OBITUARY



It was on Tuesday, July 11, 1916; the place was West Minister, South Carolina, Frank and Lelar Cobb became the parents of a baby son, whom they called "Amond". Amond was the fifth of fifteen children born in the Cobb family. He grew up in and around West Minister. He was called to serve in the Army for three years. During his tenure of service, he attended auto mechanic school in Ft. Eutis, Virginia.

While serving in the United States Army, Amond received several medals of honor—a good conduct medal, a victory medal, and a four Bronze Star American Service Medal.

In 1952 Amond Cobb migrated to Buffalo, New York. He had previously lived in Letchburg, Pennsylvania and Butler, Pennsylvania, where he once served as the Superintendent of the Sunday School in the A.M.E. Zion Church. On coming to Buffalo, he joined Bethel A.M.E. Church under the pastorate of the Reverend Harry J. White.

On June 15, 1956 he united in holy matrimony with a Bernice Elizabeth Hutchins. He was the father of one daughter.

Amond Cobb spent most of his life working as an automobile mechanic. He worked as a partner in the Penn Auto Service Garage for a number of years. He worked for Chevrolet at the Tonawanda Plant for twenty-seven years, retiring in 1980.

He was a member of the Royal Lowe American Legion Post. He resided at 154 Durham Avenue until his demise.
