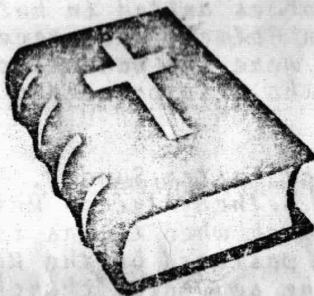

## OBITUARY

Ethel E. Holmes, the eldest member of Bethel A.M.E. Church, was born July 7, 1890. She was reared and brought up in a Christian environment thus becoming a member of the church at an early age. As a little girl she was carried by her grandmother to mission meetings when she was asked to serve as the secretary of the Missionary Society.

Ethel Holmes united in holy matrimony to Mr. Merton Holmes, who preceeded her in death. They were the parents of one son--Merton Jr., who also preceeded her in death.

It was on Easter Sunday, 1915 when Ethel joined Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church when it was located on Vine Street, pastored by the Reverend H.H. Williams. She served as church clerk for fifteen years. She was a charter member of the Sons & Daughters of Bethel Club. She served as a Steward, a Stewardess and a Trustee during her tenure of membership. She was also a member of the Missionary Society and the Floral Club. The honor title of "Mother" of the church was bestowed upon her by the Reverend Harry J. White. The late G.G. Crumpley honored her with the title of Steward Emeritus. Having served the Trustee Board until she became ill, she also was given the status of Trustee for life.

Beside being a devout church worker, Ethel Holmes took a great interest in community affairs. She was a fifty year member of the Y.W.C.A. She was a member of the Book Lovers' Club. June 6, 1956, she was crowned Queen of the Cornation Ball at
