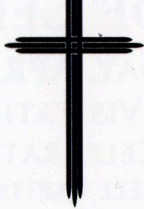

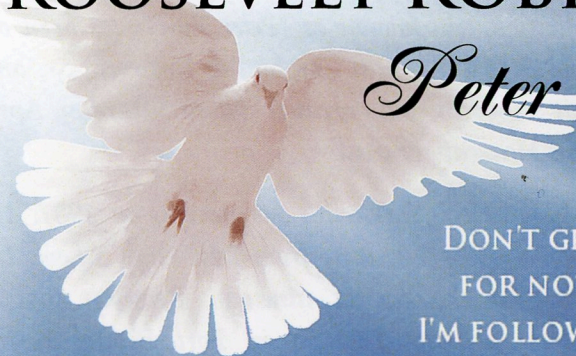

ROOSEVELT "PETER PAN" ROBINSON, JR.

JULY 24, 1948-APRIL 9, 2016

Roosevelt Robinson, Jr. affectionately known as "Peter Pan" was born on Saturday, July 24, 1948 in St. Paul, South Carolina to Roosevelt, Sr. and Bernice Robinson. Roosevelt answered God's greatest call on Saturday, April 9, 2016, transitioning to his Heavenly reward.

Roosevelt relocated to Buffalo, New York with his parents in 1957. He attended Buffalo Public School #8 graduating from East High School. He entered the Army in 1967 at the age of nineteen. Roosevelt was a Paratrooper with the 82nd Airborne Division in Fort Bragg, North Carolina and the 101 Airborne Division in Vietnam and was honorably discharged in 1970. He was employed at the Ford Stamping Plant in Lackawanna, New York.

Roosevelt joined Hopewell Baptist Church with his family and served in the choir and on the Usher Board. He joined in holy matrimony to the late Carol Daniels.
