

By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had been dified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street re deeded to the city by five different owners over a span of ve years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1897 ar Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside odivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood reet "not lead with special directness toward the town."
