

Square Co. man Ave Po: own and with a story	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: Typical American Four ware. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to livin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's pos of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent enue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. In the street were deeded to the city by five different mers over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humbold ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends thin the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness ward the town."
