

Building is situated on a standard sized lot within Olmsted's Parkside subdivision. House is located two blocks from Delaware Park, which was designed by Olmsted and is listed on the National Register, and north of the Zoo.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known): Two and a half story American Four Square. Hip roof. Fullwidth porch, partially enclosed. Deck roof. Tri-part, singlelight, picture window. Recessed entrance has 3 vertical light door flanked by sidelights. Second floor boxed bay, three part window, 3 vertical lights over 1. 4 vertical light porch door. <u>SIGNIFICANCE</u> Hip roof dormer. Tri-part window, 3 vertical lights 19. DATE OF INITIAL CONSTRUCTION: <u>1922</u> each. Porte-cochere on

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: Typical American Four Square with the unique addition of a carriage porch. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear street in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue to Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's maps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue had been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the street were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span of five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 near Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside subdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood street "not lead with special directness toward 21.
