

Co to cu Hu ea Cr Po ow an wi a	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: A good example of Dutch lonial Revival style applied to a bungalow residence. Similar 679 Crescent in building plan. Crescent Avenue is the longest rvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from mboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's rly 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for escent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. rtions of the street were deeded to the city by five different ners over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt d ending in 1892 near Colvin.
