Rachel A. Jackson, the daughter of the late Rev. Benjamin and Mrs. Jennie Nabors was born September 15, 1915 in Memphis, Tennessee.

At an early age she accepted Christ and worked faithful in her father's church. Her service to God and fellow man included singing in the choir, church secretarial and community service.

In August 1938, Rachel married William (Jack) Jackson. The couple moved to Buffalo, New York in 1939. She became a member of Michigan Avenue Baptist Church that later became Humboldt Baptist Church. Years later she became a member of Lincoln United Methodist Church, where her husband and sister-law were members. She was affiliated with the Sadie Johnson Circle and served as its secretary and she helped coordinate trips to Toronto, Canada and other yearly fundraisers.

Rachel was employed as a City worker collecting sales taxes and Nemmer Furniture Store. She retired from the City of Buffalo in the 1980s.
