REV. DR. G. GRANT CRUMPLEY

Funeral services and burial took place in New York City last Thursday for the Rev. Dr. G. Grant Crumpley, 66, pastor of the Bethel AME Church in Buffalo from 1965 to 1976.

The Rev. Dr. Crumpley, who would have been 67 on Saturday, died Jan. 4, 1981 in the New Rochelle Medical Center after a short illness.

A candidate for bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church on two occasions, the Rev. Dr Crumpley was ordained in the denomination's ministry in 1942. He was pastor of churches in McArden, Brewton and Birningham, Ala., and at Macedonia Church in Flushing, before coming to Bufalo in 1965.

While serving as pastor of 3ethel Church here, the 2ev. Dr. Crumpley established the church's five lead Start centers and uided the church's renovaion.

The Rev. Dr. Crumpley 7as a past president of the otermethodist Ministerial Iliance of Buffalo and had erved on the Buffalo City lanning Board. He former 7 was first vice president of the Buffalo Area Council of hurches and was active in vil rights organizations.

The Rev. Dr. Crumpley, a ative of Lakewood, Fla., is rivived by his wife, the forier Willie Lee Coleman; ght sons, Carl of Chicago, rady Jr., Ronald, Dallas ad Sidney, all of New York

City, Decatur and David, both of Buffalo; and Jeffery of Richmond, Va.; and three daughters, Faye Young of Richmond, and Miss Susan Crumpley and Jennifer Sumter, both of New York City.
