

ARFREDAH GAINES

April 17, 1938 ~ January 1, 2015

Arfredah Gaines was born to the late Mohammed and Aeyshaa Hakeem on April 17, 1938. She was the youngest of nine children. After a short illness, she was called to rest on Thursday, January 1, 2015 at the blessed age of 76 years old.

Arfredah attended West Valley Central School in West Valley, New York. She furthered her education at Bryant and Stratton Business Institute (now Bryant and Stratton College) in Buffalo, New York, earning a degree in Business. She became employed with the State University of New York at Buffalo where she had a long career as an Administrative Assistant.
