WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Within the first two days of classes a student may be withdrawn by the Director of Summer Sessions. After the first two days and before the fourth week a student may receive a "W" with the approval of the instructor. Forms are obtained in the Summer Sessions Office. The Summer Sessions Office will notify the Registrar's Office, the Division Office, and the Bursar's Office if there is a refund of tuition. A student who drops a course after the fourth week will receive a grade of "E". For exceptions consult the Office of Academic Affairs. If a student does not process an official drop through the Summer Sessions Office, and does not continue with the course, his grade will be "E".

GRADUATE STUDENTS

During the first two weeks of a six week course a graduate student may withdraw and receive a "W". Forms for withdrawing and refunds are processed by the Summer Sessions Office. After the first two weeks consult the Director of Graduate Studies.

PRE-REGISTRATION

Students planning to attend anyone of the summer sessions will have the opportunity to complete registration during April and May and are urged to take advantage of pre-registration. Those who complete registration will not need to be present on registration days.

After your courses have been approved go to the Summer Sessions Office, RH 309, for course registration. Payment of tuition and fees must be made in full in the Bursar's Office, RH 112 between **Monday, May 16 and Friday, May 20.** Students who fail to pay tuition and fees during this week will have their course reservations cancelled and will need to go through registration procedures on registration day.


