I appreciate your comments and the concerns you expressed with respect to A.11447, the Nurse Practitioner Act.

As nurses, your concern regarding the quality of health and delivery of health care is to be commended. We disagreed on many issues raised in A.11447, but none of us lost sight of the importance of health care and its delivery to those less fortunate in terms of the availability of health care for all.

You should be aware that the action taken by the Senate, Assembly and Governor on A.11447 represents our need as public officials and legislators to ensure the health, safety and welfare of all citzens of this State. Recognizing your arguments and respecting your opinion, my colleagues and I, nevertheless, have determined that enactment of A.11447 will fill a gap in the current health delivery system of New York, and as such represents a fulfillment of our constitutional obligation to set public policy which benefits all of the citizens of this state.

In closing, I want to emphasize that, under no circumstances, should you feel your opinions are not valued or your presence in my office on other issues unwanted. Both are welcome.

Dear Ms. Orr:

I am a nursing student currently enrolled in a Licensed Practical Nursing Program. I wish to voice my concerns about the exemption of licensed pratical nurses from membership to the American Nurses Assiciation.

It is often stressed that the American Nursing Association considers itself the "offical voice" for professional nursing in the United States of America. To the best of my knowledge, membership to this association is granted only to the registered nurses with no consideration being given to licensed practical nurses.

Although there is a slight difference in educational background the license practical nurse is often designated to perform in the capacity of a registered nurse. This situation often presents itself because of the great demand for nurses. It is, however, observed that there is no differentiation between these two categories whenever duties are to be carried out, since they both work toward one common goal. However, when benefits are sought by the license practical nurse the distinction then resurfaces.

Medical benefits as well as professional growth are just a few of the benefits that the registered nurse obtains through the American Nursing Association, but is denied from the license practical nurse.
