

This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of ne Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had en modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of e street were deeded to the city by five different owners er a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ding in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends thin the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness ward the town."
