DEAR PRESIDENT HUNTER!

In responding to your letter on page two (2) of the April issue of "REPORT", I must first of all thank you for providing the means through which feedback can be generated.

I believe that N.Y.S.N.A. would benefit greatly from an expansion & extension of relationships with such organizations as; A.A.C.N.; A.M.A. (despite some of its memberships support of the RCT proposal); NATIONAL Medical Association; NATIONAL Black Nurses Assoc., Society of Critical Care Medicine (who have engaged in very positive dialogue with A.A.C.N. president re: creative & collaborative solutions to the Nursing Shortage, refer to editorial in

recent issue of "Heart & Lung", A.A.C.N.'s official publication). We could also benefit by broadening our relationship with the unions representing ancillary personnel who provide support services for nurses. (eg. local 144 & 1199) Having an active voice in such organizations as American Hospital Association & League of Voluntary Hospitals could prove instrumental in garnering support for our association.

Society still perceives nursing and nurses as largely "blue collar". It would not be inappropriate to look into means through which we could communicate with & examine other "blue collar" organizations such as U.A.W.U.; AFL-CIO; garment workers unions, etc. I fully realize that we are a professional association. However, exploring some of their political strategies, observing how they organize & achieve their goals might teach us a few valuable lessons.

Special interest groups such as THE Gay Men's Health Crisis Center in New York City have been exemplary in their response to dealing with the whole issue of A.I.D.S. Might we not learn something from them as we battle this major

health care crisis of the century together?

Another avenue to expand & extend into groups that have media clout. With television programs such as "Nightingales" doing nothing to reinforce a positive image of Nursing, we may want to examine ways in which we can affect our public image through discussions with these agencies. Our nurses association encompasses, after all, New York, the city of Madison Avenue & advertising deals/campaigns. Why not pursue a course through which we can improve our image through positive advertising?

I cannot think of any groups or organizations to whom we should not extend or expand relationships because I feel that dialogue, even if it occurs between groups of extreme differences in opinion, is always useful.

I trust I have not rambled on for too long & that you will find some of my suggestions useful
