OBITUARY

Arnold Delano Hinkle, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Hinkle Sr. was born in Birmingham, Alabama, February 17, 1933.

He attended school 47 and Hutchinson Central High School. He entered the Army in 1953, served 2 years and was discharged in January of 1955.

After his stay in the Army, he worked at Bethlehem Steel until he became disabled as a result of his injuries suffered while serving his country in the Korean War.

He departed from this life on October 21, 1974 at Deaconess Hospital. He is survived by his mother Harriet and his father Arnold; two sisters, Mrs. Harriet Robinson and Miss Julia Johnson; one brother Harold and a host of nieces, nephews and other relatives.
