Accomplishments as Project Director of Nursing Center for the Homeless

- wrote initial grant which was funded in 1987 for the amount of \$79,318 in year 01. \$95,930 in year 02 and \$100,726 in year 03
- . successfully established nursing services for homeless residents at City Mission by January 6, 1988
- . has increased interest of professionals to work with the homeless population through lectures and presentations
- . has effectively utilized the media to publicize the issues related to homelessness
- , has met with the Schools of Management, Social Work, Pharmacy and Dentistry to foster collaboration and cooperative working relationships in this project
- . successfully completed progress reports submitted to Division for three years
- have garnered community support for this project and improved positive image of the university
