

Crescent Avenue is the longest rvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from mboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's rly 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for escent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. rtions of the street were deeded to the city by five different hers over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt dending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends thin the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a burban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward the town."
