

House is located three blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and east of the Zoo.
18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two and a half story American Four Square. Hip roof with projecting eaves. Full-width hip roof porch has slender square supports and spindle balustrade. Glass and wood paneled door. Single and paired 6/1 first floor windows. Horizontal band course at second floor level. Second floor has a set of paired SIGNIFICANCE 19. DATE OF INITIAL CONSTRUCTION: 1904 has three rectangular
ARCHITECT: windows; 8 light center and 6 light sides.
BUILDER:
20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A standard vernacular form of the American Four Square. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward the town."
