
WILLIAM GLENN RANDLE SR. was born on July 21, 1946 in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was the son the late United States Army Master Sergeant William Randle and the late Willie Marie Randle. The Randle family later made their home in Buffalo, New York.

"Billy" as he was lovingly called by his family and close friends, accepted Christ and was baptized at an early age. He joined the United States Naval Reserves while a Junior at Buffalo's Burgard High School and, following his graduation in 1964, joined the United States Navy. While at sea, his tour of duty included service during the Vietnam War delivering supplies to ground troops. Billy was proud to have been part of such an important mission and he received the National Defense Service Medal and the Vietnam Service Medal. His military service included travel to many countries and he served his country proudly until his Honorable Discharge. Billy earned the nickname "Boyscout" from his family as his military career had taught him to "always be prepared."

After leaving the military, Billy met the love of his life, Miss Adelle Blackmon. The two were married on July 6, 1968 and together were blessed with five children. Billy was a very motivated individual who worked several jobs to support his family while simultaneously furthering his education. He expanded his vast education through attending classes at the State of New York Cooperative College and by taking a home study course through the Cleveland Institute of Electronics. He was employed with Buffalo Forge, Bethlehem Steel and Bell Aerospace and, in 1971, was hired by General Motors. Although Billy was fortunate to have obtained this job, General Motors later went through a massive layoff period. It was during that time that Billy went back to school to learn the Air Conditioning and Refrigeration trade. After completing the course, Billy formed a partnership with a fellow student, Vincent S. Together they established their own company, Salt and Pepper Refrigeration. When Billy was called back to General Motors, he and Vincent continued to operate the business until they later decided to dissolve the company. Billy went on to retire from General Motors in 2002 after over 30 years of service. He had become a "Jack of All Trades" - if it was broken. Billy could find a way to fix it.

Billy had many different interests and hobbies. He loved sports such as hunting and fishing and would go on fishing trips with his family whenever they could get away. He also loved to go camping with Adelle and their children. They would pile into the Winnebago and drive to the Thousand Islands on weekend trips. He was also a diehard

Buffalo Bills fan and would tailgate with his sons and friends to enjoy the game together. Billy was also a member of a gun club and kept his guns proudly displayed in his home. But above all these things, Billy was a family man. He loved spending time with his family. They would often get together at his home and have game night, playing Spoons, Pokeno, Win Lose or Draw, Taboo and cards. This always gave way to hours of laughter and story telling. The memories that were made will always be cherished by Adelle, their children, family and friends.

On March 24, 2018, Billy departed this life at 71 years old. His loving presence will be missed and his precious memory will live on in the hearts of, his dedicated wife of almost 50 years, Adelle Randle; his five children: Antoinette (Charles) Lyons, William Jr., Orlando, Romni (Latease) and Rashard (Latisha); 16 grandchildren and five great grandchildren; four sisters: June (Willie) Thompson, Barbara M. Randle, Cynthia R. (the late M.C.) Barber and Eleanor P. (Norm Young); goddaughter Lavelle Walton-Debose, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
