## BIOGRAPHIC

Edward Hall, son of the late Edward P. and Annie Mae Hall; Born May 26, 1929 in Rose Hill North Carolina.

Departed this life January 7, 1982 at 12:30 p.m., in Deaconess Hospital.

He professed hope in Christ at an early age and joined Byrd Chapel Baptist Church, in Rose Hill, North Carolina.

He was united in Holy Matrimony to Alpha Lee Newkirk, on January 26, 1954

In October 1953, he migrated to Buffalo, New York, where he worked until December 1980, at the Cheverolet Plant.
