## PRE-REGISTRATION

Students planning to attend anyone of the summer sessions will have the opportunity to complete registration during May and are urged to take advantage of pre-registration. Those who complete registration will not need to be present on registration days.

## UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS ATTENDING STATE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE AT BUFFALO

Payment of tuition and fees must be paid in full at the time of pre-registration and all other registrations.

Pre-registration will be held Monday, May 22 through Friday, May 26 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Saturday, May 27 from 9:00 to 1:30. Begin pre-registration in your Division Director's office to obtain a registration packet and course approvals. In the basement of Rockwell Hall obtain your IBM master card; complete registration at Rockwell Hall auditorium. Obtain class cards and make payment in RH auditorium.

## UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS ATTENDING OTHER COLLEGES

Complete the application form below and return it to the Summer Session Office at 1300 Elmwood Avenue; then, register on anyone of the registration dates listed below.

## CONTINUING EDUCATION STUDENTS

Non-matriculated students who have been registered through the Continuing Education Office may pre-register by obtaining their registration packet and course approval from 8:30 to 11:45 a.m. the following days: Tuesday, May 16; Thursday, May 18; and Saturday, May 20th, RH 309.

## ADMITTED GRADUATE STUDENTS

Payment of tuition and fees must be made at the time of pre-registration and all other registrations.

Pre-registration will be held Monday, May 22 through Thursday, May 25 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.; and on Saturday, May 27 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Obtain registration packet from the Graduate Office and go to the basement of Rockwell Hall to secure your IBM master card. Obtain class cards and make payment in RH auditorium.

## NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS

In order to be eligible for pre-registration, new graduate students must file an application for admission to graduate study before May 19th. 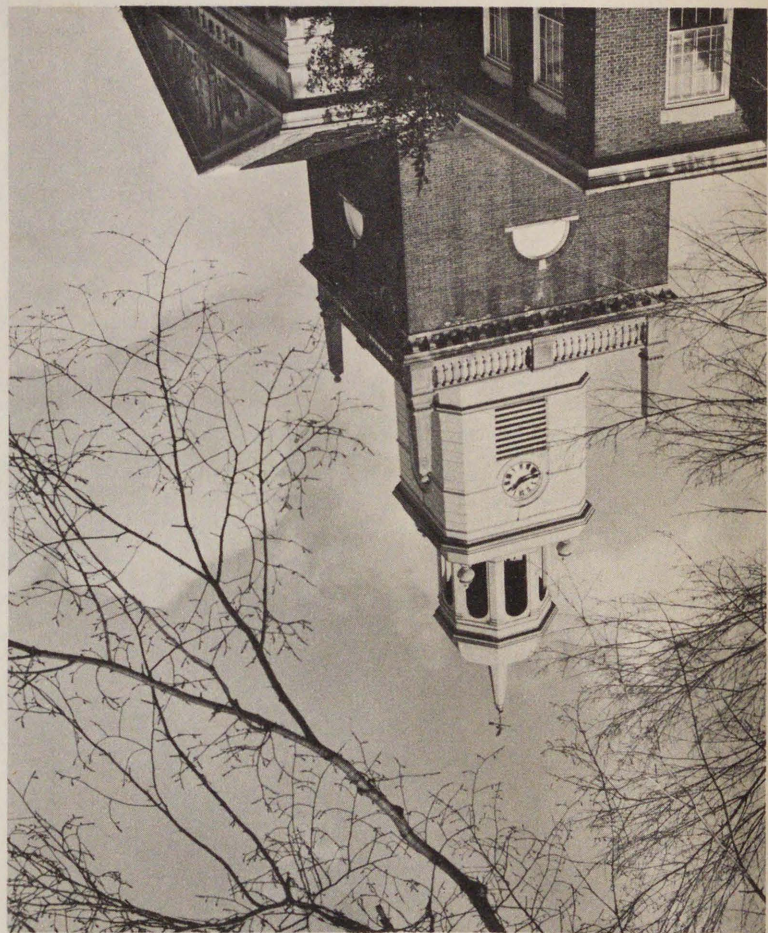

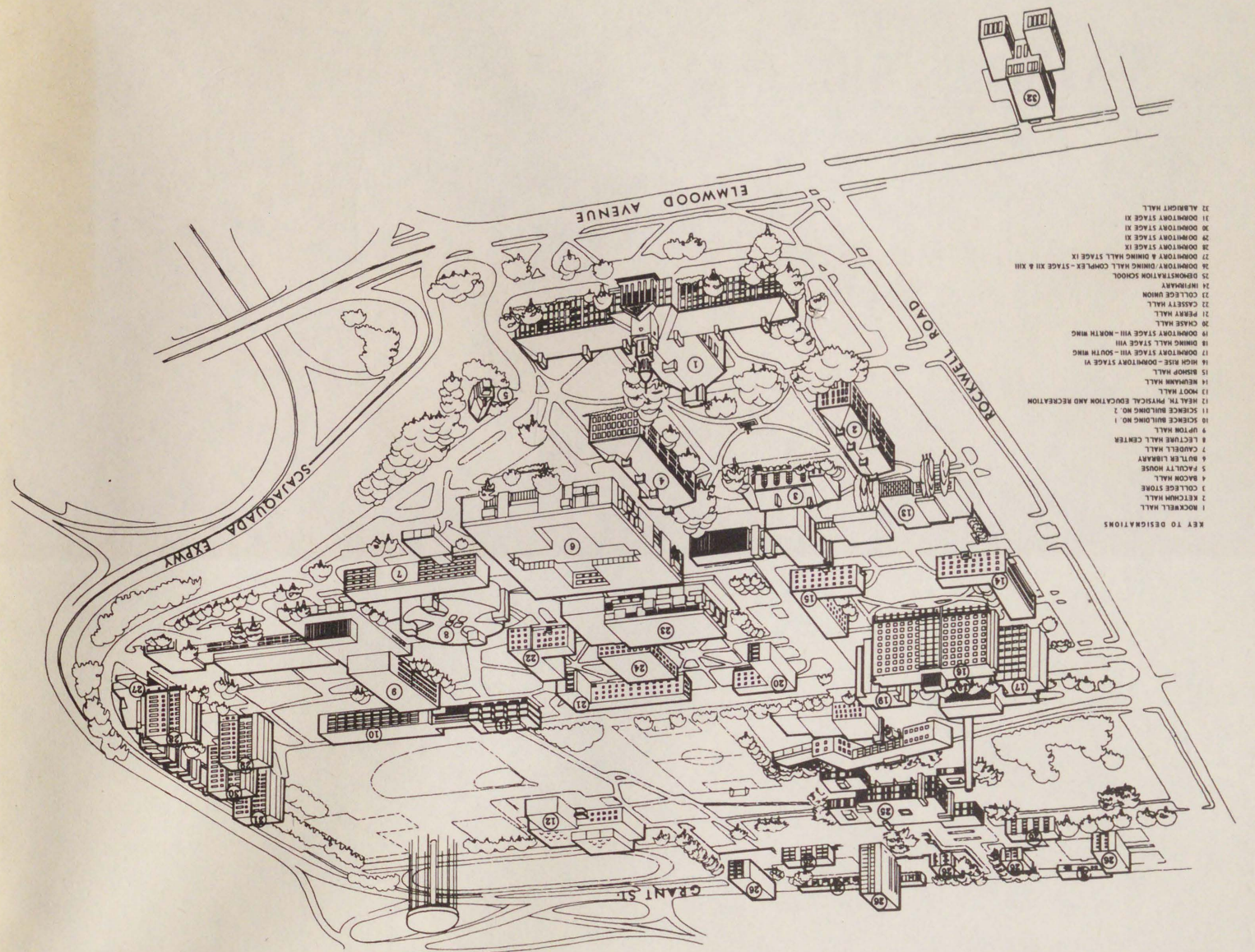
