

resin Co. man had the a sin Part the 21.	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A plain gabled frame esidence. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to olvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's aps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue ad been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by five different owners over span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending a 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the arkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban eighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward town."
