Her Life



Elsie Mae Oliver was born on August 5, 1926 to Charles and Willie Mae Staten, Sr., in Buffalo, New York. She was educated in the Buffalo Public School System, and a graduate of Hutchison Central Technical High School.

She accepted Jesus Christ as her personal savior, and united with the Lincoln Memorial Methodist Church, under the pastorate of the late Rev. William A. Horner.

In March 1951, Elsie married Mr. John E. Oliver, III and to their union two children was born.

Elsie later enrolled in the Adult Practical Nursing Program, offered at Fosdick–Masten Vocational High School, and graduated on August 4, 1961 as a Licensed Practical Nurse. This accomplishment led to her employment at the Buffalo General Hospital, from which she retired after twenty–seven years of dedicated service. She continued to work until ill health prevented her at the Buffalo Urban League, as a school bus aide, and at the American Red Cross.

She was also a founding member of the *Gnivas Club* (savings club) which allowed her to join with friends in celebrating members' birthdays, and special occasions together.

Elsie was a life-long and active member of the Lincoln Memorial United Methodist Church, serving under all its pastoral leadership as the Head of the Communion Stewards, Altar Guild, Hospitality, and a proud member of Usher Board No. 2. Elsie loved the Lord, and she placed her confidence in God.

She was a loving mother, grandmother and aunt; a great friend, and source of encouragement. She loved to bake, and was famous for her German-Chocolate cake, banana and zucchini breads. She also crocheted, bowled, and traveled extensively cruising with friends to Jamaica, and visiting historic landmarks such as Mount Rushmore.

Elsie leaves to cherish her memory, her daughter: Rosalyn Elaine Oliver, her son: John E. Oliver, IV, her grand-daughter: Camille Oliver, her nephew: Homer (Edna) Smith, Jr., her niece: Nancy Eileen Smith, her nephews: Marvin, Marcus, Nijel and Jordan Smith, her dear friends: Ernestine Williams and Gwendolyn Brown, other family members and friends.
