

Building is situated on a standard sized corner lot within Olmsted's Parkside subdivision. House is located three blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and east of the Zoo.				
18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two and a half story Colonial Revival style. Side gable roof with end bargeboards and exposed rafter tails. Symmetrical facade. Pedimented gable entrance porch with square doric supports. Lighted glass door with lighted sidelights and lighted transom. 1/1 windows on first and second floor. Gable ends have three-part 1/1 windows. Gabled wing on west side SIGNIFICANCE has horizontal bands of twelve light windows. 19. DATE OF INITIAL CONSTRUCTION: 1913

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A Craftsman style residence with Colonial Revival style influence applied to facade. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward the town."
