

Crescent Avenue is e longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, retching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street bears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By e 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the try by five different owners over a span of five years, ginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. escent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, llowing Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street but lead with special directness toward the town."
