

Crescent Avenue the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from mboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 70's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had an modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were eded to the city by five different owners over a span of five years, ginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent enue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's le that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness ward the town."
