

| Two and a half story Queen Anne style. Front facing gable roof. Two story round tower with conical roof. Single light windows on first and second floor with leaded transom. Diamond-shaped design on second floor of tower. Flat roof porch has paneled square doric supports. Rough cut, regular course stone base.  SIGNIFICANCE Dentils under cornice. Glass and wood paneled door.  Three-part first floor window, single light with ARCHITECT: leaded transom. Paired second floor windows, 1/1 lights. Gable has stick styling, bargeboard.  BUILDER: Pair of windows with prism-shaped tracery.   |  |  |  |  |
| Anne style. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward the town." |  |  |  |  |
