

off off st to ma ha st off ne su st	HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE: Typical vernacular adaptation Dutch Colonial Revival style. 752 Crescent is an exact copy this building. Crescent Avenue is the longest curvilinear reet in the Parkside subdivision, stretching from Humboldt Avenue Colvin Street. This street appears on Olmsted's early 1870's ps of "The Parkside." By the 1880's plans for Crescent Avenue d been modified by Olmsted to its current form. Portions of the reet were deeded to the city by five different owners over a span five years, beginning in 1887 near Humboldt and ending in 1892 ar Colvin. Crescent Avenue begins and ends within the Parkside bdivision, following Olmsted's rule that a suburban neighborhood reet "not lead with special directness toward the town."
