



	ructure with a minimum application of Craftsman style details.		
Similar to 465 and 469 Crescent in building plan. Crescent Avenue			
is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision,			
stretching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street			
	pears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the		
	80's plans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to		
	s current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city		
	by five different owners over a span of five years, beginning in		
	87 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent		
	enue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following		
Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with
