

Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to lvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's ps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue deen modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of estreet were deeded to the city by five different owners over span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the rkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban ighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward town."
