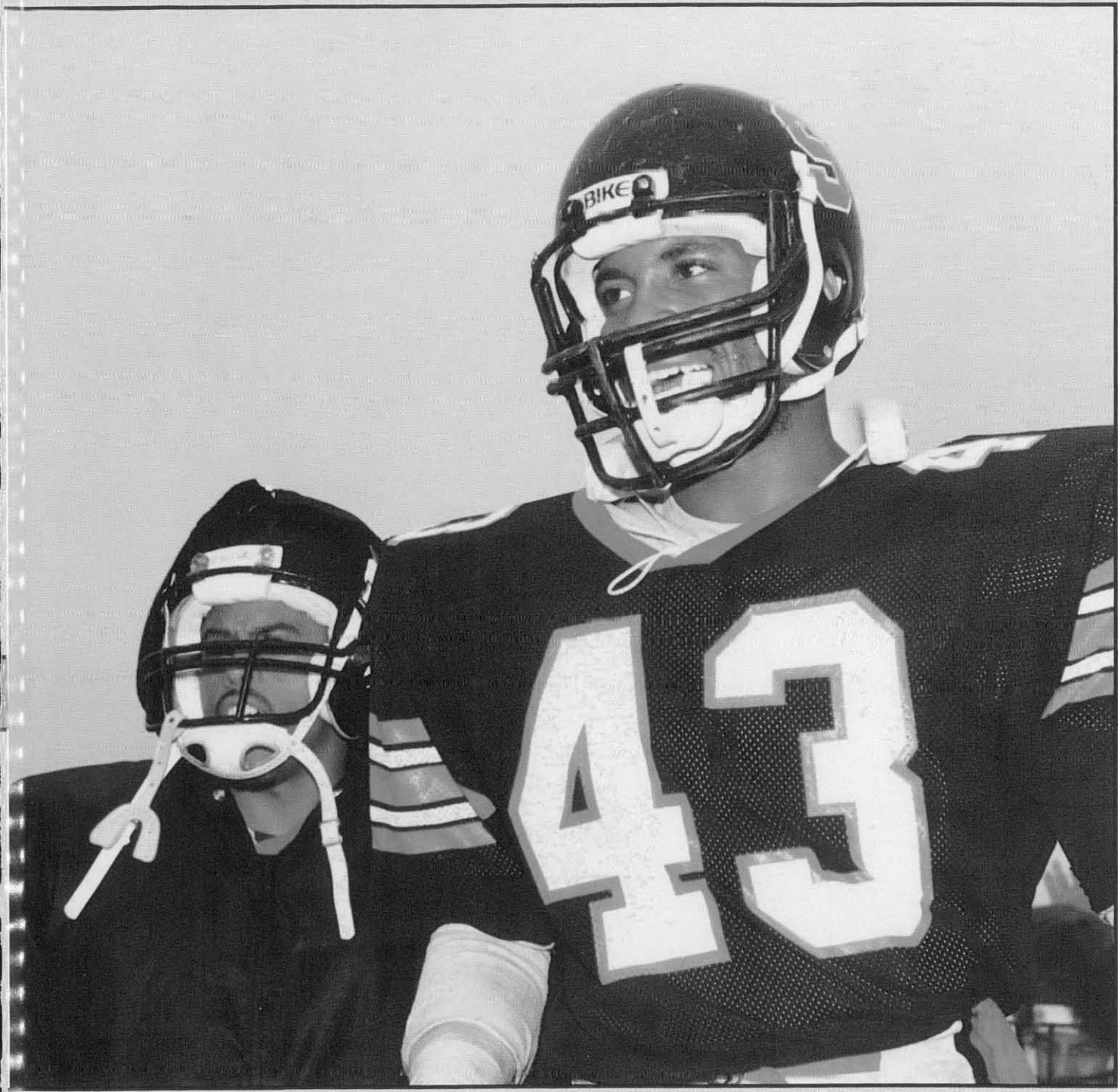

# Adjusting To Changes

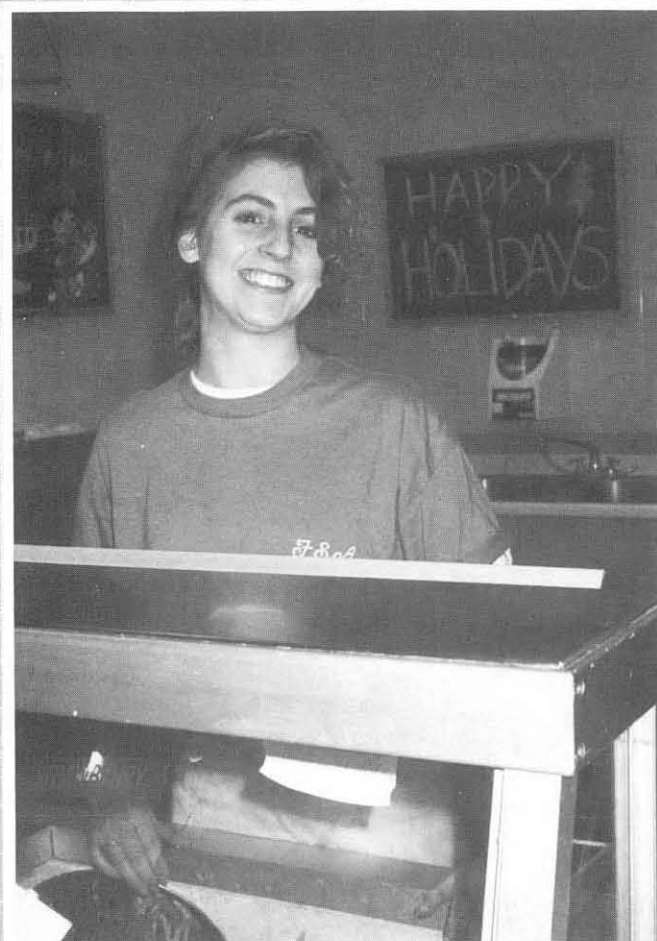
When students first arrive at college there are many changes to become accustomed to. It is their first test of adulthood, being faced with so many new faces and situations and having to cope with all the pressures of school.

Secondly, there is the roommate situation: it can be very difficult to be put in a room with someone you barely know much less be asked to live with them.

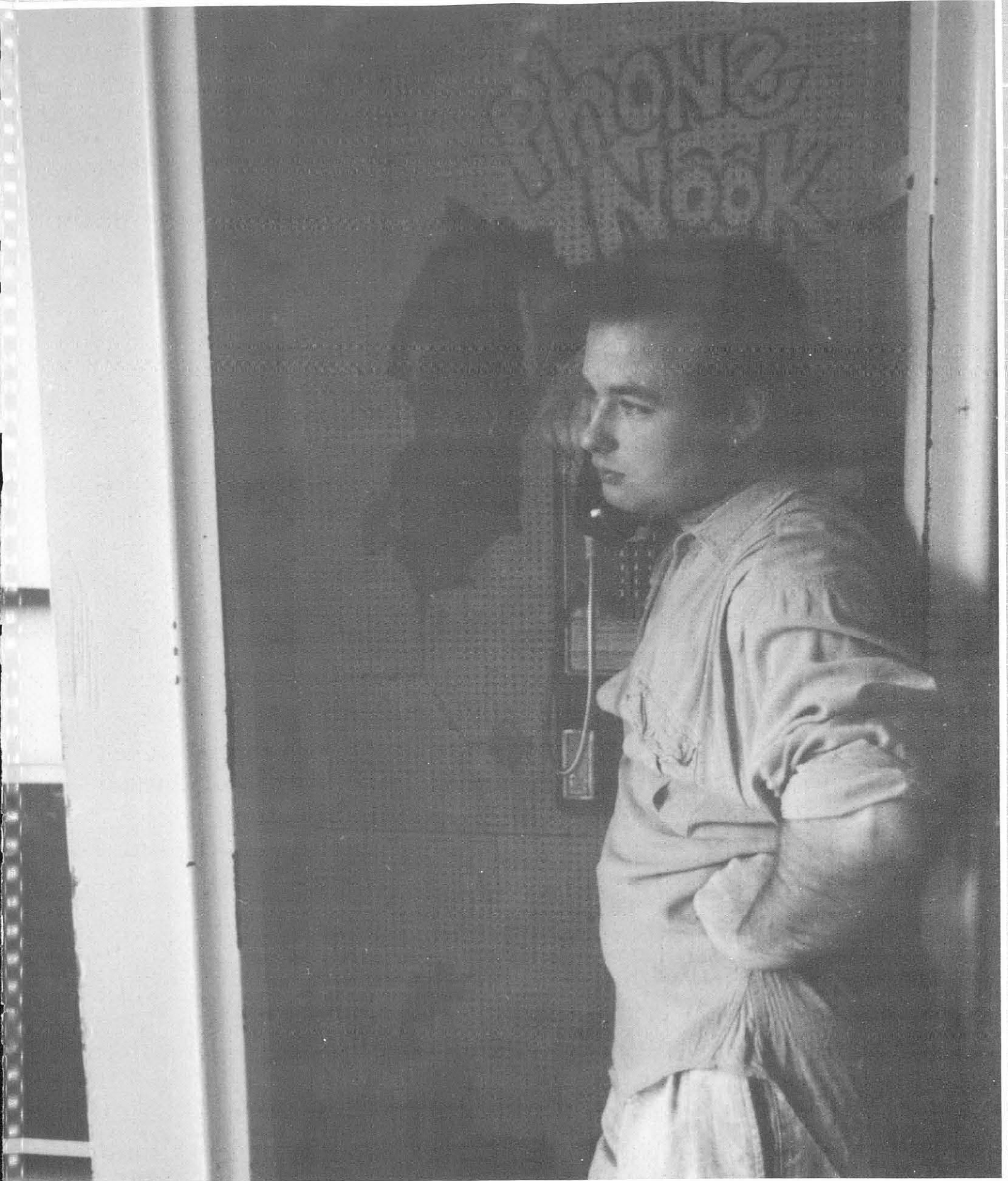
Then there is the major adjustment: classes. It can be such a radical change to come from a high school where your teachers hunt you down for assignments to total independence and responsibility.

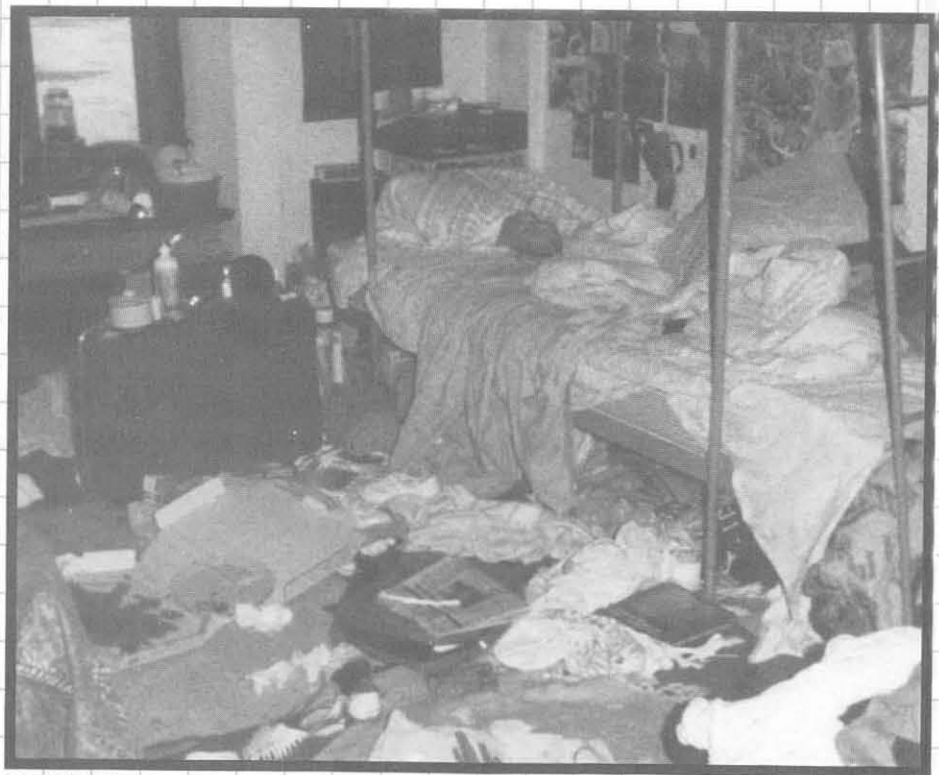
# Dorm Sweet Dorm

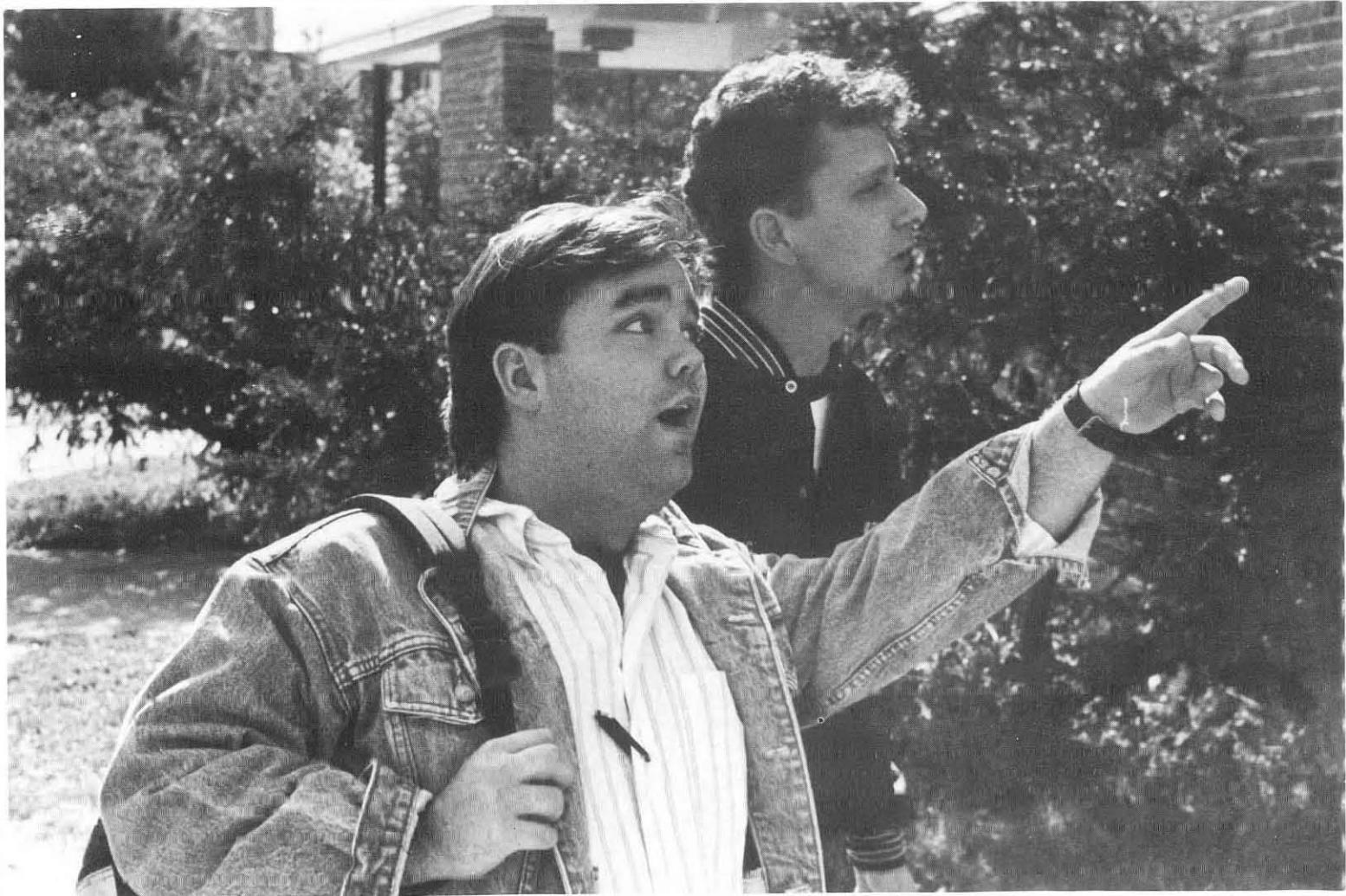
# Take In The Sights

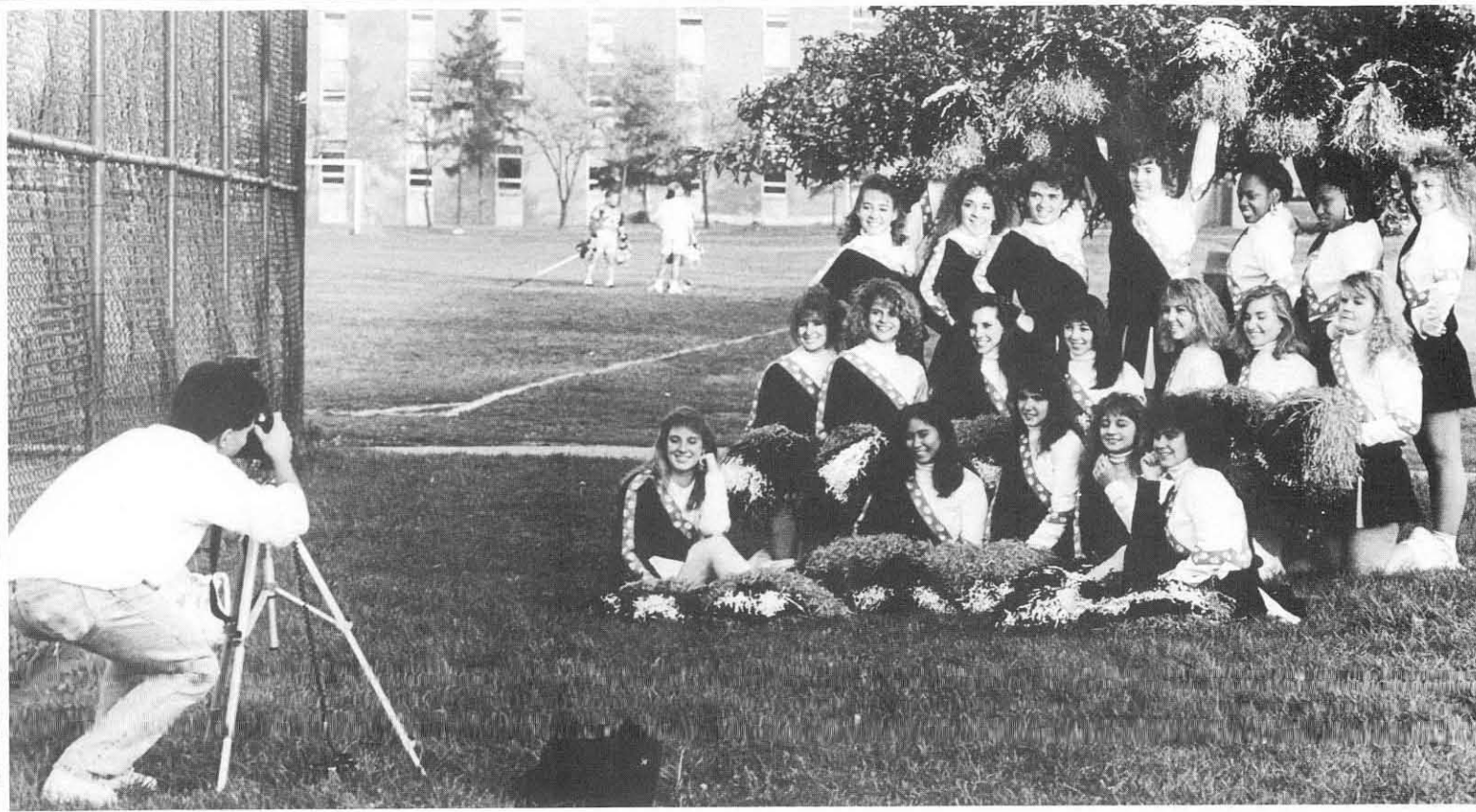
There are sights of all kinds. There is the natural beauty of nature or the natural beauty of a passerby. Buffalo State has it all so why not open your eyes and have a LOOK!

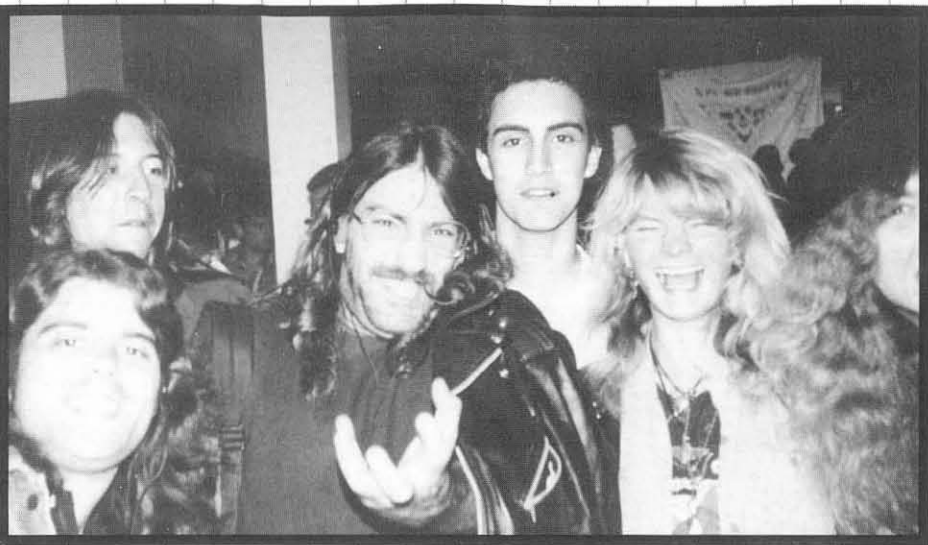

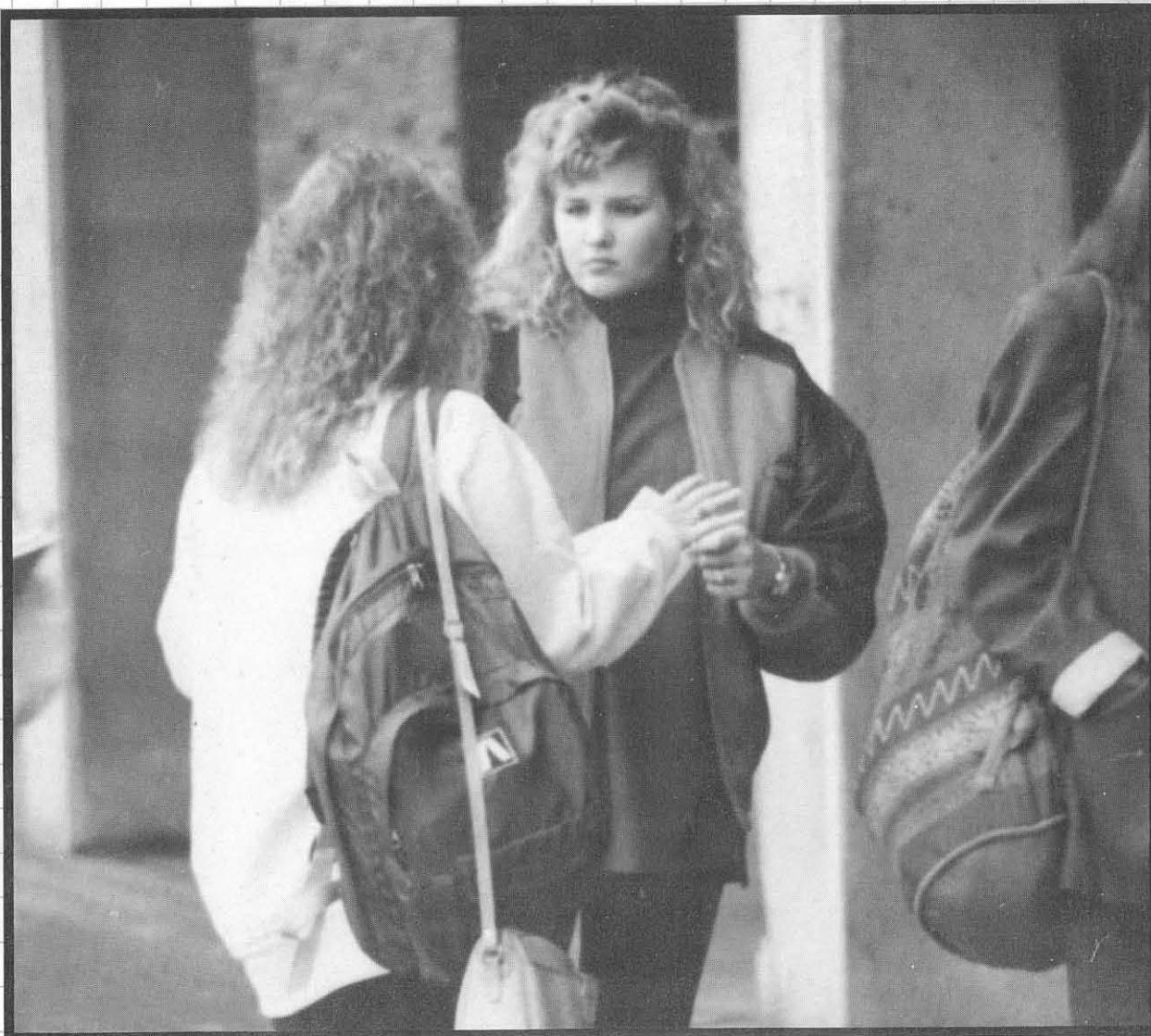

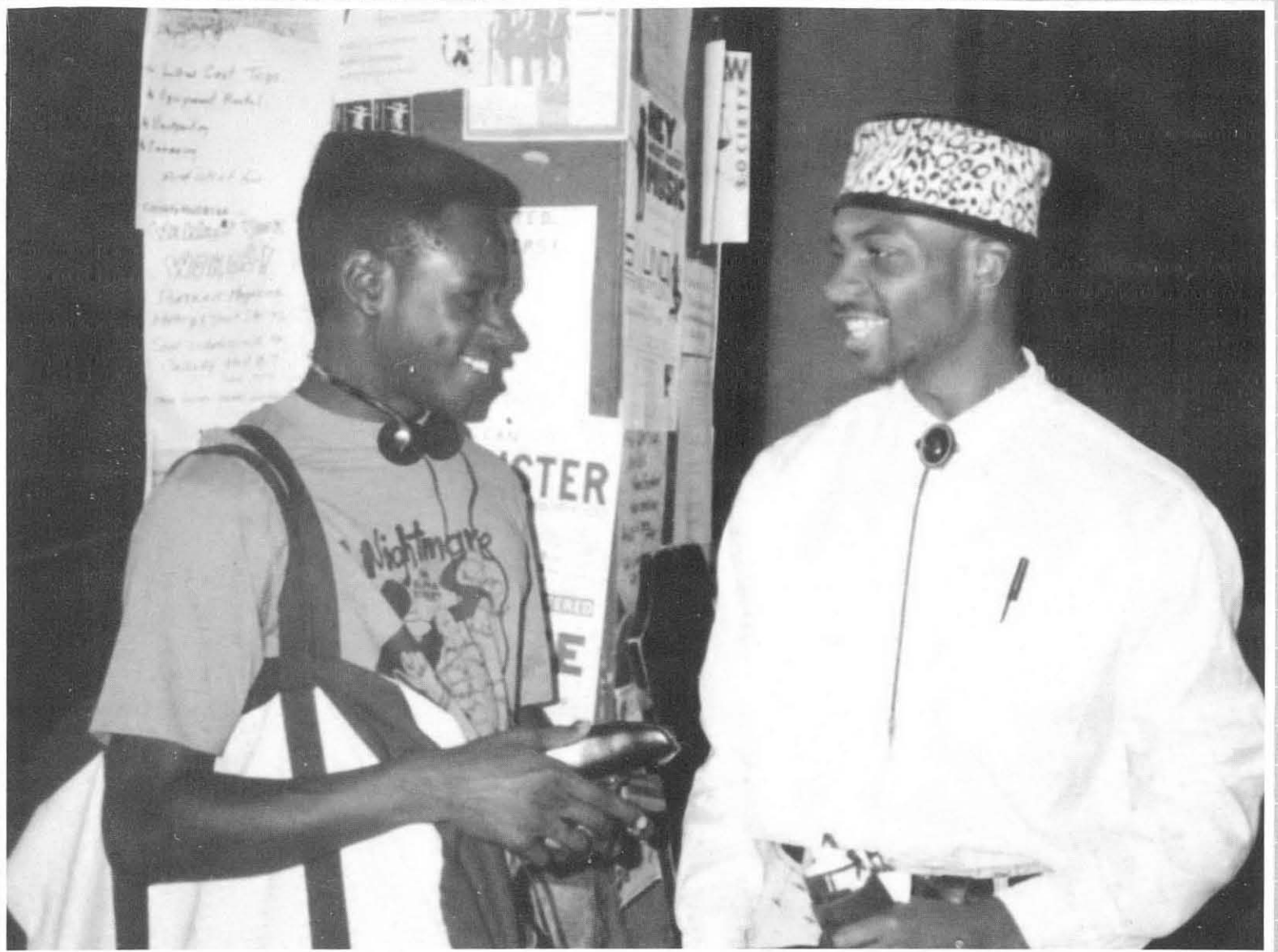
Friendships seem to arise almost instantaneously.

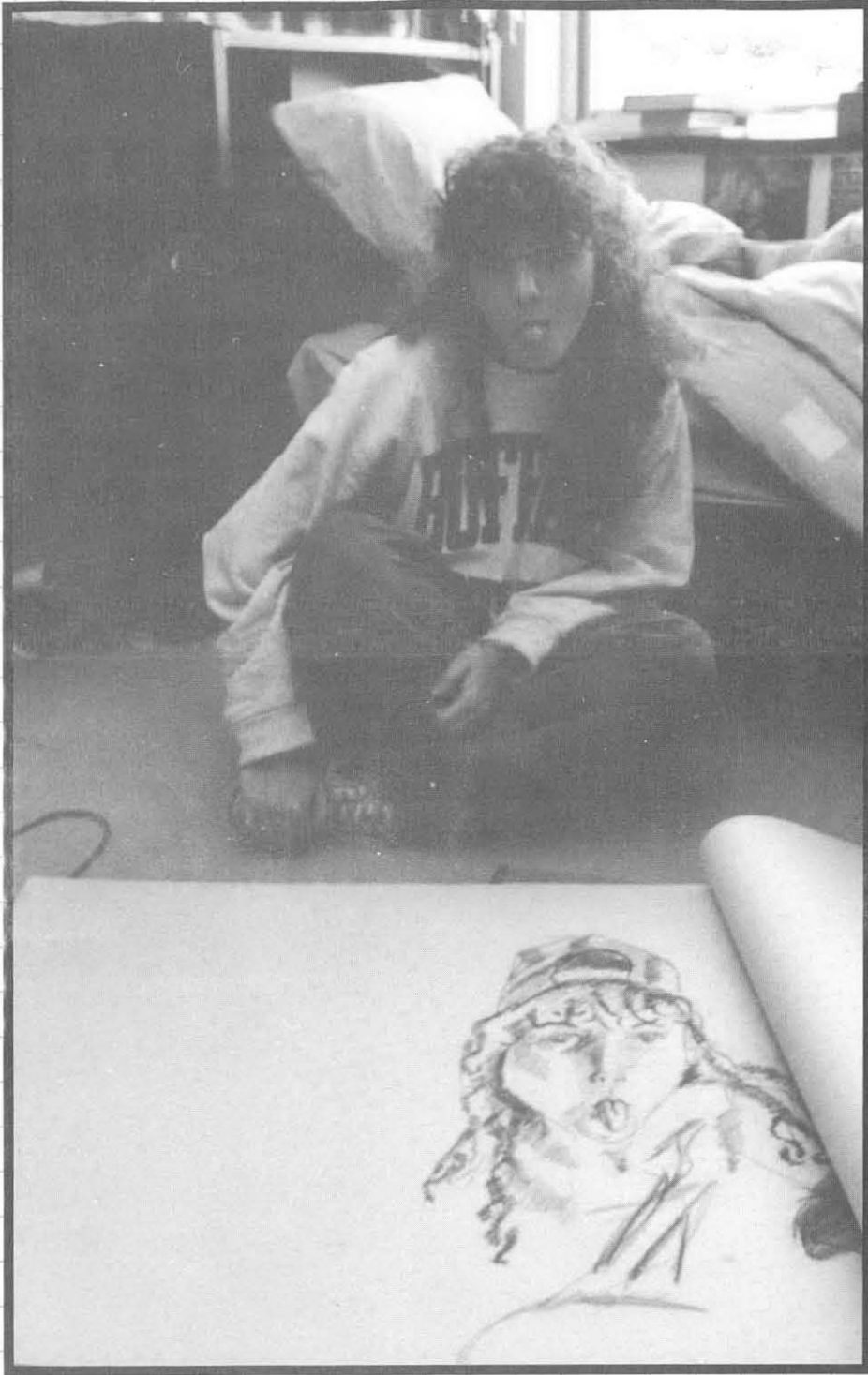

## Hitting The Books

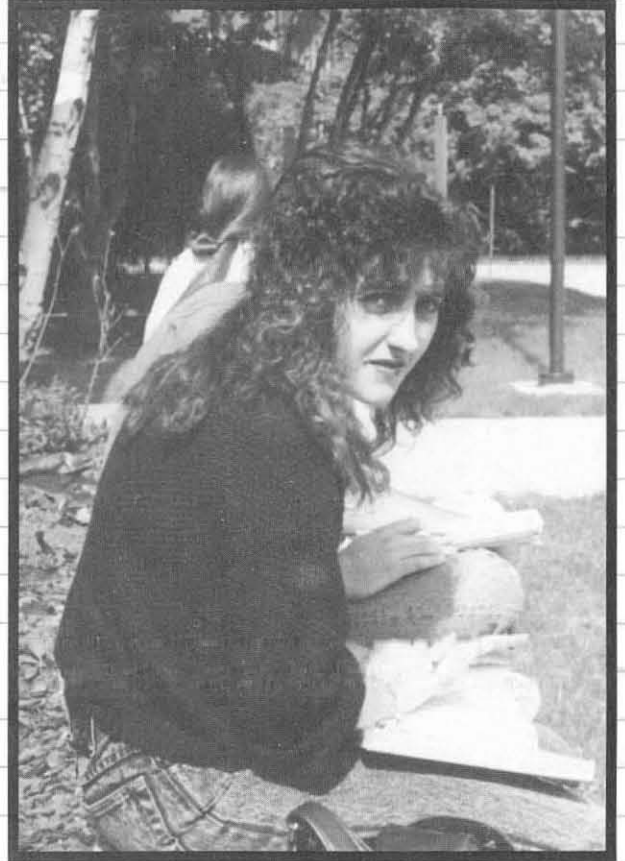

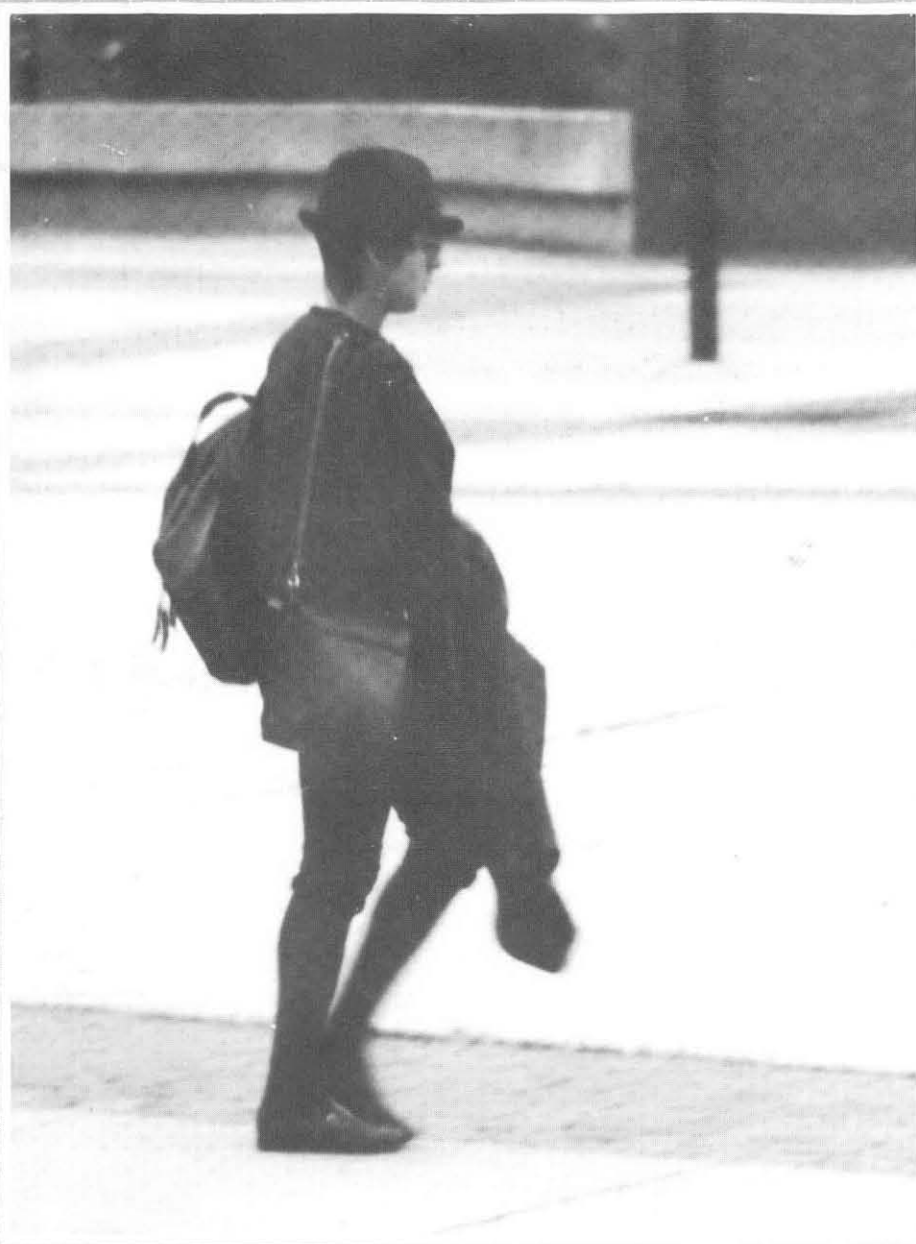


# Fashions That Catch The Eye

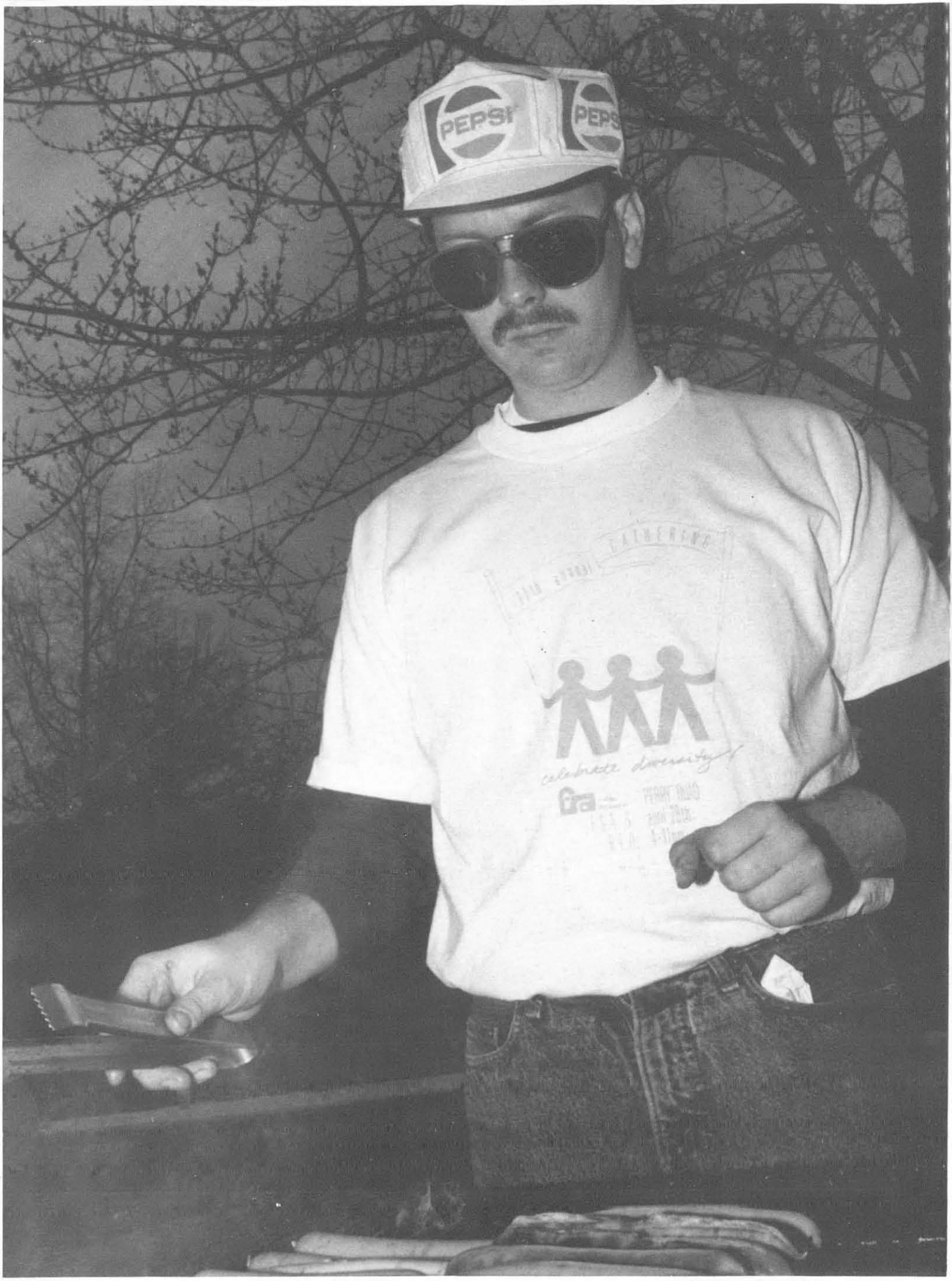

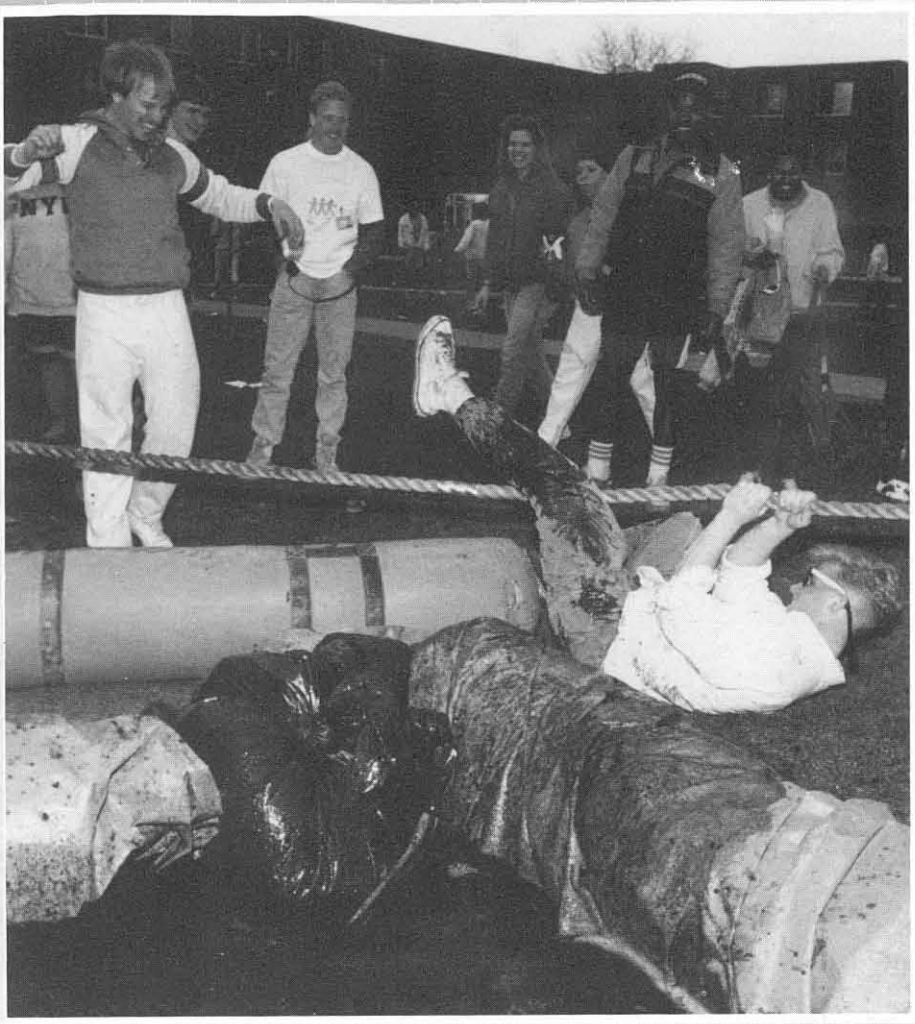

# Happenings

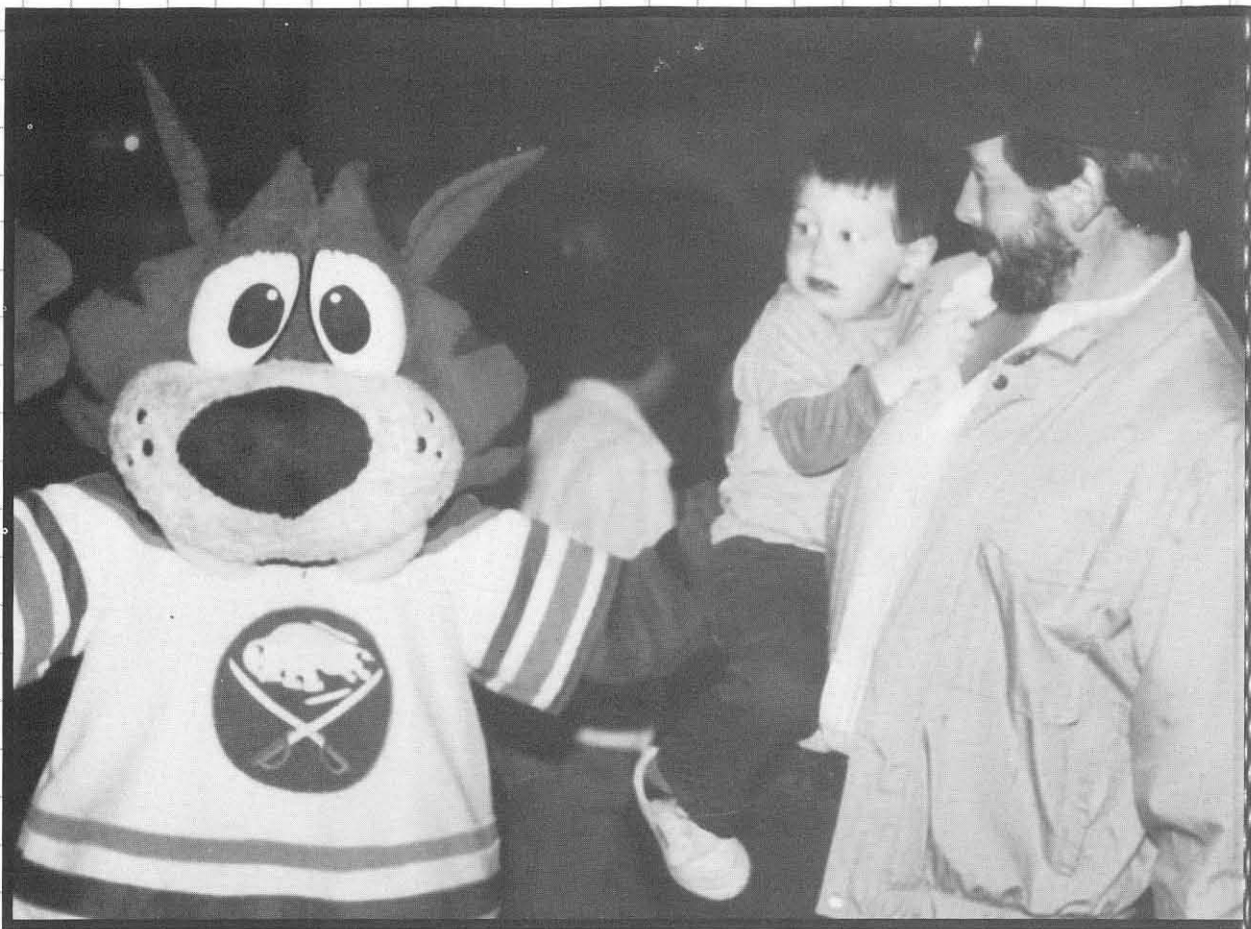

If there is excitement, enjoyment, or just plain action then there is a happening in motion. So don't just sit there try and make some happenings for yourself because they won't happen by themselves!

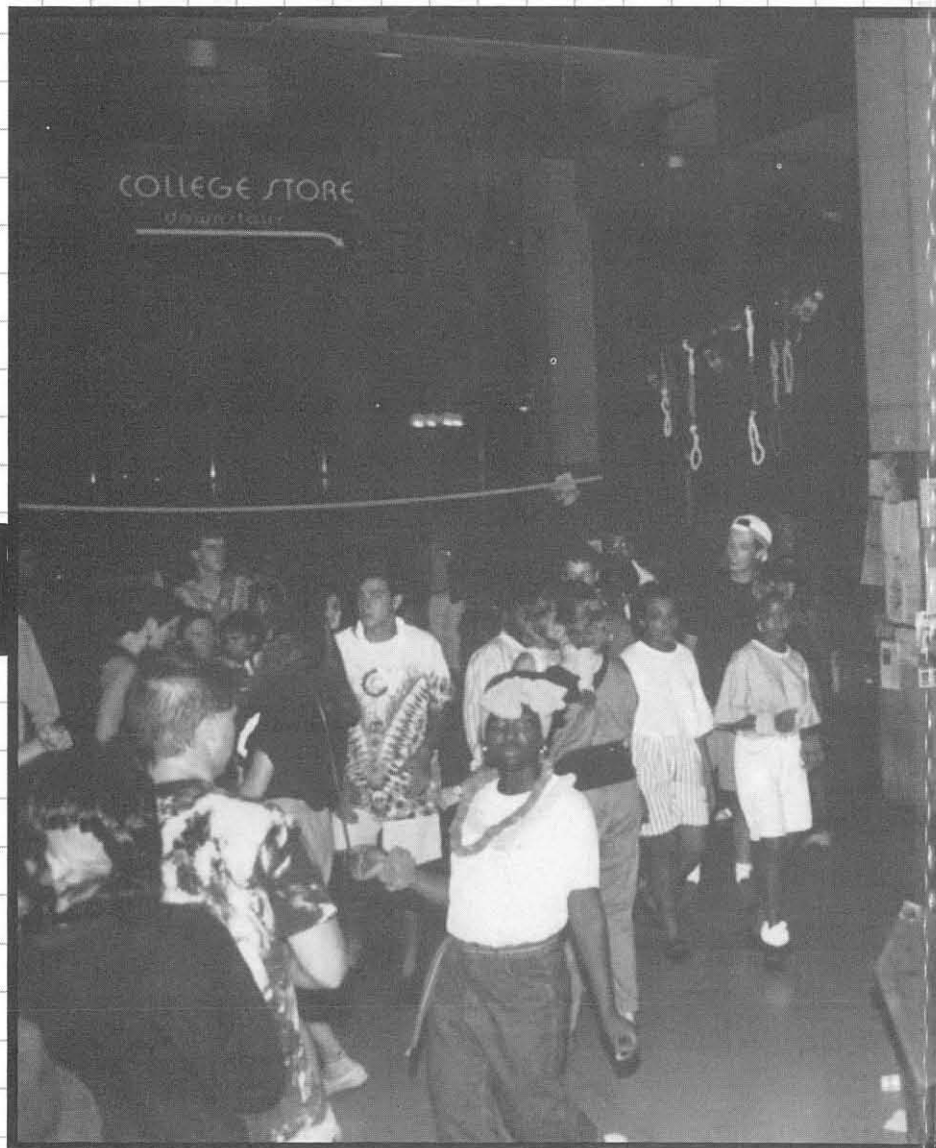

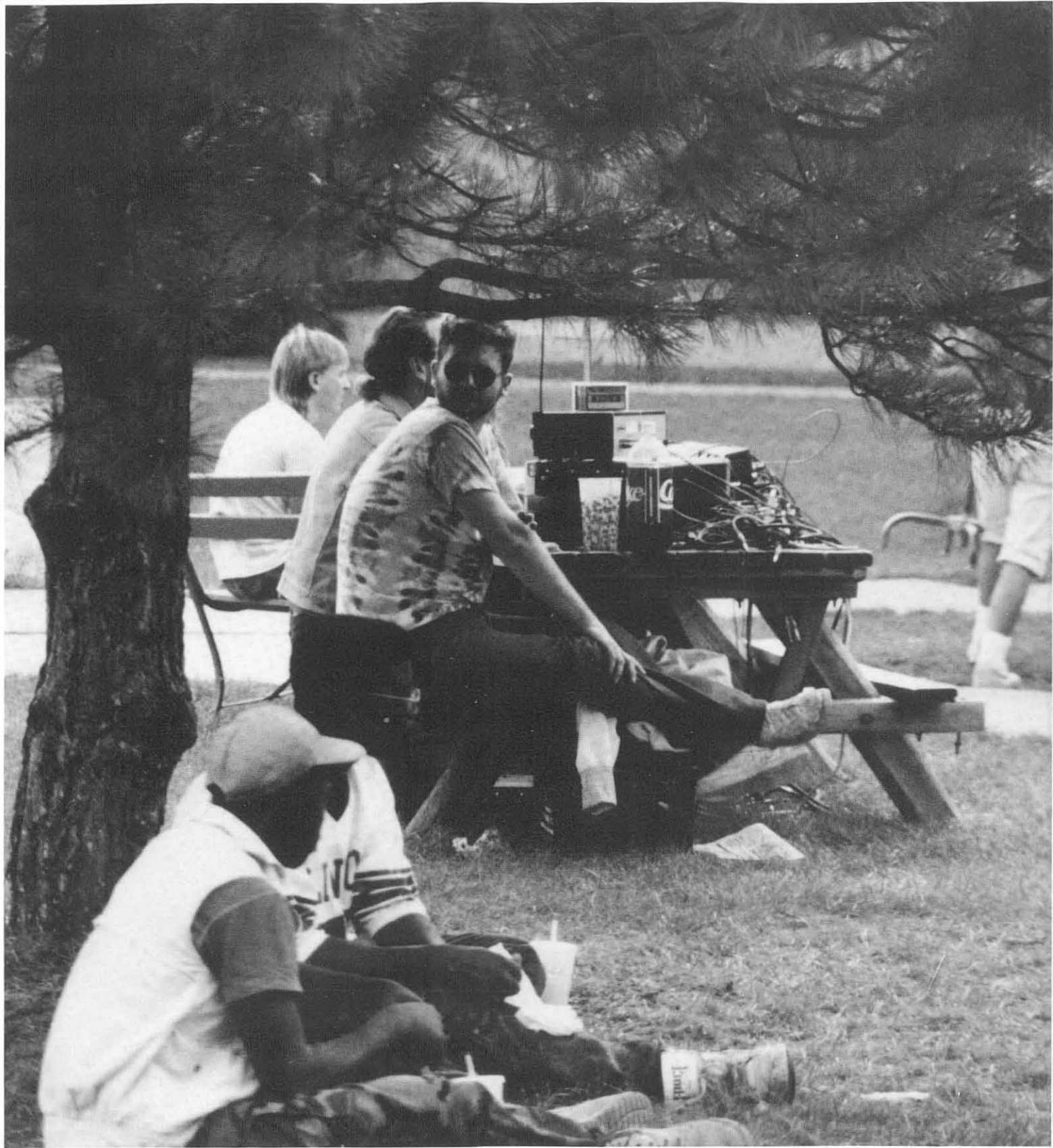

## Take A BREAK!

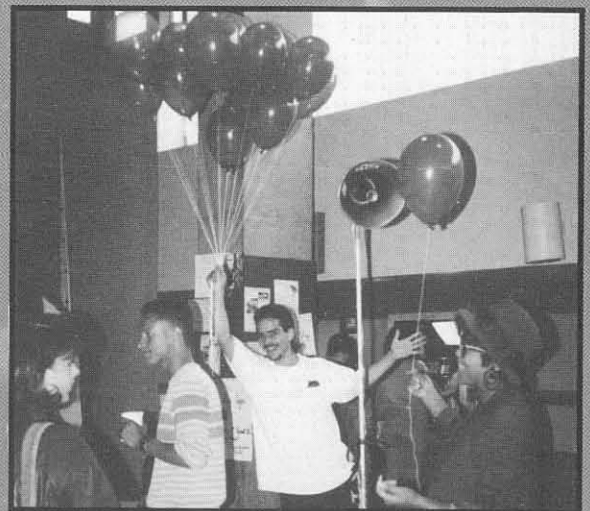

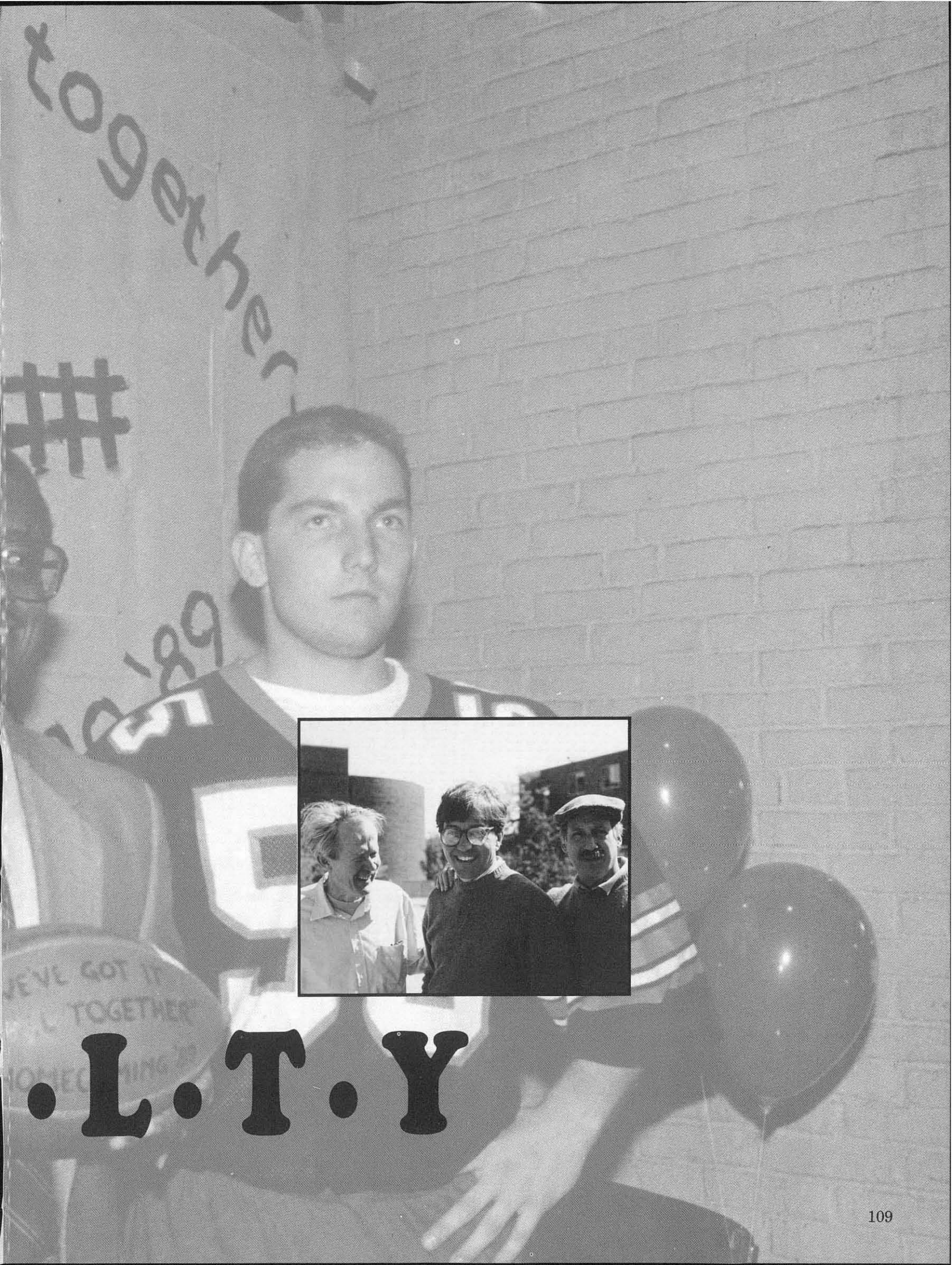
dards of academic excellence of their college or university.

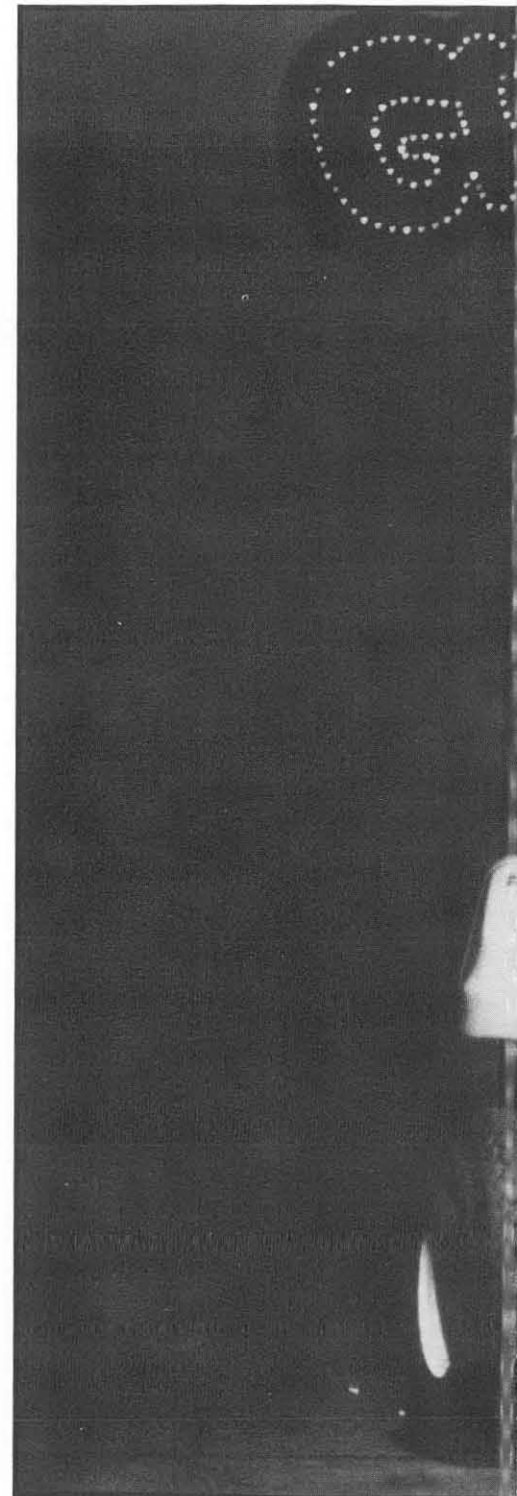
# Go Back To The Fifties

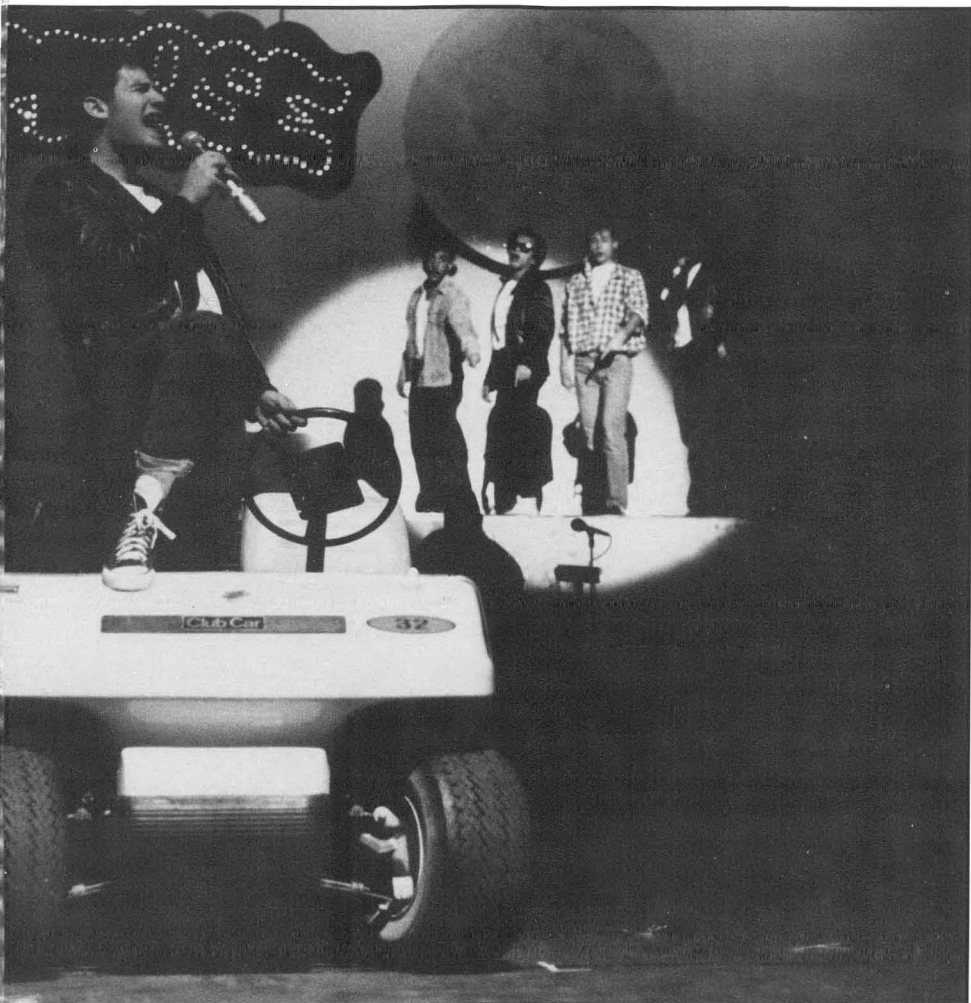

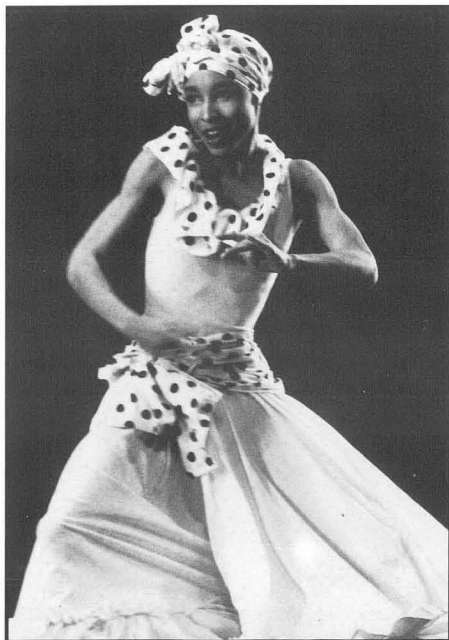
# Gemini Dance Theater

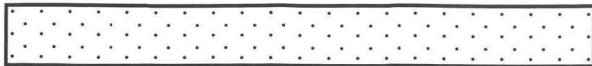
gy. The talented dancers were members of both the Gemini and Martha Graham companies of dance.

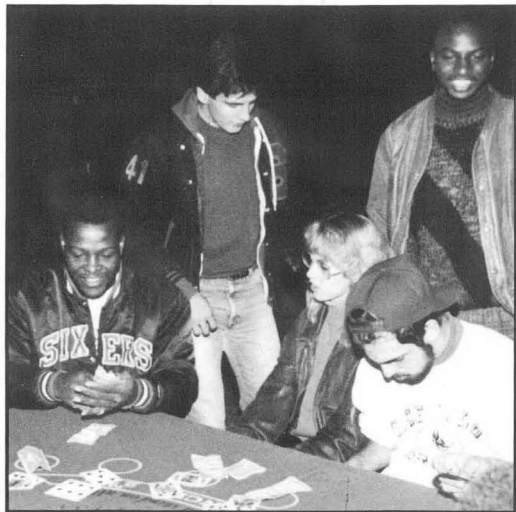

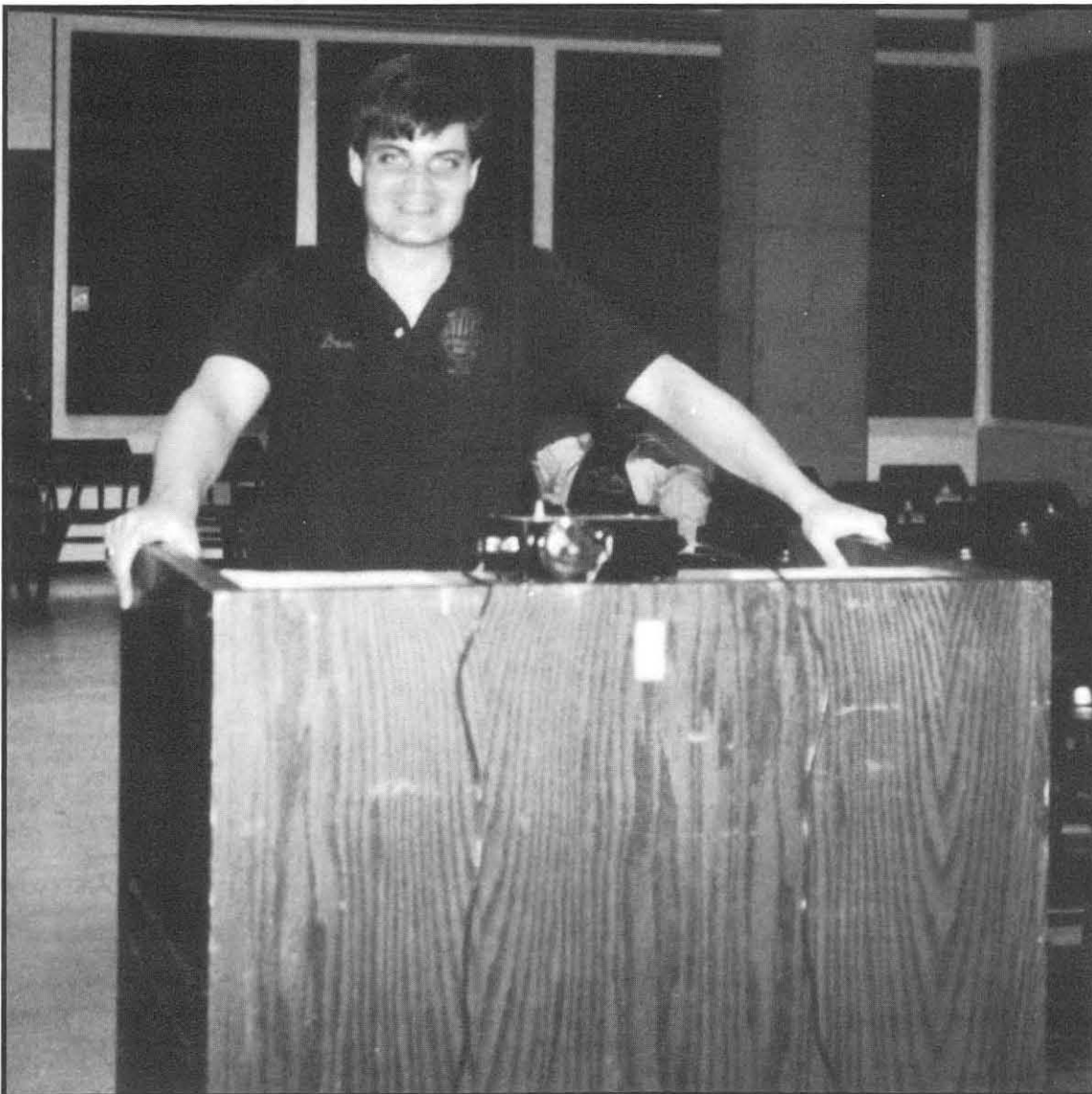
# College Bowl

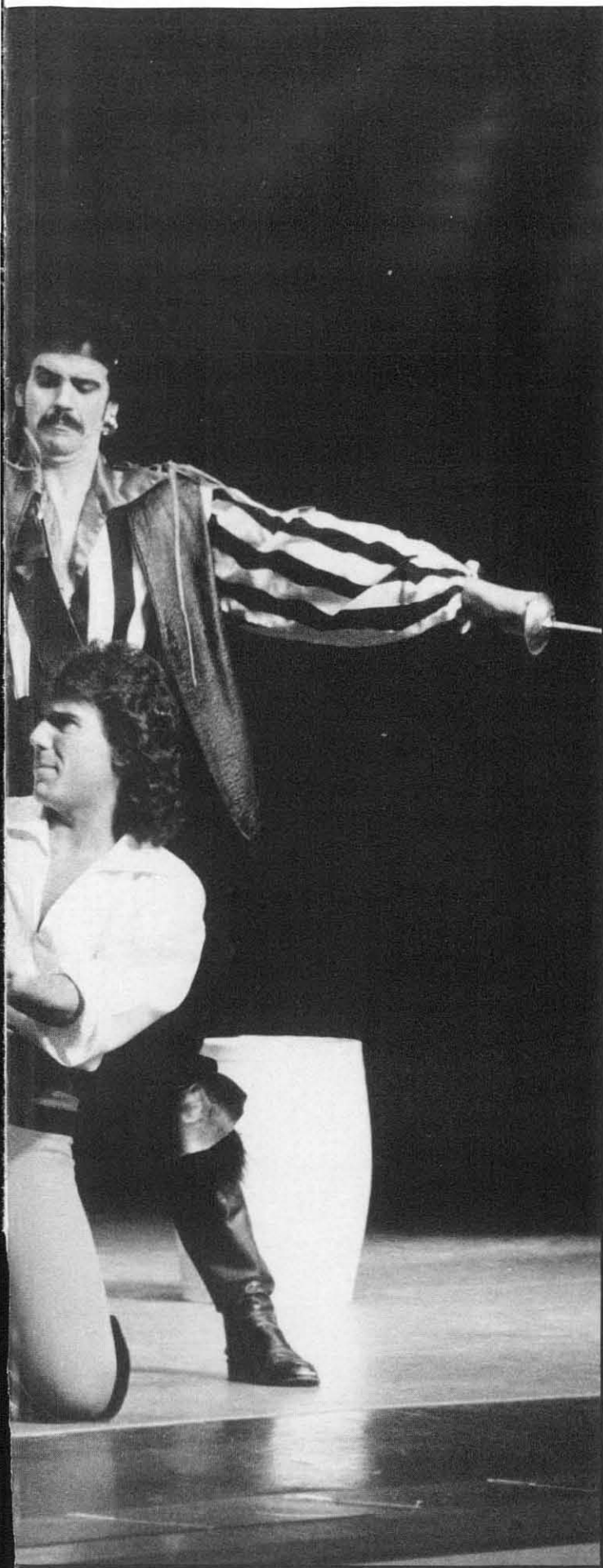

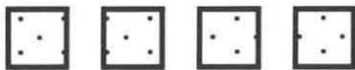

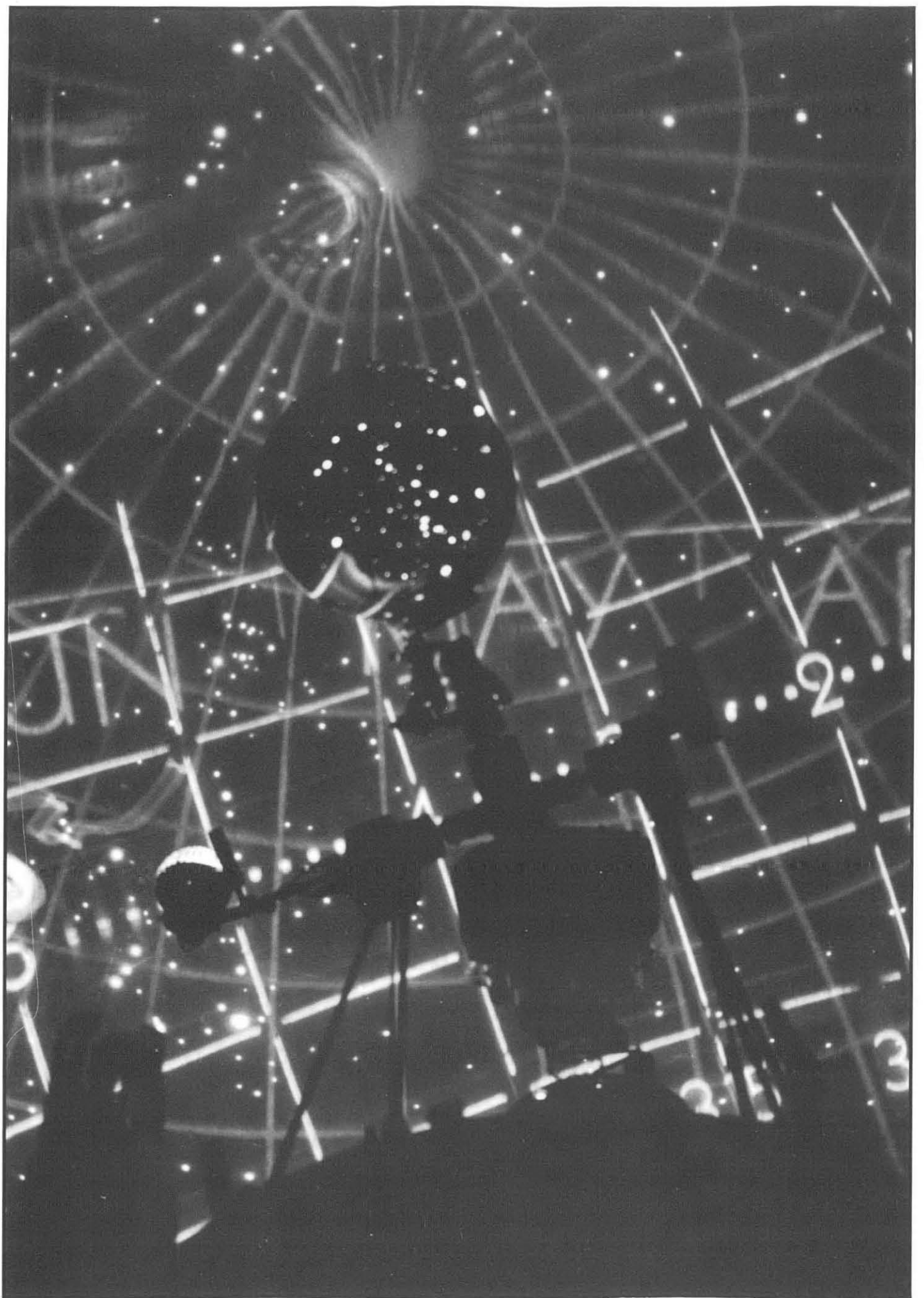
eretta leads the audience through a course of events by which Frederic resolves his problem.

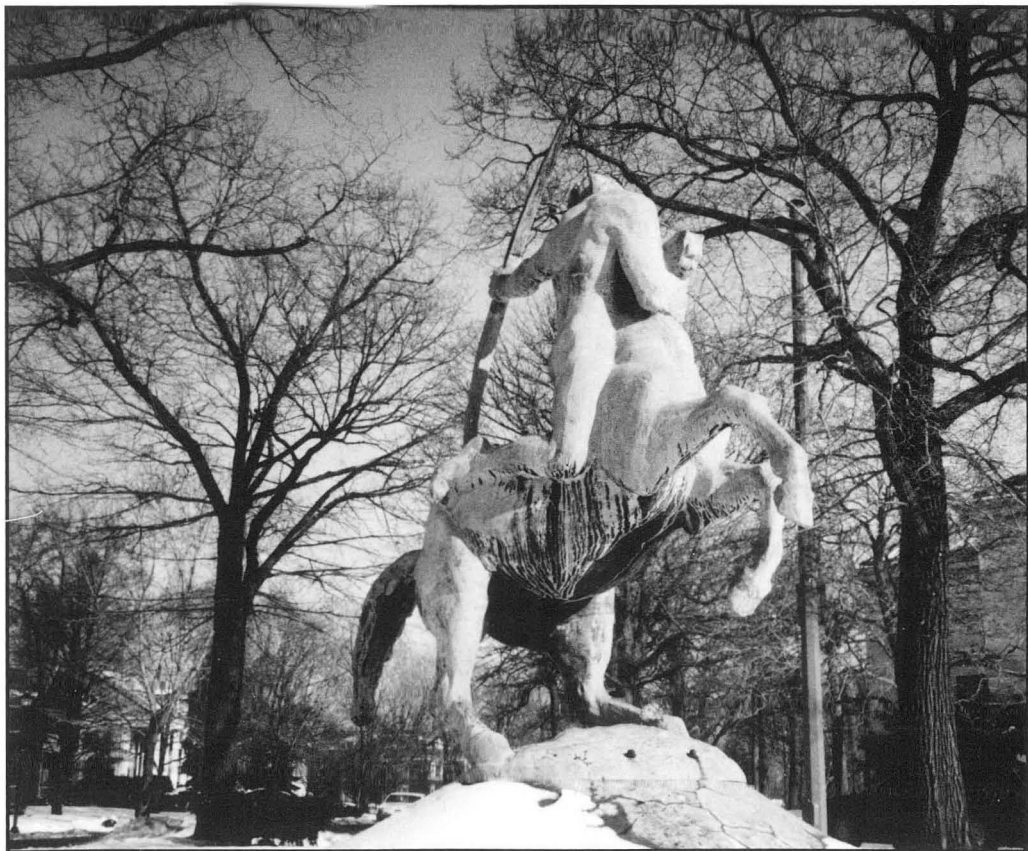
# Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society
