I GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL STUDENTS

1. ALL VETERANS must clear with Dean Gittler, (Adm. 103) after filling in registration cards and before going through fee line, Adm. 114-5.
2. Class periods, Saturday, September 15, 1956 only:

1st period -- 11:00 - 11:40 A.M. 2nd period -- 11:45 A.M. - 12:30 P.M.

Please report to classes even if late. It is important to meet all SATURDAY classes, September 15, to order books and get assignments.

3. PARKING. STUDENT PARKING as follows:

South side of ROCKWELL ROAD west from drive in front of Industrial Arts Building.

In the TWO STUDENT PARKING LOTS --

1. To the rear of the College Gymnasium
2. Across (south) from the College Union

NO STUDENT PARKING AT ANY TIME IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

1. In front of Administration Building
2. On the Campus Drive north or to the rear of the Administration Building.
3. On the north side of Rockwell Road.
4. On the south side of Rockwell Road from Elmwood Ave. west to drive in front of Industrial Arts Bldg. (reserved for faculty.)

First offense, \$2.00 fine; second offense, \$4.00 fine and LOSS OF CAMPUS PARKING PRIVILEGES.

Those parking restrictions apply to afternoon and evening classes as well as to Saturday morning session.

4. Register with instructors in rooms indicated on next page. Please secure initialed approval, on the class admission card, from each instructor. Register with instructor by placing your name on his class roll sheets.
